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1: Important Days



Global Family Day : 01 January :-

Every year on January 1st, Global Family Day is observed. The United Nations General Assembly established the International Decade for Peace and Nonviolence for the Children of the World in 1997. In 1999, the members of the United Nations were formally invited to devote the first day of the year to brainstorming methods to bring the global peace. Since then, Global Family Day has been observed on the same date each year. Global Family Day is also known as World Peace Day as it speaks of the importance of bringing harmony and unity in diversity.



World Braille Day : 04 January :-

Every year on January 4, World Braille Day is commemorated to raise awareness of the value of Braille as a communication medium for the blind and partially sighted. This day commemorates the birth anniversary of Louis Braille, the inventor of Braille, who was born on January 4, 1809, in France. The United Nations General Assembly established the day, which coincides with Braille Literacy Month in 2019. The event is celebrated throughout the month of January to bring up the importance of Braille and Braille Literacy.



World Day of War Orphans : 06 January :-

On January 6, World War Orphans Day is marked to raise awareness about the issue of war orphans and to address the traumatic conditions they face. The goal of the day is to raise global awareness about the importance of protecting the human rights of war-orphaned children and mobilizing efforts to ensure a better future for them. According to UNICEF estimates, there were around 140 million orphans worldwide in 2015, with Asia accounting for 61 million, Africa accounting for 52 million, Latin America and the Caribbean accounting for 10 million, and Eastern Europe and Central Asia accounting for 7.3 million. The theme for the 2024 World Day of War Orphans is "Orphan Lives Matter."



African National Congress Foundation Day : 08 January :-

Every year on January 8, African National Congress Foundation Day is honored. On this day, Africans battled for their rights against British and Boer colonizers with spears in their hands. The ANC sees this day as a day of fight for freedom and justice. Since the transition to democracy in April 1994, the African National Congress

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has been in power. The day was formed marking the beginning of the end of centuries of exploitation and humiliation faced by the African people. Initially, the organisation was formed as the South African Native National Congress in Bloemfontein.



Earth's Rotations Day : 08 January :-

Every year on January 8, Earth Rotation Day is observed. This day commemorates the 1851 confirmation by French physicist Leon Foucault that the Earth revolves on its axis. The rotation of the earth is a well-known phenomena. It happens as our planet rotates on a vertical axis around the sun. This occurs once a day. In 470 BC, the Greeks claimed that the world revolves on its own. Several experiments were also carried out to back up this allegation. The most notable one was carried out in 1851 by a French physicist by the name of Leon Foucault. He devised a pendulum to demonstrate the earth's rotation about a fixed axis. Because of its notoriety, the experiment was used to demonstrate the phenomenon.



Pravasi Bharatiya Divas : 09 January :-

Pravasi Bharatiya Divas (PBD), also known as NRI Day, is a day observed in India to recognize the contributions of the Indian diaspora to the country's growth. It is observed annually on January 9th, the same day Mahatma Gandhi returned to India from South Africa in 1915. The day is also intended to commemorate and respect the accomplishments and services of Indians living abroad, as well as to improve links between India and the Indian population worldwide. PBD was first celebrated in 2003, and it has since become an annual event.



World Hindi Day : 10 January :-

Hindi is one of the most widely spoken languages in northern India and around the world. After Mandarin and English, Hindi is the third most widely spoken language in the world. Every year, World Hindi Day is observed to recognize the contributions of Hindi speakers, the value of the language, and the need to make it more widely recognized around the world. In 1949, Hindi was spoken for the first time in the United Nations General Assembly. In 2006, the first Vishwa Hindi Diwas was observed by the then Prime Minister of the country – Dr. Manmohan Singh. In 2024, the theme of the World Hindi Day is "Hindi–Bridging Traditional Knowledge and Artificial Intelligence".



Death anniversary of Lal Bahadur Shastri : January 11 :-Lal Bahadur Shastri's death anniversary is observed every year on January 11, and he is regarded as a national hero in India. He died on January 11, 1966, in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, only a few days after guiding India to victory

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in the Indo-Pakistan War of 1965. Lal Bahadur Shastri was India's second Prime Minister, serving from 1964 to 1966. He was born on October 2, 1904, in Mughalsarai, United Provinces, British India (now Uttar Pradesh, India). Shastri's political career began in the 1920s, when he joined India's independence struggle. He was arrested several times for participating in protests and was eventually imprisoned for over two years for his role in the Salt Satyagraha of 1930.



National Road Safety Week : January 11 to 17 :-National Road Safety Week in India is observed from 11 to 17 January. The week is dedicated to promoting road safety measures that will help prevent accidents. According to studies, more than one lakh and fifty thousand individuals die each year in road accidents. Road accidents can be fully avoided if road safety practices are followed. National Road Safety Week is observed with different activities and campaigns aimed at educating people about the significance of following road safety practices like wearing seat belts, avoiding rage driving, wearing helmets, and abstaining from drunk driving.



National Youth Day : 12 January :-

Every year on January 12, India commemorates National Youth Day to commemorate Swami Vivekananda's birthday. The Indian government designated Swami Vivekananda's birthday, January 12, 1984, as National Youth Day for the first time. Since then, the day has been honored as National Youth Day throughout the country. The government's primary goal is to improve the country's future by pushing young people to live their lives in accordance with Swami Vivekananda's thoughts and principles. The National Youth Festival began in 1995 as a major activity under the Programme of National Integration Camp (NIC).



⊤Indian Army Day : 15 January :-

Every year on January 15, India commemorates Army Day to honour the achievements of the Indian Army's first Commander in Chief, General (later Field Marshal) K.M. Cariappa. On this day, Cariappa, who led Indian forces to victory in the 1947 war, gained command of the Indian Army from General Sir FRR Bucher, the final British Commander-in-Chief, in 1949, becoming the first Indian Commander-in-Chief of Independent India. The theme for Indian Army Day 2024 is "In Service of the Nation."



National Startup Day : 16 January :-

National Startup Day is observed on January 16. From January 10 to 16, the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, in collaboration with the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, observed National

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Startup Week. On January 15, 2022, Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced the establishment of National Startup Day on January 16. The first National Startup Day was held in India that year. The day is observed in order to give startup business owners a forum to talk about innovation for India's youth and their contribution to the economy.



KOKBOROK DAY

Tripura, Manipur and Meghalaya Foundation Day : 21 January :-

The North Eastern Region (Re-organisation) Act of 1971 established Tripura, Manipur, and Meghalaya as fullfledged states on January 21, 1972. In October 1949, the princely states of Tripura and Manipur united with India. At the time of independence, the North East was divided into three regions: the Assam plains of the former Assam Province, the hill districts, and the North East Frontier Tracts (NEFT) along the North-Eastern boundary. Nagaland was granted statehood on 1 December 1963.



Kokborok Day: 19 January:-

On January 19th, the Indian State of Tripura honors Kokborok Day, also known as Tripuri Language Day, with the objective of promoting the Kokborok language. This day commemorates the first official recognition of Kokborok, which occurred in 1979. Tiprakok/Tripurikok was Kokborok's prior name. Kokborok (Tripuri), a Tibeto-Burman language, is one of the most widely spoken languages in northeastern India, specifically in the state of Tripura and the surrounding CHT hill regions in Bangladesh. The Tripuri clans like Debbarma, Kalai, Reang, Jamatia, Tripura, Noatia, Rupini, Murasing, and Uchoi are the main speakers of the language.



Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti : 23 January :-

Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was an Indian nationalist whose enthusiasm for India has left an imprint on the hearts of countless Indians. He is most known as the originator of 'Azad Hind Fauj', with the iconic motto 'Tum Mujhe Khoon Do, Main Tumhe Aazadi Dunga'. Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was born on January 23, 1897, in Cuttack, Orissa, and died on August 18, 1945, in a hospital in Taiwan from burn injuries incurred in a plane crash. Subhas Chandra Bose is considered the most influential freedom fighter with extraordinary leadership skills and a charismatic orator.



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National Girl Child day (India) : 24 January :-

National Girl Child Day is celebrated on January 24 to raise awareness of the disparities that girls suffer in Indian society, as well as to increase knowledge about girls' rights and the importance of female education, health, and nutrition. The day coincides with the Indian government's several campaigns and programs, including Beti Bachao Beti Padhao and Save The Girl Child. The Ministry of Women and Child Development created National Girl Child Day in 2008. The objective behind celebrating National Girl Child Day is to provide support and opportunities to the girls of India.



International Day of Education : 24 January :-

The International Day of Education is observed every year on January 24th. In 2018, the United Nations General Assembly adopted a resolution designating January 24 as International Day of Education to raise awareness about the accessibility of education and why it is important for everyone. Following this, the first International Day of Education was held on January 24, 2019. This year marks the sixth year of the celebration, under the theme 'learning for lasting peace'. On January 24, UNESCO will organise a one-day online training for several thousand teachers from around the world on the deconstruction of hate speech.



National Voters Day: 25 January :-

National Voters' Day is observed on January 25 to commemorate the formation of the Election Commission of India. This day was established in 2011 to encourage young voters to participate in the electoral process. The Election Commission of India (ECI), which was established in 1950, celebrates its founding day on January 25. Earlier the eligibility age of the voter was 21 years but in 1988 it was lowered to 18 years. National Voters' Day 2024 theme - 'Nothing Like Voting, I Vote For ERSITSURE' is a continuation from last year's theme.



National Tourism Day : 25 January :-

Every year on January 25, National Tourism Day is observed to honor India's natural beauty and create awareness about the value of tourism to the Indian economy. In India, the Ministry of Tourism is in charge of establishing and promoting tourist policy at the national level. The day is commemorated to highlight the importance of tourism in the country's economy, since the sector accounts for 9.2% of total GDP and 8.1% of employment. The theme of National Tourism Day 2024 is "Sustainable Journeys, Timeless Memories".

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Republic Day : 26 January :-

On January 26, 2024, India will celebrate its 75th Republic Day, which commemorates the establishment of the Indian Constitution. While India obtained independence from the British Raj in 1947, the Constitution of India did not go into effect until January 26, 1950, when the country became a sovereign state and declared itself a republic. The Constituent Assembly held its first session on December 9, 1946, and the final on November 26, 1949, after which the Constitution was adopted a year later. Dr BR Ambedkar headed the Drafting Committee of the Constitution and on this day, R SI India also marks Constitution Day.



International Customs Day

26 January



International Customs Day : 26 January :-

On the anniversary of Indian Republic Day, another notable day is honored around the world, namely International Customs Day. Every year, the day falls on January 26. It is when the globe recognizes the importance and contributions of customs agencies. The day commemorates the contributions of the officials, as well as their difficult working conditions. The day was first initiated in the year 1953 and was first confirmed by the Customs Cooperation Council (CCC). This customs department is the agency that collects tariffs and manages the flow of goods across borders. The theme for International Customs Day in 2024 is "Customs Engaging Traditional and New Partners with Purpose".



International Holocaust Remembrance Day : 27 January :-

The United Nations General Assembly has declared January 27 as International Holocaust Remembrance Day, marking the anniversary of Auschwitz-Birkenau's liberation. From 1941 to 1945, Nazi Germany and its allies murdered more than six million Jews systematically. Nazi Germany regarded the Holocaust, or Shoah, to be the "Final Solution" in order to completely eliminate the Jewish community within the country. As per reports, by the end of the gruesome act, around two-thirds of Europe's Jewish population was killed.



Shaheed Diwas (Martyrs' Day) : 30 January:-

Mahatma Gandhi is known as the Father of the Nation. Gandhi, a famed peace activist, spearheaded India's freedom movement while advocating for nonviolent and peaceful resistance to British authority. The British ruled India for over 200 years – Mahatma Gandhi was the one who proposed that we can fight the British through nonviolent methods. However, Mahatma Gandhi was shot briefly after the country gained independence. On January 30, 1948, Mahatma Gandhi was assassinated.

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2: Agreements



France And Germany To Provide 100 Million Euros For AMRUT Mission Financing :-

According to people familiar with the situation, France's AFD and Germany's KfW Bank are in talks with India about providing a €100 million loan to fund the country's urban infrastructure plan, AMRUT project. The financing will be negotiated in early 2024, with the signing scheduled for February. This follows the countries' recent collaboration on the City Investments to Innovate, Integrate and Sustain or CITIIS 2.0 program, a four-year initiative focused on urban renewal and sustainable waste management, to which they contributed €100 million each.



Gujarat Government Inks Agreements Worth \$86 Billion Ahead Of Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit :-

The state government announced the signing of initial investment agreements totaling 7.17 trillion Indian rupees (\$86.07 billion) with 58 firms operating in industries such as energy, oil and gas, and chemicals ahead of the 10th edition of the Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit. NTPC Renewable Energy Limited, which proposed an investment of 900 billion Indian rupees (\$10.80 billion) to create 15 gigatonnes (GW) of renewable energy parks and projects to meet the

agricultural sector's power needs, was among the companies that signed the pacts, according to a senior Industries Department official.



Cabinet Approves India-USAID MoU For Railways' Net-Zero Emission Goal :-

The Union Cabinet, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has been informed of the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between India and the United States for International Development/India (USAID/India) on June 14, 2023, to support Indian Railways in achieving Mission Net Zero Carbon Emissions by 2030. The MoU facilitates utility modernization, advanced energy solutions and systems, regional energy and market integration and private sector participation and engagement, training and seminars/workshops focusing on specific technology areas like Renewable Energy, energy efficiency and other interactions for knowledge sharing.



Nepal To Export 10,000 MW Of Power To India In Next 10 Years :-

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Nepal and India have agreed to set a target of 10,000 megawatts of electricity export to India over the next decade. During a meeting with the two foreign ministers in Kathmandu, Secretary for the Nepalese Ministry of Energy, Water Resources and Irrigation Gopal Sigdel and Indian Energy Secretary Pankaj Agarwal signed a memorandum of agreement on the deal. On September 5 last year, India had announced that it would buy 10,000 megawatts of electricity from Nepal over 10 years with the endorsement of a long-term inter-government power trade agreement.



Indian Railways And CII Ink MoU For Green Initiatives :-The Indian Railways (IR) has signed an MoU with the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) to minimize energy and water use, hence cutting GHG emissions. The Memorandum of Understanding between IR and CII has been extended for the third time. Since July 2016, CII has been actively collaborating with IR to promote and enable green projects across Indian Railways. The first MoU was signed in 2016 for three years, and after it expired, another one was signed in 2019 for another three years. Over 40 building facilities, including administrative buildings, hospitals, schools, and colonies have been facilitated to achieve green certification.



FIH And Viacom18 Ink Four-Year Media Rights Deal :-The International Hockey Federation (FIH) has reached a big television rights agreement with Viacom18. This agreement is for a four-year period (2023-2027) and covers all FIH tournaments except the FIH Nations Cup. Viacom18 channels will broadcast the upcoming FIH Hockey Olympic Qualifiers, the first FIH Hockey5s World Cup, the FIH Hockey Pro League, the 2026 FIH Hockey World Cup, and many other events to Indian hockey enthusiasts. Matches will be available on OTT platform JioCinema and Viacom18's linear channels Network Sports18.



Rural Ministry Partners With SBI For SHG Loans :-

The Rural Development Ministry and the State Bank of India have signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to simplify enterprise financing for rural self-help groups (SHG), according to an official release. State Bank of India presented Svyam Siddha, a specialised financial instrument designed specifically for SHG women entrepreneurs seeking loans of up to Rs 5 lakhs. This initiative is designed to alleviate the challenges associated with extensive documentation requirements for bank loan applications and reduce the turnaround time (TAT).



Security Agreement Signed Between Ukraine And Britain In Kyiv :-

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak declared 2.5 billion British pounds in military aid to Ukraine during a surprise visit to Kyiv. Sunak met with Ukrainian President

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Volodymyr Zelenskyy to sign the historic UK-Ukraine Security Cooperation Agreement. The UK-Ukraine Agreement on Security Cooperation follows the Group of Seven's prior commitment to provide Ukraine with bilateral security guarantees. Britain said it would provide the largest delivery of drones to Ukraine from any nation, with most of them expected to be manufactured in Britain.



IndoSpace Signs Rs 2000 Cr Deal With Tamil Nadu Govt

IndoSpace, India's biggest developer and owner of Grade A industrial real estate, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Tamil Nadu government to spend over Rs 2,000 crore in the state. IndoSpace has an existing land bank of around 600 acres in the region. With an expansive presence of 14 Grade A industrial and logistics parks strategically located around the main industrial hubs, IndoSpace has developed and leased around 13 million sq ft with a total investment of Rs 4,000 crore in the state.



World Economic Forum And Telangana Government Collaborate To Establish C4IR In Hyderabad :-

The World Economic Forum's (WEF) Centre for the Fourth Industrial Revolution (C4IR) will be inaugurated in

Hyderabad on February 28 during BioAsia 2024 with the subject 'State Health Tech Landscape'. An agreement to this effect was reached during Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy and his team's visit to the WEF in Davos, Switzerland. Revanth met with WEF President Borge Brende to advance the project. Notably, this will be the first C4IR centre — an autonomous and non-profit organisation — that will focus on healthcare and life sciences and the 19th C4IR centre overall.



Foxconn And HCL Group Forge Partnership For Chip Packaging Unit In India :-

Foxconn has struck a collaboration with HCL Group for semiconductor assembly and testing, marking the Taiwanese company's second attempt to enter the chipmaking market in India. They will establish an outsourced assembly and testing (OSAT) operation, the two announced in separate statements. The entire investment is projected to be between \$100 and \$150 million. Foxconn's share in the joint venture will be \$37.2 million for 40% stake through Foxconn Hon Hai Technology India Mega Development, a subsidiary of Hon Hai Technologies (Foxconn), it said in a filing.



Google Pay Partners With NPCI To Extend UPI Payments Globally :-

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Google Pay, a digital payment application, plans to expand its UPI services abroad by partnering with NPCI Payments International Limited (NPIL), a subsidiary of the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). According to a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) inked by Google India Digital Services and NPCI International Payments Ltd (NIPL), Google Pay users will be able to make UPI transactions and pay foreign merchants with G-pay when abroad. This feature eliminates the need for international cards, as users are paying foreign merchants directly in the local currency.



National Farmers Society, IndiaAI, Wadhwani Foundation Signs MoU For Al-Driven Agriculture :-

The agriculture ministry announced the signing of a tripartite agreement to harness artificial intelligence (AI) in the agricultural industry. The agreement was signed between the National Farmers' Welfare Programme Implementation Society (NFWPIS), IndiaAI under Digital India Corporation, and the Wadhwani Foundation, according to the agriculture ministry. As per the MoU, the Wadhwani Foundation will provide critical support in formulating and executing an AI strategy. It will assist the ministry in establishing India as a global leader in AI-driven digital agriculture transformation, aligning with MeitY's National Plan for AI.



Sony Terminates \$10 Billion Merger Deal With Zee Entertainment :- Sony Group has delivered a termination letter to Zee Entertainment Enterprises (Zee), advising the business of its intention to cancel the proposed \$10 billion media merger transaction, effectively ending a two-year acquisition process, according to Bloomberg News. According to the termination letter reviewed by Bloomberg, Sony cited unmet merger agreement requirements as the reason for the termination. Sony's decision comes after an extended impasse between the two companies, primarily revolving around the leadership question for the merged entity.



Switzerland-India Free Trade Agreement Concluded After 16-Year Negotiation :-

Swiss Economy Minister Guy Parmelin said that Switzerland and India have secured an agreement on a free-trade agreement after 16 years of discussions. Parmelin traveled to India immediately following the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland, to meet with counterpart Piyush Goyal, according to a post by the Swiss minister on the platform X. The agreement "will create jobs for the young population of India, and secure employment in Switzerland," Parmelin said in an interview with the Swiss newspaper Sonntagszeitung.



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Serum Institute Partners With CEPI For Affordable Outbreak Vaccines :-

The Serum Institute of India (SII) will join an expanding CEPI network of vaccine makers in the Global South to facilitate faster, more agile, and fair responses to future disease outbreaks. The Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI) is a novel global collaboration working to speed the development of vaccines and other biologic countermeasures to epidemic and pandemic threats. CEPI has articulated an aspirational goal: vaccines should be ready for initial authorisation and manufacturing at scale within 100 days of recognition of a pandemic pathogen, when appropriate.



Cabinet Approval For India-Oman IT Cooperation MoU

The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved a memorandum of understanding (MoU) between the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and the Sultanate of Oman's Ministry of Transport, Communications, and Information Technology to collaborate in the field of information technology. According to officials, the MoU, which was signed on December 15, 2023, aims to foster complete cooperation between the two countries through mutual assistance, the sharing of technology, information, and IT investments.



MoD inks contract, worth over Rs 1070 cr, with Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd :-

The Ministry of Defence has signed Contract with Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd (MDL), Mumbai on 24 January, 2024, for acquisition of 14 Fast Patrol Vessels (FPVs) for the Indian Coast Guard (ICG). The value of the contract is Rs 1070.47 cr. These multi role FPVs will be indigenously designed, developed and manufactured by MDL under Buy (Indian-IDDM) Category and will be delivered in total 63 months. Along with several high be equipped with multipurpose drones and AI capability etc



Rajasthan-Madhya Pradesh ink MoU for Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project :-

The Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh governments have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for the Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project (ERCP). The MoU was inked in front of Union Jal Shakti Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat. The Eastern Rajasthan Canal Project (ERCP), an ambitious drinking and agricultural water project, was announced by the BJP administration in the 2017-18 state budget as a permanent solution to the drinking and irrigation water shortage in 13 districts of eastern Rajasthan.

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3: Appointments



The Union finance ministry appointed economist Arvind Panagariya as the chairman of the new Finance Commission :-

Arvind Panagariya, former Vice Chairman of NITI Aayog and Professor at Columbia University, has been appointed as Chairman of the 16th Finance Commission by President Droupadi Murmu. The 16th Finance Commission would be required to release its Report by October 31, 2025, covering a five-year period beginning April 1, 2026. Between January 2015 to August 2017, Panagariya, an Indian-American economist, served as the first Vice Chairman of the Government of India's think tank NITI Aayog. An authority on free trade, Panagariya is widely regarded as the foremost expert in the world on Indian economy.



Rashmi Govil To Be Next Director (HR) Of IOC :-

Rashmi Govil, a senior HR professional at Indian Oil Corporation (IOC), is scheduled to become the stateowned company's next Director (Human Resources). According to a notification from the government headhunter, her name was recommended for the job by the Public Enterprises Selection Board (PESB). According to the announcement, PESB evaluated 11 individuals, including five from IOC, before suggesting Govil for the position. She is presently Executive Director (HRD & ER) in IOC. Govil will replace Ranjan Kumar Mohapatra, who was in May denied an 8-month extension of service till his superannuation age.



Ravindra Kumar Tyagi Appointed As CMD Of Power Grid Corporation :-

RBI cancels licence of 2 co-operative banks :-The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has canceled The Botad RSIT Peoples Co-operative Bank's banking license with immediate effect and designated it as a non-banking institution. Separately, the RBI has cancelled the license of Adarsh Mahila Nagari Sahakari Bank Maryadit, and the bank will cease operations on December 29. The RBI has requested that the Maharashtra Commissioner and Registrar of Cooperative Societies issue an order winding up the bank and appointing a liquidator.



Mudra Loans Show Record Growth To Rs 3-Lakh Crore In Q3 FY24 :-

In what could be interpreted as a New Year's greeting for small enterprises, Loans under the Pradhan Mantri

Mudra Yojana (PMMY) have hit an all-time high of Rs 3lakh crore in December 2023, representing a 16 percent year-on-year rise. "The loans sanctioned now stand at Rs 2,99,457 crore a week before the end of the third quarter of the current financial year on December 22, 2023 against Rs 2.58-lakh crore in the same period in previous fiscal. As per the provisional figures, this has already crossed Rs 3-lakh crore by December 29," a senior official of Mudra said.



Tata Pay Secures RBI Payment Aggregator License For E-Commerce Transactions :-

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has awarded Tata Payments, the Tata group's digital payments app, a payment aggregator (PA) license. This will assist the company in facilitating ecommerce transactions via its platform. Tata Payments is owned by Tata Digital, the group's subsidiary that houses the group's digital operations. Tata Pay joins Razorpay, Cashfree, and Google Pay in obtaining the long-awaited payments license. Along with Tata Pay, Bengaluru-based identity verification startup DigiO, backed by investment platform Groww, has also secured the PA licence as of January 1.

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SBI Raises \$1 Billion From Overseas For ESG Financing Market :-

State Bank of India (SBI) said that it has raised USD 1 billion (about Rs 8,300 crore) to serve the domestic ESG financing sector. SBI said in a regulatory statement that the bank had completed the issuance of USD 1 billion (USD 750 million and a green shoe of USD 250 million) via Syndicated Social Loan. It stated that the loan book was closed on January 2, 2024. Last year, the country's largest lender raised a syndicated social loan of USD 1 billion. The fund raised would would cater to domestic ESG (Environmental, Social and Governance) financing market.



IndusInd Bank Introduces 'Samman RuPay Credit Card' For Government Employees :-

IndusInd Bank has launched the UPI-enabled IndusInd Bank Samman RuPay Credit Card in collaboration with the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), specifically for government employees. The cards were developed for government personnel to give them with a variety of exclusive incentives and improve their overall banking experience. The Samman RuPay Credit Card will offer the benefits of a traditional credit card with the advanced features of UPI, creating a seamless financial tool.



NPCI Launches UPI-PayNow Linkage For Cross-Border Remittances Between India And Singapore :-

India and Singapore have linked their digital payment systems, UPI and PayNow, enabling quick, safe, and costeffective cross-border remittances. The service is currently available on BHIM, PhonePe, and Paytm, with additional banks and third-party application providers likely to be added soon. The funds are transmitted in real time and arrive at the recipient's bank account within seconds. The collaboration between RBI and MAS has played a pivotal role in fostering the growth of India's digital payment ecosystem.



RBI Penalizes Three Banks For Violations: Dhanlaxmi, Punjab And Sind, ESAF :-

The Reserve Bank issued a Rs 2.49 crore penalty on three banks: Dhanlaxmi Bank, Punjab and Sind Bank, and ESAF Small Finance Bank, claiming regulatory noncompliance. This step demonstrates the central bank's commitment to enforcing financial regulations and ensuring compliance in the banking sector. The sanctions are intended to prevent financial firms from violating regulatory norms. Moreover, these penalties encourage a culture of continual improvement, urging banks to enhance their internal controls.

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HDFC Bank Aims For Singapore Expansion With Banking License Application :-

HDFC Bank Ltd, India's biggest private sector lender, is planning to create its first branch in Singapore, underscoring its foreign ambitions after sewing up a blockbuster merger with mortgage financier Housing Development Finance Corp. According to sources acquainted with the subject, the bank has applied for a banking license from Singapore's Monetary Authority and is awaiting clearance. The banking giant is seeking a bigger presence abroad to tap the Indian diaspora for savings and term deposits, as well as to cross-sell more products, including mortgages, the people said.



LIC Introduces Jeevan Dhara II Deferred Annuity Plan :-According to a press release, the Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) has launched a new insurance plan called Jeevan Dhara II, which is an individual savings and deferred annuity plan. It is neither a linked or participating annuity plan. LIC Jeevan Dhara II will be available for purchase through both online and offline channels beginning January 22, 2024, it added. The minimum age of entry into the Jeevan Dhara II policy is 20 years and the maximum age of entry into the policy can be 80/70/65 years minus the deferment period, depending upon the annuity option chosen.



SEBI Chairperson Launches CDSL's Multi-Lingual Initiatives For Investor Ease :-

SEBI Chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch inaugurated two multilingual CDSL projects targeted at boosting capital market inclusivity and accessibility. CDSL has introduced an upgrade in investor CAS through the 'Apka CAS – Apki Zubaani' initiative, enabling investors to receive their statements in their preferred language amongst 23 diverse Indian languages. Moreover, the unique multilingual chatbot on the CDSL website, 'CDSL Buddy Sahayta 24*7,' will simplify investors' processes.



HDFC Bank Surpasses 20 Million Credit Card Milestone, Leading Indian Market :-

HDFC Bank, India's largest private sector bank, said that it has become the country's first lender to reach the 20 million credit card milestone. The lender entered the credit card business in 2001 and reached the ten-million mark in 2017. The following 10 million issuances occurred in just over six years. According to Reserve Bank of India figures for November 2023, HDFC Bank's cards in circulation were almost 19.51 million, compared to 19.18 million in October 2023. HDFC Bank is followed by SBI Card, ICICI Bank, and Axis Bank, in terms of the number of credit cards issued.

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RBI allows LIC to acquire up to 9.99% holding in HDFC Bank :-

Reserve Bank of India has approved Life Insurance Corporation of India to acquire up to 9.99% stake in HDFC Bank Ltd. LIC has been advised by RBI to acquire the aforesaid major shareholding in the Bank within a period of one year i.e. by January 24, 2025. Further, LIC must ensure that the aggregate holding in the Bank does not exceed 9.99% of the paid-up share capital or voting rights of the Bank at all times. The approval has been granted concerning the application made by LIC to RBI and is subject to the conditions mentioned.



Zomato Payments gets RBI's nod to operate as an online payment aggregator:-

Zomato Payments, a wholly owned subsidiary of Zomato Limited, has received the certificate of authorisation from the Reserve Bank of India to operate as an online payment aggregator. The central bank has allowed it to carry out the business as a payment aggregator and issuer of pre-paid payment instruments with effect from January 24, 2024. Last year, Zomato joined hands with TICICI Bank to launch its own unified payments interface (UPI) offering -- Zomato UPI. The feature was offered to select users and did not involve a KYC process.

Amit Shah releases reference books on newly passed criminal justice laws :-

Four senior officers assume new roles in Army and Navy

Lieutenant General RC Tiwari assumed command of the vital Rising Sun Eastern Command, which is situated in Kolkata. Tiwari, a National Defence Academy graduate and Kumaon regiment veteran since 1987, took over for Lieutenant General RP Kalita, who retired on December 31. Lieutenant General Prit Pal Singh, who was commissioned into the 62 Armoured Regiment in December 1989, acquired command of the Sudarshan Chakra Corps (19 Corps), which is located in Mathura. In the Indian Navy, Vice-Admiral B Sivakumar assumed the role of Controller Warship Production and Acquisition,

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with a notable background in indigenous warship production. Vice-Admiral Kiran Deshmukh took charge as the Chief of Material of the Navy. He was commissioned as an engineer officer in March 1986.



Indian Army to deploy Apache attack helicopters in Jodhpur near Pakistan border :-

The Indian Army will enhance its combat capabilities in the western desert near the Pakistani border by deploying six Apache attack helicopters at a military installation in Jodhpur. "The first of the choppers is RSITBoosting Indigenous Defence Production: Centre Inks expected to start arriving from the US in February-March timeframe at the Hindan air base as scheduled in the contract. The choppers would then be deployed at a military station in Jodhpur for operations," military officials added. The Indian Air Force already has 22 Apache helicopters posted around its western and northern borders, and the Army inductions would bring the total combined inventory to 28.



Vice Admiral Sanjay Jasjit Singh Assumes Command of Western Naval Command :-

Vice Admiral Sanjay J Singh, AVSM, NM, formally succeeded Vice Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi, AVSM, NM, as Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief (FOC-in-C) of the Western Naval Command (WNC). The changeover was marked with an outstanding Ceremonial Parade at INS Shikra, where Vice Admiral Singh paid tribute to fallen warriors at the Gaurav Stambh - Victory at Sea Memorial, Naval Dockyard, Mumbai. Vice Admiral Sanjay J Singh is a distinguished graduate of the National Defence Academy, Pune. Commissioned into the Executive Branch of the Indian Navy in 1986, he embarked on a career that spans 37 years of dedicated service.



Two Crucial Deals Worth Rs 802 Crore :-

The Ministry of Defence has inked two contracts for Rs 802 crore with Jupiter Wagons and BEML (Bharat Earth Movers Limited) for the procurement of military equipment. The defense ministry inked a contract with Jupiter Wagons for the acquisition of Qty-697 Bogie Open Military (BOM) Wagons for Rs 473 crore and BEML Ltd for the procurement of Qty-56 Mechanical Minefield Marking Equipment (MMME) Mark II for Rs 329 crore under the Buy (Indian-IDDM) category. BOM wagons are used to transport light vehicles, Artillery Guns, BMPs, Engineering Equipment etc. from their peacetime locations to operational areas.



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DRDO Launches Assault Rifle 'Ugram' For Indian Army :-The Defence Research and Development Organisation

(DRDO) has launched the 'Ugram' indigenous assault rifle, which is designed to satisfy the operational needs of armed forces, paramilitaries, and state police. The rifle, calibre 7.62 x 51 mm, was conceived, developed, and manufactured in partnership with a private industrial partner. The first operational prototype of the rifle was unveiled at the DRDO's Armament and Combat Engineering Systems in Pune. It has an effective range of 500 metres and weighs less than four kilograms.





The Indian Navy has received its first domestic mediumaltitude long-endurance (MALE) drone, the Drishti 10 Starliner unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV), which will improve its intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance capability. Navy Chief Admiral R Hari Kumar stated that the drone will be a powerful force multiplier in the Indian Ocean region, which faces a variety of security problems. The Drishti 10 Starliner drone has been built by Adani Defence and Aerospace at its Hyderabad facility with technology transfer from Israeli defence firm Elbit Systems.



US And UK Launch Airstrikes On Yemen's Huthi Rebels Over Red Sea Attacks :-

The United States and the United Kingdom joined forces to conduct a retaliatory operation against the Iran-based rebel organization Houthis in Yemen, shortly after the group claimed responsibility for a series of attacks on cargo ships and vessels passing through the Red Sea. The US and UK airstrikes targeted at targeting Houthi sites in Yemen have exacerbated the crisis in the region, which is already rife with Israel-Hamas hostility. Heavy explosions were reported in the Yemeni capital of Sana'a and the port city of Al Hudaydah.



R SITDRDO conducts successful flight-test of New Generation AKASH missile off Odisha coast :-

India's Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully tested the New Generation AKASH (AKASH-NG) missile. The test was carried out from the Integrated Test Range in Chandipur, off the coast of Odisha, against a high-speed unmanned aerial target at extremely low altitude. The AKASH-NG missile system is cutting-edge and capable of stopping fast, agile aircraft threats. It has a range of around 80 km. During the flight test, senior officers from DRDO, the Indian Air Force (IAF), Bharat Dynamics Limited (BDL) and Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) were present.



Joint Exercise 'Sahyog Kaijin' Between Indian And Japanese Coast Guards :-

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The Indian and Japanese Coast Guards recently completed a successful cooperative exercise called 'Sahyog Kaijin' off the coast of Chennai. This exercise is part of the two countries' continuous partnership under the Memorandum of Cooperation (MoC), signed in 2006. The test involved a simulated collision between two vessels, MT Matsyadristi and MV Anveshika, which resulted in a fire on the MT Matsyadristi and a crude oil spill. The exercise focused on swift reaction and rescue activities.



Union Minister Ajay Bhatt Flags Off Astra Missile For IAF Delivery :-

Minister of State for Defence Ajay Bhatt has launched the indigenously developed and manufactured Astra Missiles for delivery to the Indian Air Force. The event was place at Bharat Dynamics Limited's Kanchanbagh Unit, where BDL CMD Commodore A Madhavarao (Retd) and other top officials from DRDO, IAF, and BDL were present, according to a BDL announcement. "Astra Weapon System is best in its class of weapon systems in the world in the category of air-to-air missiles. The missile has a range of 100 plus km," the release said.



Senior IPS Officer Daljit Singh Chaudhary Appointed Director General Of Sashastra Seema Bal :-

According to an official order, the Centre has named Daljit Singh Chaudhary, a senior Indian Police Service (IPS) officer, as the director-general of the Sashastra Seema Bal. The appointment of Chaudhary, a 1990 batch IPS officer from the Uttar Pradesh cadre, is notable given the SSB's important role in border security ahead of the Ram temple consecration ceremony in Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh. The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has approved his appointment for a period up to November 30, 2025 i.e. the date of his superannuation, the order said.



Defence Minister Unveils 35 BRO Projects In Border Regions :-

During an event on the Joshimath-Malari Road in Uttarakhand, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated 35 infrastructure projects developed by the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) worth Rs 670 crore. In his speech, the defence minister stressed the significance of connecting rural areas to the rest of the country. 29 of the 35 projects inaugurated are bridges, with the remaining six being roads. 11 of these projects are being constructed in Jammu & Kashmir, nine in Ladakh, eight in Arunachal Pradesh, three in Uttarakhand, two in Sikkim, one in Mizoram, and one in Himachal Pradesh.



India-Kyrgyzstan Joint Special Forces Exercise KHANJAR Being Held In Himachal Pradesh:-

The 11th edition of the India-Kyrgyzstan Joint Special Forces Exercise Khanjar began at the Special Forces Training School in Bakloh, Himachal Pradesh. The drill is taking place from January 22 to February 3. The exercise would allow both parties to strengthen defense ties while addressing shared concerns about international terrorism and extremism. It will also provide an opportunity to showcase the capabilities of cutting-edge indigenous defence equipment. The exercise is an annual event conducted alternately in the two nations.



Defence Ministry signsed ₹1,070 crore contract with Mazagon Dock for 14 advanced fast patrol vessels :-

The Defense Ministry has inked a contract worth over ₹1,070 Crore with Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Limited (MDL), Mumbai for 14 Fast Patrol Vessels (FPV) for the Indian Coast Guard. Along with many high-tech advanced features and equipment, these FPVs will include multipurpose drones, a wirelessly controlled remote water rescue boat lifebuoy, and Artificial Intelligence (AI) capabilities, among other things enabling greater flexibility and operational edge to the ICG to face new age multidimensional challenges, the Ministry said in a statement.



India, France, UAE Conduct Joint Air Exercise Over Arabian Sea :-

India, France, and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) conducted a massive aviation drill over the Arabian Sea amid growing global worries about Houthi terrorists targeting several commercial vessels in the region's critical waterways. The drill 'Desert Knight' involved multiple frontline aerial assets and combat jets from the three countries' air forces, according to officials. The Indian Air Force (IAF) component at the drills consisted of Su-30 MKI, MiG-29 and Jaguar fighter jets besides AWACS (airborne early warning and control aircraft), C-130-J transport plane and air-to-air refuelling aircraft.



JSW Group enters defence manufacturing :-

Sajjan Jindal-owned JSW Group became the latest conglomerate to enter the defence manufacturing sector space by acquiring a majority stake in Gecko Motors Private Ltd, an off-road vehicle company. The company has secured an order of Rs 250 crore from the Ministry of Defence to manufacture and supply 96 Specialist Mobility Vehicles (SMVs), branded as ATOR N1200. The vehicles are currently manufactured at JSW Gecko's newly set-up manufacturing unit in Chandigarh and will be supplied to the armed forces by June this year.


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Indian Army Introduces New Fitness Policy to Fight 'Declining Physical Standards' :-

The Indian army has implemented a new fitness guideline in response to "declining physical standards among officers". The policy adds new tests to the existing ones while also requiring each person to get an Army Physical Fitness Assessment Card (APAC). According to the new regulations, a Brigadier rank officer, rather than a Commanding officer, will preside over quarterly tests. The new policy is aimed at bringing consistency in the testing procedure and addressing issues of officers being physically unfit or obese amid the rising threat of lifestyle diseases.



Indian Navy to showcase twin carrier operations with Rajnath Singh on board :-

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will see the Indian Navy's twin carrier operations on board INS Vikrant between Kochi and Goa at the top Naval Commanders Conference in March. INS Vikrant, India's second aircraft carrier, completed a maintenance repair at Cochin Shipyard on January 26 and is scheduled to participate in the 50nation Milan exercise off the coast of Visakhapatnam in February. It is during his sea trip from Kochi to Goa, Singh will witness the full power of the Indian Navy with aircraft carriers INS Vikramaditya and INS Vikrant showcasing their prowess at sea with fighter operations using MiG-29 K aircraft.



India-Saudi Arabia Joint Military Exercise 'SADA TANSEEQ' Commences in Rajasthan :-

Market cap of NSE Listed Companies' Surpass USD 4 Trillion Mark :- Despite geopolitical disruptions and the impact of the Covid epidemic in recent years, the Indian stock market just crossed the \$4 trillion valuation threshold, closing in on the value of the Hong Kong stock exchange. India has now joined the ranks of the world's stock market superpowers, a position previously held by the United States, China, and Japan. Being the fifth highest stock market in the world, India now only ranks behind these

through countries. India's market growth in 2023 is the sharpest it has ever seen in the last three years.



RBI names SBI, HDFC Bank, ICICI Bank as systemically important banks :-

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has classified State Bank of India (SBI), HDFC Bank, and ICICI Bank as domestic systemically important banks (D-SIBs). While ICICI Bank remained in the same bucketing system as last year, SBI and HDFC Bank were to higher buckets. The increased D-SIB buffer requirements resulting from the bucket increase will be applicable for SBI and HDFC Bank on April 1, 2025, with the additional Common Equity Tier 1 (CET1) requirement being in addition to the capital conservation buffer, according to the banking regulator.



Hyundai hits record 6 lakh domestic sales mark in India:-Hyundai Motor India has declared that it has surpass the six lakh sales barrier in the domestic market in the calendar year 2023, marking the company's highest performance since its arrival in India in 1996. Between January and December 2023, Hyundai sold 6.02 lakh units in the domestic Indian market, a 9% increase over the 5.52 lakh units sold in the same period in 2022. But while Hyundai hit a personal best milestone in terms of domestic sales, its exports in 2023 also rose to 1.63 lakh units as against 1.48 lakh units in 2022.



Interest rates on two small savings schemes were increased for January to March 2024 :-

The national government has boosted the interest rate on two minor savings schemes by 10-20 basis points for the period January-March 2024. While the three-year time deposit interest rate has been raised by 10 basis points to 7.1 percent from 7.0 percent, the Sukanya Samriddhi Account Scheme interest rate has been raised by 20 basis points to 8.2 percent for January-March 2024. There is however no change in interest rates of all other small savings schemes and they will continue to offer the same rate of interest as they did in October-December 2022, according to Finance Ministry. One basis point is one-hundredth of a percentage point.



Finance Ministry Allows 30th Tranche Of Electoral Bonds :-

The Centre has authorized the issuing of the 30th tranche of electoral bonds, which will go on sale on January 5th. The window for purchasing and redeeming electoral bonds will be open until January 11. As part of efforts to increase openness in political fundraising, electoral

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bonds have been promoted as an alternative to cash donations to political parties. The sale of the first batch of electoral bonds happened in March 2018. The latest window — 30th tranche — comes ahead of the general elections due later this year.



India Inc's Investment Slump Persists In FY24'S First Nine Months: Bank Of Baroda Analysis :-

According to an analysis by Bank of Baroda's Economic Research Department (ERD), new investments announced by India Inc in the first nine months (9M) of RSITAmit Shah, Minister of Cooperation, launched a tur dal FY24 at Rs 10.80 lakh crore are still low and not rising up at the expected rate. According to the ERD, this is a sign that the industry is still in a wait-and-see mindset. The investment intentions are biased towards four sectors -aviation, chemicals, machinery and power. New investments were at Rs 21.89 lakh crore in 9MFY22 and Rs 13.22 lakh crore in 9MFY21, per the analysis, which is based on CMIE data.



Flipkart's Binny Bansal Launches OppDoor :-Binny Bansal, co-founder of Flipkart, has launched OppDoor. OppDoor will assist e-commerce companies in expanding their business abroad by delivering end-toend solutions. The new company will offer design,

product, human resource, and other backend support to e-commerce enterprises wishing to grow into new markets by using the network of leading platforms like Amazon and others. The company's website now confirms the developments around Binny Bansal's latest startup. OppDoor's website says the company offers "a comprehensive suite of services."



Amit Shah Launches Tur Dal Procurement Portal For Farmers :-

procurement platform via which farmers may register and sell their produce to NAFED and NCCF at a minimum support price or market price. A comparable facility for urad and masoor farmers, as well as maize producers, will be launched in the future, he said. The government also unveiled its Semiconductor and Advanced Electronics Policy, 2024, on the same day as a spate of memorandum of understandings (MOUs) involving massive investments were signed. The vision report provides a comprehensive "growth framework" for achieving Mr. Stalin's ambitious target.



Government To Invest 60,000 Cr In River Cruise Tourism And Green Vessels :-

Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal stated that the government plans to invest Rs 60,000 crore by 2047 on river cruise tourism and green vessel development. "We are going to invest Rs 45,000 crore in river cruise, which will take the passenger capacity from 2 lakh to 15 lakh by 2047," he said on the sidelines of the maiden Inland Waterways Development Council meeting in Kolkata. Sonowal further stated that the government intends to invest another Rs 15,000 crore in green transport over the next ten years to create 1,000 vessels and ferries.



भारतीय जीवन बीमा निगम LIFE INSURANCE CORPORATION OF INDIA LIC Approves Acquisition Of 10% Stake In NHB-Promoted Company :-

The Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) announced its board has approved acquiring up to 10% of a company

promoted by the National Housing Bank (NHB). In a regulatory filing, LIC stated that the board has approved the proposal to invest in a new firm, proposed by the NHB, for residential mortgage-backed securities through an equity contribution of up to 10% of the share capital. The investment is to be made in one or more tranches, it added. Details about the company were not disclosed. LIC has a housing finance subsidiary -- LIC Housing Finance Ltd -- that was incorporated in 1989.





Following US chipmaker Micron and the Tata Group, South Korean business Simmtech has announced plans to build a facility in Sanand for Rs1,250 crore as part of a semiconductor ecosystem in Gujarat. Ashwini Vaishnav, Union Minister for Electronics and Information Technology, stated this at a seminar as part of the Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit in Gandhinagar. The South Korean firm Simmtech has signed an MoU with the state government to set up its plan close to Micron in Sanand near Ahmedabad city.



PM Modi Inaugurates India's Longest Sea Bridge – Atal Setu :-

Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the country's longest sea bridge, 'Atal Bihari Vajpayee Sewri-Nhava Sheva Atal Setu', connecting south Mumbai with the

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satellite city of Navi Mumbai. He stated that the completion of the ₹ 17,840 crore project reflects a new India. The maximum speed restriction for four-wheelers on the Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL) will be 100 km/h. The maximum speed limit for vehicles like cars, taxis, light motor vehicles, minibuses and two-axle buses is 100 kilometres per hour.



Tata Consumer Products Acquires 100% Stake In Capital Foods For ₹5,100 Crore:-

Tata Consumer Products stated that it has purchased a 100% share in Capital Foods, which markets products under the labels Ching's Secret and Smith & Jones. The ₹5,100 crore purchase will be completed entirely in cash. The FMCG firm stated that it would initially purchase 75% of the stock stake, with the remaining 25% to be acquired over the next three years. Ching's Secret holds a dominant position in the Desi Chinese segment across various product categories, including Chutneys, Blended Masalas, Sauces, and Soups.



Centre Introduces New Rules To Boost Ease Of Business In Green Energy Sector :-

The Power Ministry has issued new rules to make doing business easier for industries such as green hydrogen makers, as well as to assist energy transition and energy security by establishing energy storage capacity more quickly. Now users, having more than a specified quantum of load and Energy Storage Systems (ESS) are able to create, operate and maintain dedicated transmission lines themselves without the requirement of licence. By allowing such a facility, a new category of bulk consumers would emerge in the country, benefiting from more affordable electricity and enhanced grid reliability.



Government Reduces Windfall Tax On Crude Oil Amid Global Economic Concerns :-

According to Reuters, India has decreased its windfall tax on petroleum crude from Rs 2,300 per tonne to Rs 1,700, Reuters reported citing a government notice. This adjustment in taxation takes effect on January 16. A windfall tax is an additional tax levied on businesses that make unexpectedly big profits due to advantageous conditions beyond their control. Windfall taxes are a tool for governments to manage the distribution of wealth during periods of economic anomalies. Since July 2022, India has been imposing a windfall tax on local crude oil producers, Reuters reported.



L&T Secures 'Mega Order' For Mumbai-Ahmedabad Bullet Train Electrification Project :-

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Larsen & Toubro (L&T) announced that its construction arm has received a'mega order' to install an electricity system for the country's bullet train project. After completion, this electrification system will allow trains to run at speeds of up to 320 km/h. The order was received from an authorized Japanese agency. This project is being funded by Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and is being implemented by an authorised Japanese agency acting for and on behalf of National High Speed Rail Corporation Ltd.



For 1 GW Data Centre In Maharashtra :-

Adani Enterprises Ltd would invest Rs 50,000 crore in Maharashtra over the next ten years to build 1 GW of hyperscale data infrastructure, the firm announced. The state government and the firm inked a Memorandum of Understanding at the World Economic Forum 2024, in the presence of Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and Adani Group Chairman Gautam Adani. The infrastructure for this data center will be set up in either Mumbai or Navi Mumbai and Pune, and will provide direct and indirect employment to 20,000 people.



Tata Group Secures IPL Title Sponsorship For Next 5 Years :-

The TATA group has secured the Indian Premier League (IPL) for Rs 2500 crores, the highest sponsorship value in the league's history, according to the BCCI. The TATA Group previously owned title sponsorship rights for the IPL in 2022 and 2023, as well as the Women's Premier League. The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) had laid out stringent conditions for potential bidders, particularly excluding entities from territories with which India does not share friendly relations, effectively disqualifying Chinese companies like Vivo from the race.



SBI raises Rs 5,000 crore issuing AT1 bonds at 8.34% rate

Adani Group Announces Rs 50,000 Crore Investment RSIThe State Bank of India (SBI) has raised Rs 5,000 crore through its second Basel III-compliant Additional Tier (AT) 1 bond issue for the current fiscal year at an 8.34% interest rate. The coupon rate on the most recent AT-1 bond issuance is 24 basis points higher than the previous issuance. In July 2023, India's largest bank issued AT-1 bonds for Rs 3,101 crore at an interest rate of 8.10 percent. The tenor of AT-1 bonds is perpetual, with a call option after 10 years and every anniversary thereafter. The issue was oversubscribed by about 2.65 times against the base issue size of Rs 2,000 crore, the bank said in a statement.



India's Foreign Exchange Reserves Jump \$1.63 Billion to \$618.9 Billion :-

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said that India's currency reserves increased by USD 1.634 billion to USD 618.937

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billion during the week ending January 12. In the preceding reporting week, total reserves fell drastically by USD 5.89 billion to USD 617.3 billion. The country's forex reserves reached an all-time high of USD 645 billion in October 2021. For the week ended January 12, the foreign currency assets -- a major component of the reserves -- increased USD 1.859 billion to USD 548.508 billion, the data said.



AIIB Invests \$58.4 Million In India's Largest Renewable **Energy InvIT :-**NIVERSI'

The Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) has invested INR 4.86 billion (US\$58.4 million) in Sustainable Energy Infra Trust (SEIT), India's largest Renewable Energy Infrastructure Investment Trust (InvIT). SEIT, which is sponsored by Mahindra Susten Private Limited and the Ontario Teachers' Pension Plan, has eight operating solar power assets with a total peak capacity of 1.54 gigawatts scattered across India. This marks AIIB's second foray into InvITs in India, emphasizing its commitment to innovative infrastructure financing solutions.



Competition Commission Of India Greenlights JSW Group's 38% Stake Buy In MG Motor India :-

The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has approved Sajjan Jindal's JSW Group's proposed acquisition of up to a 38% stake in MG Motor India. This equity purchase is made through JSW Ventures Singapore, a newly formed corporation that is a wholly-owned subsidiary of JSW International Tradecorp Pte Ltd and a member of the JSW Group. The competition watchdog has also approved, in a separate proposal, the acquisition of Wistron Infocomm Manufacturing (India) Pvt Ltd by Tata Electronics.



Petroleum Ministry Approves ONGC's Green Energy Unit :-

Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) said that the Petroleum and Natural Gas Ministry has approved the development of a subsidiary firm for green energy and gas operations. The subsidiary's activities will include green hydrogen, hydrogen blending, renewable energy (solar, wind, and hybrid), biofuels and biogas, and liquefied natural gas (LNG). The newly sanctioned subsidiary, tentatively titled "ONGC Green Limited," is expected to be completely controlled by ONGC. However, the proposed name is subject to the approval of the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Government of India.

Earthquake : 7.6 magnitude quake jolts Japan, tsunami warning issued:-

According to NHK, the state broadcaster, a 7.6 magnitude earthquake hit north central Japan on January 1. In response, the Japan Meteorological Agency has issued tsunami warnings for the prefectures of Ishikawa, Niigata, and Toyama. Authorities in Noto, Ishikawa Prefecture, are on high alert, expecting waves of up to 5 meters. NHK reports 1 meter waves slamming the coast of Wajima City in Ishikawa Prefecture. Hokuriku Electric Power is inspecting nuclear facilities for safety post-quake, NHK reveals.



US Navy destroys boats controlled by Iran-backed militias in Red Sea :-

A US Navy ship destroyed three boats carrying pro-Iranian Yemeni rebels after they attacked a Danishowned cargo ship on December 31st, the latest in a series of attacks that have impeded Red Sea maritime activity. In reaction to the United States' support for Israel's military effort, Iranian-backed extremist organizations have launched a series of attacks on Western interests, including assaults on ships transiting through the Red Sea. Earlier in December 2023, shipping companies, oil producers and cargo owners suspended transit through the Red Sea after some vessels were attacked by Houthi militants.



Dong Jun Named As China's New Defense Minister :-China has announced the nomination of a new defense minister, two months after the former office holder, Li Shangfu, was abruptly removed from his post. The National People's Congress Standing Committee, China's de facto legislature, announced Dong Jun, 62, as the new defense minister. Dong was most recently the commander of the Chinese navy. The announcement comes days after three senior executives from the aerospace defence industry were removed from a top advisory body to the Chinese Communist party (CCP) as part of a shake-up of the military that is thought to be linked to an anti-graft campaign that may have ensnared Li.



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IMF To Release \$700 Million Bailout Tranche To Pakistan In January :-

According to media reports, Cash-strapped Pakistan is set to get \$700 million as the next tranche of the IMF bailout when the global lender's Executive Board meets on January 11. According to the Dawn daily, the board of the Washington-based International Monetary Fund is expected to consider and maybe provide final permission for the release of the next \$700 million tranche for Pakistan under the existing \$3 billion Stand-By Arrangement (SBA). According to the IMF Executive Board calendar, upcoming meetings are scheduled for January 8, 10 and 11, with Pakistan's case slated for discussion on the last day.



Abu Dhabi's First Temple To Be Inaugurated By PM Modi On 14 Feb :-

On February 14, Prime Minister Narendra Modi will dedicate a historic temple in Abu Dhabi. The BAPS Hindu Mandir in Abu Dhabi is the country's first Hindu temple in UAE, located in the capital's Abu Mureikha neighborhood. The temple will be one of the largest and most beautiful Hindu temples outside of India, as well as the largest in West Asia. During Prime Minister Modi's first visit to the UAE in 2015, the UAE decided to allot land for the construction of a temple in Abu Dhabi. The PM's visit was crucial diplomatically as he became the first Indian Prime Minister after Indira Gandhi to visit this strategic Gulf nation in 34 years.



Denmark's Queen Margrethe II To Step Down After 52 Years On Throne :-

Denmark's Queen Margrethe II has revealed that she intends to abdicate after 52 years and pass the kingdom to her son, Crown Prince Frederik. The queen, Europe's longest-reigning living monarch, declared during her New Year's speech that she would abdicate on January 14, the anniversary of her ascension to the throne at the age of 31 following the death of her father, King Frederik IX. Ever since his birth on May 26, 1968, Frederik André Henrik Christian has been the heir to the Danish throne.



Fitch Forecasts Strong Growth For Asia Pacific Emerging Markets In 2024 :-

According to Fitch Ratings, Asia Pacific economic growth would remain strong in 2024, with GDP growing by roughly 5% in India and a number of developing market countries. Fitch said in its study titled 'APAC Cross-Sector Outlook 2024' that the outlooks for the banking sectors in India and Indonesia, as well as APAC emerging markets overall, improve in 2024, reflecting the robust economic backdrop. The Indian economy grew 7.2 per cent in 2022-23 fiscal year. India's GDP expanded 7.8 per cent and 7.6 per cent in the June and September quarters, respectively.

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India Plans 'Bharat Park' Trade Zone In UAE For Global Showcase :-

The government intends to establish 'Bharat Park', an India-specific trade zone in the UAE that will include a showroom and warehouse. Goods manufactured in India will be showcased and stored for a global audience in the Park. Piyush Goyal, Union Minister of Textiles and Commerce, stated that the Bharat Park will allow other countries to acquire Indian goods while payment is secured in the UAE. Urging the industry to maintain the quality of goods exported from India, he said the Bureau of Indian Standard will spend Rs 40 crore to set up 21 testing laboratories at various places in India.



Bangladesh Election 2024: Sheikh Hasina Secures Fifth Term Amid Opposition Boycott:-

Despite poor turnout and a boycott of Bangladesh's general elections, incumbent Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina gained her fifth term in power after her Awami League Party won an absolute majority in the polls. Following the polling on January 7, the Awami League took an early lead, gaining 216 of the 224 seats on 07 January. Sheikh Hasina became the world's longest-serving female head of state after being elected to a fifth

term as prime minister. The Bangladesh elections of 2024 saw a considerably low voter turnout, amid boycotts against the current government.



Tshering Tobgay Re-Elected As Bhutan's Prime Minister :-

Bhutanese voters have elected Tshering Tobgay as Prime Minister for the second time, with his party winning over two-thirds of the seats, the election commission said in results. Mr. Tobgay, the leader of the liberal People's Democratic Party (PDP), who was prime minister of the Himalayan country from 2013 to 2018, won 30 of the 47 seats. The 58-year-old, a former civil servant, is a passionate conservation advocate who holds a degree in mechanical engineering from the University of Pittsburgh and a Master's in public administration from Harvard.



IIT Madras To Establish New Campus In Kandy, Sri Lanka :-

Sri Lanka's Education Minister, Dr. Susil Premajayantha, has announced that a new IIT Madras campus will be established in Kandy, Sri Lanka. The proposal, according to the minister, was part of Sri Lanka President Ranil Wickremasinghe's Budget 2024, which he submitted as

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Finance Minister. He further stated that during his visit to IIT Madras last month, he spoke with the Director and Deans of Faculty. Dr. Premajayantha added that a team of academics would be sent by his ministry to IIT Madras before the team from IIT would visit Sri Lanka for starting the Campus.



Bernardo Arevalo Sworn In As Guatemala President :-Anti-corruption crusader Bernardo Arevalo was sworn in as Guatemala's president following a turbulent inauguration that was delayed for hours by a last-ditch attempt by Congress opponents to restrict his authority. Arevalo won the August elections by a landslide, and almost 9 hours after his inauguration was set to begin, he took the oath of office, succeeding conservative candidate Alejandro Giammattei. Arevalo's unexpected election victory was seen as a watershed moment for Guatemala, where the 65-year-old has cast himself as a democracy advocate and the leader of a progressive movement bent on reshaping a political landscape long dominated by conservative parties.



India Secures Lithium Blocks In Argentina To Address ₹24,000 Crore Import Dependency :-

In a momentous milestone, India is preparing to acquire exploration and development rights to five lithium blocks in Argentina. India has taken a significant step towards lowering its ₹24,000 crore lithium import dependency, mostly from China. The contract was reached between Khanij Bidesh India Ltd. (KABIL) and Catamarca Minera Y Energética Sociedad Del Estado (CAMYEN), an Argentine state-owned mining and energy firm. Under the agreement, KABIL gains Exploration and Exclusivity Rights for five lithium brine blocks located in Argentina, spanning approximately 15,703 hectares. The specific blocks include Cortadera-I, Cortadera-VII, Cortadera-VIII, Cateo-2022-01810132, and Cortadera-VI.



UNDP And Denmark Launch "Green Rooms" In Ukraine :-

The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), in conjunction with the Danish government, has launched a ground-breaking effort in Ukraine by establishing "green rooms" at the National Police headquarters in Zaporizhzhia Oblast. This innovative effort seeks to provide a secure and supportive atmosphere for successful communication between law enforcement officials and child survivors or witnesses to crime. Interactions in the "green room" can be recorded, providing a valuable resource for court proceedings.



India Aids Afghanistan With 40,000 Liters Of Malathion Against Locust Threat :-

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In its continuous efforts to help Afghanistan, India has delivered 40,000 litres of Malathion, a pesticide used to control locust problem, through the Chabahar port. The Taliban-controlled Ministry of Agriculture has expressed gratitude for this aid, emphasizing its importance in crop protection and preserving food security for Afghanistan. Malathion, which is noted for its effectiveness in arid areas and low water consumption, is regarded as an important weapon in locust management. The aid not only addresses the immediate threat in Afghanistan but also serves to prevent the spread of locusts to neighbouring Central Asian countries.



Saudi Arabia To Open First Alcohol Store For Diplomats :-

Saudi Arabia is set to build its first alcohol store in the capital, Riyadh, to serve only non-Muslim officials. The move is a significant step in the kingdom's efforts, led by Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, to open the ultra-conservative Muslim country to tourism and industry, as alcohol consumption is prohibited in Islam. It is also part of a larger plan called Vision 2030 to create a post-oil economy. A source familiar with the plans said the store is expected to open in the coming weeks.



Maersk Reveals World's Largest Methanol-Powered Container Ship :-

AP Moller-Maersk has revealed the Ane Maersk, the world's largest Ship that can run on the green hydrogen derivative. It was named after Ane Maersk Mc-Kinney Uggla, Chairman of the Parent Company AP Moller Holding. It can carry 8 times more containers than Danish Logistics Company's Laura Maersk, which became the world's first methanol dual-fuel container ship when it was launched in September 2023. The Ane Maersk will begin its first voyage on 9th Feb from Hyundai Heavy Industries Shipyard in Ulsan, South Korea.



Tran Says It Launched 3 Satellites Simultaneously Into Orbit :-

Iran claimed to have launched three satellites into orbit at the same time, nearly a week after the Revolutionary Guards launched a research spacecraft that obtained criticism from the West. The satellites were transported by the two-stage Simorgh (Phoenix) satellite carrier and launched into a minimum orbit of 450 kilometers (280 miles), according to state TV. The Mahda satellite, which weighs around 32 kilogrammes and was developed by Iran's Space Agency, is designed to test advanced satellite subsystems, the official IRNA news agency said.



India Nominates 'Maratha Military Landscapes' For UNESCO World Heritage List 2024-25 :-

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In a significant move to recognise and preserve India's rich historical heritage, the Ministry of Culture has announced that 'Maratha Military Landscapes of India', which represents the extraordinary fortification and military system envisioned by the Maratha rulers, will be the country's nomination for inclusion on the UNESCO World Heritage List for the 2024-25 cycle. Developed between the 17th and 19th centuries, the nomination comprises the 12 components of Salher Fort, Shivneri Fort, Lohgad, Khanderi Fort, Raigad, Rajgad, Pratapgad, Suvarnadurg, Panhala Fort, Vijaydurg, Sindhudurg in Maharashtra, and Gingee Fort in Tamil Nadu, the statement said.

David Warner Retires From One-Day Cricket :-

In the run-up to his final Test, David Warner has declared his retirement from one-day international cricket. Following Australia's 2023 World Cup victory in India, where he was the team's leading run-scorer, the veteran opener stated the time has come to call it quits in oneday internationals. Warner retires as the sixth-highest ODI run-scorer in Australian history, with 6,932 runs from 161 matches. His 22 centuries are the second most by any Australian ODI player, behind only Ricky Ponting, who made 29 in 105 more innings than Warner played.



Vodafone Idea Director P Balaji Moves To Air India :-

P Balaji, director (regulatory and corporate affairs) at Vodafone Idea, has resigned, the telecom operator announced. He will join Air India as group head (governance, regulatory, compliance, and corporate affairs), according to the Tata Group airline. Balaji was the principal individual at Vodafone Idea who interacted with government authorities, the company's largest shareholder. In a statement, Air India said Balaji will assume his role on January 11 and report to CEO and MD Campbell Wilson.



10th Century Kadamba Inscription Written In Kannada, Sanskrit Found In Goa :-

In the Mahadeva temple in Cacoda in southern Goa, an inscription written in Kannada and Sanskrit dating from the 10th century A.D. Kadamba period was uncovered. The inscription was investigated by T. Murugeshi, a retired associate professor of ancient history and archaeology at Mulki Sundar Ram Shetty College in Shirva, Udupi district. According to Mr. Murugeshi, its epigraph is engraved in Kannada and Nagari characters. Rajendra Kerkar, an environmentalist of Goa, found the inscription and informed Mr. Murugeshi.

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Ujjain Unveils India's First Hygienic Food Street 'Prasadam' :-

Union Health Minister Mansukh Mandaviya unveiled India's first health food street, Prasadam, in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh. The food street at Neelkanth Van, Mahakal Lok in Ujjain will be the first of 100 to open across the country's districts. Ujjain, home to the worldfamous Mahakal Temple, is also the hometown of MP's new Chief Minister, Mohan Yadav. Mandaviya, who opened the food street, along with the Chief Minister, RSI stated that the launch marks a significant stride in the country's journey towards healthy eating habits.



NICMAR Hyderabad Achieves Platinum Certification Under IGBC Green Campus Rating :-

The National Institute of Construction Management and Research (NICMAR) in Hyderabad has been awarded platinum certification under the Indian Green Building Council's Green Campus Rating. With approximately 25 trees per acre, or 47% green cover, and water-efficient irrigation systems, among other green measures, NICMAR is leading the way in promoting sustainability in India's higher education institutions and sensitizing young architects early on. Of the total landscape area of 21,619 square metres, a whopping 90.04% is covered by drought-tolerant or native species while 9.96% is covered by turf.



Government Approves 1-Year Extension For RBI Deputy Governor Michael Patra :-

Michael Patra, deputy governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), has had his tenure extended by the Centre for another year. The extension is effective January 15 of current year. Patra is in charge of the crucial monetary policy section and a member of the rate-setting committee. Patra was originally appointed as RBI deputy governor in January 2020 for a three-year term. Last year, the government extended his term by one year. Patra, a career central banker since 1985, has worked in various positions in the RBI. Before becoming deputy governor, Patra was executive director of the RBI.



Food Corporation of India

FCI (Food Corporation Of India) Marks Its 60th Anniversary :-

The FCI celebrates its 60th anniversary, with Union Minister Piyush Goyal hailing India's food self-sufficiency as a unique achievement in human history. On January 14, 2024, Goyal stressed the FCI's critical role in eliminating hunger for all citizens of the world's most populated nation. Minister Goyal emphasized the

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importance of maintaining transparency in the FCI's operations and adopting digital technologies to improve efficiency and quality. He urged the organization to explore avenues to manage expenses effectively, acknowledging the vital role it plays in maintaining India's food security.



Shaun Marsh Announces Retirement From Professional Cricket :-

Shaun Marsh, an Australian cricketer, announced his retirement from professional cricket, with the Melbourne Renegades' Big Bash League match against Sydney Thunder being his final assignment on January 17. Before joining the Renegades for the 2019-20 season, he played for the Perth Scorchers from 2011 to 2019, and he paid tribute to his former squad. Marsh also had a great stint with Australia across formats, scoring more than 5,200 runs and 13 centuries, while his last outing for the Kangaroos was against Sri Lanka at The Oval during the 2019 ODI World Cup.



Tallest Ambedkar Statue Unveiled In Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh :-

The Andhra Pradesh government inaugurated the world's tallest statue of BR Ambedkar, recognized as the architect of the Indian Constitution, in Vijayawada on January 19. Standing 206 feet tall, the 'Statue of Social Justice' will be one of the world's top 50 tallest statues, which Sardar Vallabhai Patel's 'Statue of Unity' tops. The second-tallest Ambedkar statue, which is 175 feet, is situated in neighbouring Telangana. The project to build the statue incurred ₹404.35 crore and it is spread over 18.81 acres of land covered in a lush green park.



Centre allows female employees to nominate son and daughter for family pension :-

According to an official release, the Central government has altered regulations to allow women government employees to nominate their children above their spouses for family pensions, a pivotal decision with substantial socioeconomic consequences. Previously, the family pension was assigned to the spouse of a deceased government servant or pensioner, and other family members were only eligible if the spouse died or became ineligible. The alteration enables female government workers or pensioners to allocate family pension to their eligible children posthumously, superseding their spouse.

E-Commerce Exports Handbook for MSMEs Launched: Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal has launched the Directorate General of Foreign Trade's (DGFT) 'E-Commerce Exports Handbook for MSMEs' as an authoritative reference for MSMEs wishing to harness ecommerce platforms to boost their exports. The manual is currently available in English, Hindi, Gujarati, and Kannada and will be translated into all official languages in India. The minister also announced extending the Scheme for Remission of Duties and Taxes on Exported Products (RoDTEP) to courier and postal exports.



68 Rajya Sabha Members, Including Notables Like Manmohan Singh And Jaya Bachchan, Set To Retire In 2024 :-

This year, 68 Rajya Sabha members, including nine Union ministers, will complete their terms. Elections have already been announced for three of the 68 vacancies in Delhi, where AAP leaders Sanjay Singh, Narain Dass Gupta, and Sushil Kumar Gupta will finish their terms on January 27. As many as 57 leaders, including Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, Environment Minister Bhupendra Yadav, Health Minister Mansukh Madaviya, and former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, will complete their tenures in April. BJP members Anil Agrawal, Ashok Bajpai, Anil Jain, Kanta Kardam, Sakaldeep Rajbhar, GVL Narasimha Rao, Vijay Pal Singh Tomar, Sudhanshu Trivedi and Harnath Singh Yadav, Samajwadi Party member Jaya Bachchan from Uttar Pradesh are retiring.



India Aims To Reach \$5 Trillion Economy By FY28, \$30 Trillion By 2047: Finance Minister At Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit :-

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman stated that India will become the world's third largest economy by 2027-28, with a GDP of more than \$5 trillion. Even with conservative forecasts, the Indian economy will be worth USD 30 trillion by 2047, she noted. "It is possible that we will be the third largest economy by 2027-28, and our GDP will cross USD 5 trillion by that time. By 2047, it is a conservative estimate that we will reach at least USD 30 trillion in terms of economy," Sitharaman said at the Vibrant Gujarat summit.



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Indian Army To Observe 2024 As The Year Of Technology Absorption :-

The Indian Army will observe 2024 as the "Year of Technology Absorption" as it strives to gradually mature into a modern force with a new operational philosophy for the induction of drones and counter-drones systems across infantry, artillery, and armoured battalions, as well as the establishment of Command Cyber Operations Support Wings (CCOSWs), in addition to bridging other conventional asymmetries. The Army's new pitch is an attempt to grow out of previous declaration of making 2023 as the "Year of Transformation" that saw moves such as reorientation of its arms like that of artillery, induction of fresh human resource through Agniveers, downsizing of some verticals and tech infusion.



Defense Minister Sanctions Insurance Scheme For BRO Workers :-

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has approved a proposal to grant insurance coverage to tens of thousands of casual laborers employed by the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) to build infrastructure on the country's most remote frontiers. "This scheme will provide Rs.10 lakh as insurance in any kind of death to the family of casual paid labourers," the defence ministry said in a statement. The latest welfare step comes months after the ministry implemented a new policy for BRO's casual workers in September 2023 to ensure their dignity in the event of death.



PM Modi Inaugurates NACIN Campus In Andhra Pradesh :-

Prime Minister Modi has inaugurated the new campus of the National Academy of Customs, Indirect Taxes & Narcotics (NACIN) at Palasamudram in Andhra Pradesh's Sri Sathya Sai district. He interactied with the Officer Trainees of the 74th and 75th batch of Indian Revenue Service (Custom and Indirect Taxes) as well as the Officer Trainees of Royal Civil Service of Bhutan. He visited the IVERSITAntiques Smuggling Study Centre, Narcotics Study Centre and Wildlife Crime Detection Centre at NACIN. The PM also released a book titled "Flora of Palasamudram".



Ministry of Home Affairs Revokes FCRA Registration of Centre for Policy Research :-

The Centre for Policy Research (CPR), a well-known nongovernmental organization, has had its Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) license revoked by the Ministry of Home Affairs for alleged regulatory infractions. The CPR's license under the Foreign Contribution Registration Act was suspended 11 months ago. The cancellation order was issued on January 10, according to reports. Established in 1973, CPR is one of

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India's oldest and most prominent think tanks and research centers. It came under scrutiny by the Income Tax authorities in September 2022.



India Records Its First-Ever Confirmed Sighting Of A Rare Tibetan Brown Bear :-

India has made a significant discovery by recording the first confirmed sighting of a rare Tibetan Brown Bear. The bear was discovered in the high elevations of Northern Sikkim thanks to video traps deployed by the Sikkim Forest Department and WWF-India. With this discovery, the nation's animal variety has grown by one subspecies. According to sources, over the past decades, foresters, interacting with the Dokpas or nomadic herders in the high-altitude areas of Tso-Lhamo plateau and Muguthang, heard incidents of a large unidentified animal stealing sugar and oil stored in the herders' camps.



Farsi As India's New Classical Language :-In a crucial step toward strengthening cultural connections, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said that the Government of India has agreed to incorporate Farsi (Persian) as one of India's nine classical languages under the New Education Policy. This accreditation demonstrates a dedication to increasing understanding and appreciation for Farsi's rich tradition within the Indian educational framework. Tamil was the first language in India to be accorded classical language status in 2004. Sanskrit, Kannada, Malayalam and Odia are the other languages that have been declared classical languages in India by the central government.



PM Modi Inaugurates Boeing's Global Engineering & Technology Centre Campus Near Bengaluru :-

Prime Minister Narendra Modi officially inaugurated Boeing's worldwide engineering and technology campus in Bengaluru, which cost Rs 1,600 crore to build on a 43acre plot of land. According to a statement, the Boeing India Engineering & Technology Center (BIETC) is the company's largest investment outside of the United States and will serve as a foundation for collaborating with India on products and services for the global aerospace and defense industry. Modi said that Bengaluru links aspirations to innovations and achievements, and Indian technology to global demand.



PM Launched Khelo India Youth Games 2023 In Chennai, Tamil Nadu :-

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Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the Khelo India Youth Games 2023 at Chennai's landmark Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, kicking off a two-week athletic festival. Over 5,500 competitors from 26 competitive sports are expected to attend the event, which runs from January 19 to January 31. PM Modi has launched ₹250 crore worth of broadcasting projects. This includes the launch of the revamped DD Podhigai channel as DD Tamil, 12 Akashvani FM projects in 8 States, and 4 DD transmitters in Jammu and Kashmir.



Union Cabinet Approves Creation of Posts to Assist 16th R S I Finance Commission :-

The Cabinet has approved the formation of three officerlevel positions to support the 16th Finance Commission, chaired by Arvind Panagariya. The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the creation of three Joint Secretary positions for the 16th Finance Commission, comprising two Joint Secretaries and one Economic Adviser, according to an official statement. All other posts in the commission have already been created as per the delegated powers, it added. Ritvik Ranjanam Pandey was named as the Secretary to the Commission.



Ayodhya Ram Mandir Inaugurated By Prime Minister Narendra Modi :-

On January 22, 2024, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, marking an important event in Indian history. The inauguration included the 'Pran Pratishtha' (consecration) ceremony of the Ram Lalla idol, which is a significant ritual that represents the infusion of life into the statue. Over 7,000 dignitaries attended the event, which served as both a religious service and a cultural milestone for India. The temple itself, an architectural marvel, stands at a length of 380 feet, a width of 250 feet, and a height of 161 feet, embodying the traditional Nagara style of architecture.



Vice-President Launches 'Hamara Samvidhan, Hamara Samman' Campaign For India's 75th Republic Year :-

Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar launched a year-long pan-India effort called 'Hamara Samvidhan, Hamara Samman' in New Delhi to commemorate India's 75th anniversary as a republic. The campaign's major goal is to empower all citizens to actively participate in India's democratic journey. Throughout the year, various themes such as 'Sabko Nyay - Har Ghar Nyaya,' 'Nav Bharat Nav Sankalp,' and 'Vidhi Jagriti Abhiyan' will be explored. Addressing the gathering, Vice President Dhankhar called for remembering the nation's forgotten heroes and rediscovering India.



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Republic Day 2024: Women Tri-Services contingent participated in parade for the first time :-

India has celebrated its 75th Republic Day on 26 January 2024. The theme for this year's festival is 'Viksit Bharat' and 'Bharat - Loktantra ki Matruka,' which promises a unique blend of traditions and innovation, as well as spectacular events and attractions celebrating togetherness and patriotism. For the first time this year, a tri-service ensemble made up entirely of women marched in the Republic Day Parade. According to ANI, the organisation consists of female soldiers from the Army's military police as well as staff members from the other two services.



Air India fined Rs 1.1 cr for violating flight safety rules:-The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has imposed a Rs 1.1 crore fine on Air India for violating safety rules on flights on certain long-range routes that were "critical" in terms of terrain. In a complaint filed with the DGCA in October last year, a pilot accused the Tata Group-run airline of carrying insufficient emergency oxygen on its B777 aircraft operating on India-US routes. The DGCA, after an investigation, found merit in the pilot's allegations and imposed the aforementioned penalty.



Centre Identifies 'Hotspots' in 30 Cities to Achieve Goal of Beggar-Free India :-

From Ayodhya in the north to Guwahati in the east, Trimbakeshwar in the west to Thiruvananthapuram in NIVERSITHE south, the Centre has identified 30 cities of religious, historical, and tourism significance for surveying and rehabilitating adults, particularly women and children who beg. The ministry of social justice and empowerment is aiming to support the district and Municipal authorities in identifying hotspots and making these spaces free of beggary by 2026. According to officials more cities are likely to be added to this list over these two years.

Carnatic vocalist O.S. Thyagarajan passes away :-

O S Thiagarajan, a well-known carnatic singer, died at the age of 76 in a private hospital in Chennai after a protracted illness. O S Thiagarajan was the recipient of various honors, including the Sangeetha Natak Academi Puraskar, the Sangeetha Choodamani (Sri Krishna Gana Sabha, Chennai), and the Sangeetha Kala Sagara (Kalasagaram, Hyderabad). He frequently appeared at Margazhi music festivals. Thiagarajan, was also the dean and faculty of fine arts at Annamalai University for 5 years. He has trained many disciples who are active on the carnatic circuit.

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Oscar-nominated actor and 'The Full Monty', 'Batman Begins' star, Tom Wilkinson, passes away at 75 :-

Tom Wilkinson, the Oscar-nominated British actor best known for his appearances in "The Full Monty," "Michael Clayton," and "The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel," has died, according to his family. He was 75. Wilkinson was nominated for an Academy Award for best actor for his work in the 2001 family drama "In The Bedroom," as well as for best supporting actor for his role in "Michael Clayton," a 2007 courtroom thriller starring George R SI Thave won the World Cup as both a player and a manager, Clooney. He starred in dozens of other TV dramas and movies, from "Rush Hour" and "Batman Begins" to "Shakespeare in Love", "Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind" and "Valkyrie".



Padma Bhushan Awardee Prof Ved Prakash Nanda **Passes Away :-**

Professor Ved Prakash Nanda, a prominent Indian-American law expert, died lately. Nanda, a Padma Bhushan recipient for his contributions to literature and education, was also the John Evans Distinguished University Professor of International Law at Colorado's University of Denver. Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed grief over Nanda's demise. who said that Professor Nanda's work highlighted his commitment to legal education. Home Minister Amit Shah also condoled Nanda's demise.



German football legend Franz Beckenbauer passes away at age of 78 :-

Franz Beckenbauer, the respected German football star regarded as one of the game's all-time greats, died at the age of 78. His legacy as "Der Kaiser" is well established as one of football's best. He is one of only three people to with Brazil's Mario Zagallo and France's Didier Deschamps. The former Bayern Munich stalwart clinched the European Cup thrice with the Bavarian giants, securing the Bundesliga title four times as a player and once as a coach. His leadership guided Bayern to UEFA Cup victory in 1996.



Maestro Ustad Rashid Khan Passes Away At 55 :-Ustad Rashid Khan, a music maestro, died while being treated for prostate cancer at a hospital in Kolkata, according to officials. The classical singer was 55. The classical singer, a member of the Rampur-Sahaswan Gharana, is Inayat Hussain Khan's great-grandson. Born in Uttar Pradesh, Badayun Rashid Khan, the nephew of

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Ustad Ghulam Mustafa Khan, received his early tuition from his maternal grandfather, Ustad Nissar Hussain Khan (1909–1993). At the age of eleven, Rashid Khan delivered his debut concert, and in the subsequent year, 1978, he graced the stage at an ITC concert in Delhi.



Former TCS executive director Phiroz Vandrevala passes away at 70 :-

Phiroz Vandrevala, a former executive director of IT major Tata Consultancy Services, died at the age of 70. Vandrevala, a former chairman of the IT industry association Nasscom, left the TCS board in 2016. Vandrevala joined the Mumbai-based Tata Group in 1982 and has been a major member of its leadership team for decades. From 2007 to 2016, he served as the company's executive director and head of global corporate affairs at TCS. Vandrevala also had a stint as vice-chairman and managing director of TCS' UK-based subsidiary Diligenta and led the company's life insurance and pensions industry business.



Renowned classical singer Prabha Atre dies at 92 :-Dr. Prabha Atre, a renowned classical vocalist and Padma Vibhushan laureate, died on January 13 of a heart arrest at her Pune home at the age of 92, according to individuals close to her. Atre, a torchbearer of Hindustani classical music's Kirana Gharana, received all three Padma awards from the Indian government. In January 2022, she received the Padma Vibhushan, the nation's second-highest civilian honour. She was earlier honoured with the Padma Shri award in 1990 and the Padma Bhushan in 2002.



Urdu poet Munawwar Rana passes away at 71 :-

Munawwar Rana, a renowned poet, died on January 14 at the Sanjay Gandhi Post Graduate Institute of Medical Sciences in Lucknow. He was 71. He had been suffering from throat cancer for a long time. Mr. Munawwar Rana, born in 1952 in Rae Bareli, received the Gyanpeeth Award in 2014. His use of basic terms in his poetry made them famous among the general public. Mr. Munawwar Rana's poem Maa, which is considered one of his most famous works, has a special place in the world of Urdu literature.



World Champion Pole Vaulter Shawn Barber Passed Away :-

Shawn Barber, the Canadian pole vault record holder and 2015 world champion, died of medical issues. He was 29. He owns the men's pole vault record of 6.00 meters. The record was set in January 2016 in Reno, Nevada. Barber also won the 2015 World Championships in Beijing, China, with a mark of 5.90m. In 2015, Shawn Barber won

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the NCAA outdoor title for the University of Akron. The year was special for Shawn Barber in terms of victories, as he won one of his five Canadian titles in the year 2015.



Ilaiyaraaja's daughter and playback singer Bhavatharini passed away :-

Bhavatharini, the daughter of music director Ilaiyaraaja and playback vocalist, died lately from cancer. According to accounts, she traveled to Sri Lanka to seek treatment for liver cancer. Bhavatharini debuted as a singer with 'Raasaiya'. She became the composer for Revathy's film 'Mitr, My Friend' in 2002. She later composed for 'Phir Milenge' and a number of films. Her last music album was for the Malayalam film, 'Maayanadhi'. She won the National Film Award for Best Female Playback singer for Tamil song, 'Mayil Pola Ponnu Onnu' from 'Bharathi'.

Bank achieve 80% annual crop loan target in first half of FY24 :-

According to the State Level Bankers' Committee (SLBC), banks in Telangana disbursed Rs 35,023 crore in crop loans in the first six months of the fiscal year, up to September, attaining 79.48% of the yearly target. Presenting a report on performance of the banks, during the first half of 2023-24, at the SLBC meeting in Hyderabad, SBI Chief General Manager Rajesh Kumar said Rs 26,730 crore investment credit was disbursed by the banks to allied agriculture activities and thus meeting 67.97% of the targets.



India confident FY24 growth will be comfortably above 6.5% :-

In its Half-Yearly Economic Review 2023-24, the Union Finance Ministry predicted healthy economic growth for fiscal year 2023-24 (FY24), comfortably reaching the 6.5% level. "The growth witnessed in Q2 of FY24 is indicative of a strong economic recovery, and we anticipate this momentum to continue into Q3. High-Frequency Indicators (HFIs) for October and November 2023 demonstrate robust economic activity, further supporting our optimistic outlook" the Finance Ministry stated.

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UPI Ends 2023 With Record Transactions Worth Rs 18-Lakh Crore, Up 42% Y-O-Y :-

The Unified Payments Interface (UPI) finished 2023 on a high note, with over 1,200 crore transactions worth more than Rs 18 lakh crore recorded in December, a record for both the number and value of transactions. According to data from the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), over 11,765 UPI transactions worth Rs 182.2 lakh crore were performed in 2023, representing a 59% increase in volume and a 45% increase in value over 2022. Transactions worth Rs 18.23-lakh crore were processed during December, significantly higher than the previous high of Rs 17.40-lakh crore in November.



Hyderabad, Bengaluru Airports Score High In Global On-Time Ranking :-

n 2023, Hyderabad and Bengaluru airports were ranked second and third in the world for on-time performance (OTP). With an OTP of 84.44%, Minneapolis' St Paul International Airport topped the list. OTP declined at Japanese airports. Netaji Subhash Chandra airport in Kolkata was ranked ninth in the 'medium airports' category. IndiGo secured the eighth rank in the low-cost carriers category. On-time performance (OTP) is a valuable metric of reliability, with OTP arrivals used to rank airlines and OTP departures used to rank airports.



PNB Housing Finance's NCD Ratings Upgraded By India Ratings To IND AA+ With Stable Outlook :-

PNB Housing Finance, a housing finance firm, announced that India Ratings and Research (Ind-Ra) has upgraded the company's non-convertible debentures (NCDs) to 'IND AA+' with a stable outlook from 'IND AA'. The rating rationale, published on January 2, 2024, mentions that the key drivers for the rating upgrade are granularisation of loan book with 96 per cent being retail and almost complete rundown of the corporate book, robust capital buffers post equity infusion of ₹2,500 through rights issue, improved asset quality, diversified resource profile with the ability to raise funds from banks and the capital markets, adequate liquidity and improvement in profitability.



India's FY24 GDP Growth Projection At 7.3%: NSO Data :-

The National Statistical Office (NSO) forecasts 7.3 percent growth in the Indian economy in 2023-2024, higher than the Reserve Bank of India's estimate of 7%, assuming an investment-led rebound in the world's fifth largest economy. This far exceeds the Street's expectations. Most economists expect India's gross domestic product (GDP) to expand between 6.5% and 6.7% in the current fiscal year. The Indian economy grew

7.7 per cent in the first half (April-September) of FY24, data for which was released on November 30.



UN Report: India's GDP Growth Forecast At 6.2% For 2024 :-

A United Nations report lowered India's GDP growth forecast for the calendar year 2024 to 6.2 percent from 6.7 percent previously. "Growth in India is projected to reach 6.2 per cent in 2024, slightly lower than the 6.3 per cent estimate for 2023, amid robust domestic demand and strong growth in the manufacturing and services sectors," according to the World Economic Situation and Prospects (WESP) study. According to the research, declining global demand, unresolved trade concerns among the main trading partners, and geopolitical conflicts are all having an impact on trade flows in the medium term.



Delhi's Robust Economic Growth: Per Capita Income Soars By Over 14% To Rs 4,44,768 :-

According to the Department of Economics and Statistics' newly released 'Statistical Handbook-2023', Delhi's per capita income increased from Rs 3,89,529 in 2021-22 to Rs 4,44,768 in 2022-23. This is more than the national average per capita income of Rs 1,72,276, according to the handbook. An average of 41 lakh passengers used DTC buses daily last year — there are over 7,200 DTC and Delhi Integrated Multi-Modal Transit

System (DIMTS) buses in the city, of which 1,300 buses were electric ones in 2023.



EU Scientists Confirm 2023 As Hottest Year Ever Recorded :-

According to the European Union's Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S), last year was the world's hottest year on record by a significant margin and most likely the warmest in the last 1 million years. Scientists had generally anticipated the milestone after climate records had been regularly broken. Since June, each month has been the hottest on record when compared to the prior year's comparable month. On average, in 2023 the planet was 1.48 degrees Celsius warmer than in the 1850-1900 pre-industrial period, when humans began burning fossil fuels on an industrial scale, pumping carbon dioxide into the atmosphere.



India's Retail Inflation Reaches 4-Month High At 5.69% In December :-

In December, India's headline retail inflation rate rose to a four-month high of 5.69 percent, according to figures issued by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation. The latest CPI inflation rate of 5.69 percent is lower than expected, with economists predicting a 5.9 percent year-on-year increase in

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December. While headline retail inflation rose again in December - it has now spent 51 consecutive months above the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) medium-term target of 4 percent - it has undershot forecasts for the second month running, ensuring that it has been lower than the Indian central bank's forecast of 5.6 percent for October-December.



India's Outward FDI Plummeted To \$2.25 Billion In December 2023: RBI Data :-

India's outward foreign direct investment (OFDI) commitments fell sharply from more than \$4.12 billion in December 2022 to \$2.25 billion in December 2023, according to Reserve Bank of India data. Sequentially, they were down from \$4 billion in November 2023, according to RBI data. OFDI is a business strategy in which a domestic company expands operations into a foreign country. It involves acquiring assets in another country, often through the establishment of foreign subsidiaries, branches, or ownership stakes in foreign enterprises.



Wholesale Price Index (WPI) Inflation Hits Nine-Month High At 0.73% In December 2023 :-

In December, India's wholesale pricing index (WPI) inflation increased to a nine-month high of 0.73% from 0.26% the previous month, primarily to rising food prices,

according to commerce ministry data. The December print was also boosted by the fading high base effect, which had kept WPI deflationary in the first seven months of FY24. On a month-on-month basis, the overall index declined 0.9% in December, at the steepest pace in four months. With the current print, WPI inflation has averaged (-)1.07% in April-December FY24 as against 11.69% in the comparable period of FY23.



US Leads 2024 Military Rankings, India Fourth :-

The United States possesses the world's most powerful military, with Russia and China ranking second and third, respectively. According to Global Firepower, a website that tracks worldwide defence information, India ranks fourth. Global Firepower's Military Strength Rankings for 2024 evaluate 145 countries based on more than 60 criteria, including troop numbers, military equipment, financial stability, geographic location, and accessible resources. These factors together determine a PowerIndex score, where lower scores indicate stronger military capabilities.



TCS Ranked Second Most Valuable IT Brand In Global List :-

Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), the country's largest IT services company, has been named the world's second most valuable IT services brand in Brand Finance's 2024

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Global 500 IT Services Ranking. Over the past few decades, TCS has made considerable expenditures to develop its brand's global footprint. These include increasing its visibility at important industry and business conferences, internet channels, and social media, as well as improving its leadership status in industry analyst reports. Accenture's brand value grew to \$40.5 billion and it tops the most-valued IT services brands list.



Apple Surpasses Samsung As Top Smartphone Maker For The First Time Since 2010 :-

Apple Inc.'s iPhone dethroned Samsung Electronics COE R S I devices to become the best-selling smartphone series in 2023, marking the first time South Korea's largest firm has lost the top rank since 2010. According to IDC, the iPhone accounted for around one-fifth of the global market last year, with nearly 235 million shipments. Samsung, whose shipments fell by double-digits to 226.6 million, finished second, ahead of Chinese device makers such as Xiaomi Corp. Apple benefited from aggressive offers that have enticed a shift toward premium devices.



Four DISCOMs Secured A+ Rating In The Latest CSRD Report For Exceptional Consumer Service :-

Four electricity distribution companies (DISCOMs) in Delhi and Uttar Pradesh received the coveted A+ rating in the recent Consumer Service Rating of Discoms (CSRD) report. The study, released by Power Minister RK Singh, monitors the functioning of DISCOMs across the country and seeks to increase their accountability to consumers. "Out of the 62 DISCOMs evaluated, Delhi emerged as the frontrunner, with three companies securing the top rating: BSES Rajdhani Power Limited (BRPL), BSES Yamuna Power Limited (BYPL), and Tata Power Delhi Distribution Limited (TPDDL), "Office of union Minister RK Singh posted on X.



Indian Equity Market Surpasses Hong Kong, Ranks 4th Globally With \$4.33 Trillion Market Cap :-

According to Bloomberg data, India's stock market has overtaken Hong Kong's for the first time, with the total value of shares listed on Indian exchanges hitting \$4.33 trillion as of 22 January close, compared to \$4.29 trillion in Hong Kong. This ranks India as the world's fourthlargest equities market. Indian shares are soaring, fueled by an increasing number of retail investors and strong corporate results. India presents itself as a viable alternative to China, attracting global capital and companies due to its stable political environment and a consumption-driven economy among the fastestgrowing globally, according to the report.



Bhopal Ranks 5th In Swachh Survekshan 2023 Cleanliness :-

The dedicated efforts of the Bhopal Municipal Corporation have had a significant influence on Swachh Survekshan-2023. Moving up from sixth place in 2022, Bhopal is currently the fifth cleanest city among cities with a population of more than one lakh. Bhopal has also received a 5-star Garbage Free City (GFC) designation, making it the cleanest state capital in the country. The city produces 850 tons of waste daily, and the entire waste stream is processed every day. Bhopal's ascent in recent years can be attributed to its adoption of best practices, innovation, and distinctiveness.



Direct Tax-To-GDP Ratio Hits 15 -Year High In FY23: CBDT Report :-

In FY23, the government's direct tax-to-GDP ratio reached a 15-year high of 6.11%, according to figures from the Central Board of Direct Taxes. The Centre's direct tax receipts increased by 17.8% year on year to Rs 16.6 trillion in FY23. Corporate tax collections for the year were Rs 8.26 trillion, up 16% from the previous year, while income tax receipts were Rs 8.33 trillion, up 19.6%. Direct tax buoyancy — rate of growth of tax mop-up in comparison to nominal GDP growth–, however, stood at 1.2 in FY23 as compared to 2.5 in FY22.



India to become a \$7 trillion economy by 2030: Finance ministry report :-

The Indian economy is expected to grow at a rate above 7% in the coming years, owing to the strength of its financial sector and other recent and future structural reforms, and can aspire to become a \$7 trillion economy by 2030, according to the Union Finance Ministry in a report titled 'Indian Economy -- A Review' released on January 29th, just days before presenting the interim Budget for 2024-25 in Parliament on February 1st. The full Budget for FY25 is expected to be presented after the 2024 general elections in July as an interim Budget is only a Vote on Account, presented in an election year to cover expenditure for a brief period to keep the government functioning.

Shanghai's NDB Commits \$500 Million Loan For Gujarat's Infrastructure Development :-

The New Development Bank (NDB), headquartered in Shanghai, has agreed to provide a \$500 million loan to the Gujarat government. As part of the Vibrant Gujarat Summit, the state's Mukhayamantri Gram Sadak Yojana will receive a project financing. The NDB and the Gujarat government reached an agreement on this at the Gandhinagar summit. NDB will also provide knowledge support to strengthen the rural road network in the State by adopting new technology, safeguarding the environment and implementing safer road designs.



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PM Modi Releases First Instalment Of PM-JANMAN Scheme For Pucca Homes :-

On January 15, Prime Minister Narendra Modi released ₹540 crore, the first instalment of funding, for pucca homes under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Gramin (PMAY-G) to one lakh Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group (PVTG) beneficiary families as part of the recently launched PM-JANMAN package for the overall development of PVTG habitations. In the two months since the Prime Minister launched the scheme on November 15, the government said it had sanctioned projects worth over ₹4,700 crore through nine Ministries under the PM-JANMAN package, which includes the first instalment for PMAY(G) homes for one lakh beneficiaries.

The statement was made at an India Reception held on the margins of the WEF Annual Meeting, which was hosted by the peak industrial lobby CII and attended by Union Ministers Smriti Irani and Hardeep Singh Puri, as well as WEF Founder and Executive Chairman Klaus Schwab.



Edu Ministry bars admission of students below 16 years in coaching centres :-

According to new guidelines issued by the Ministry of Education, coaching centers cannot enroll students under the age of 16, make deceptive promises, or guarantee rank or good scores. The criteria for regulating coaching institutes have been developed to fulfill the requirement for a legal framework while also managing the unregulated proliferation of private coaching facilities. It comes following complaints received by the government about rising cases of student suicides, fire

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incidents, lack of facilities in coaching incidents as well as methodologies of teaching adopted by them.



PM Initiates 8 AMRUT Projects Worth Rs. 2,000 Crores In Solapur, Maharashtra :-

Prime Minister Narendra Modi recently laid the groundwork for eight AMRUT projects in Solapur, Maharashtra, and dedicated more than 90,000 finished residences under PMAY-Urban, marking a momentous day. The Prime Minister dedicated over 90,000 residences built under PMAY-Urban in Maharashtra, giving thousands of families a feeling of security and stability. The inauguration of 15,000 houses in the Raynagar Housing Society, Solapur, is particularly noteworthy, benefitting handloom workers, vendors, power loom workers, rag pickers, Bidi workers, drivers, and others.

ISRO's first mission of 2024, XPoSat, to be launched on January 1 :-

The Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) will kick off the year 2024 on January 1, Monday, with the launch of XPoSat (X-ray Polarimeter Satellite). It is India's first XPoSat, with the goal of studying the polarization of powerful X-Ray sources and the mysterious world of black holes. The PSLV Orbital Experimental Module-3 experiment will be carried out with the goal of delivering ten specified payloads supplied by ISRO and IN-SPACe. This will be done after a successful 2023 where the research organisation created history with the successful launch of Chandrayaan-3 followed by the first solar mission - Aditya-L1.



PM Modi lauds ISRO scientists after XPoSat launch:-

Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) scientists on the successful launch of the inaugural X-Ray satellite 'XPoSat' on January 1, 2024, the first day of the New Year. The space agency launched the X-ray Polarimeter Satellite (XPoSat) at 9:10 a.m. from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh, in its first space mission of 2024. Raman Research Institute made the primary payload of the satellite, and the second payload was made by the Astronomy Group of URSC (U R Rao Satellite Centre).



ISRO Tests Fuel Cell On PSLV-C58'S POEM3 Platform Successfully :-

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) successfully tested a 100 W class Polymer Electrolyte Membrane Fuel Cell based Power System (FCPS) in its POEM3 orbital platform, which was launched onboard PSLV-C58 on January 1, 2024. According to the ISRO, the experiment's goal was to evaluate Polymer Electrolyte Membrane Fuel cell operation in space and collect data to aid in the design of systems for future flights. The space agency added that hydrogen fuel cells produce electricity directly from Hydrogen and Oxygen gases, along with pure water and heat.

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IIT Madras Researchers Engineered Plant Cells To Produce Drug For Cancer :-

Researchers at the Indian Institutes of Technology Madras and Mandi metabolically engineered plant cells to produce more of the anti-cancer medication camptothecin (CPT). Nathapodytes nimmoniana, a native and endangered plant, is used in the production of allopathic medication. It takes roughly 1,000 tonnes of plant material to extract one tonne of CPT. The International Union for Conservation of Nature has redlisted the plant as in the past decade alone there has been a 20% decline in the plant's population.



Google DeepMind Introduces Mobile ALOHA Humanoid Technology :-

Researchers from Google DeepMind and Stanford University have announced Mobile ALOHA, a low-cost open-source hardware system for bimanual teleoperation. It is a humanoid robot that can be controlled remotely by a user and act autonomously using imitation learning. ALOHA is a lightweight robot that walks at a human speed of 1.42 metres per second and can carry up to 100 kilogrammes. Both the hardware and machine-learning algorithm of ALOHA are opensourced. The whole system costs less than \$20,000 with off-the-shelf robots and 3D-printed components.



U.S. Launches Peregrine-1 Lander To Moon In Historic Lunar Mission :-

A spacecraft constructed by a commercial US corporation and carrying a slew of NASA scientific instruments lifted off from Florida, hoping to become the first US spacecraft to land on the Moon in more than 50 years. The Peregrine lander module of the project, as Twell as the Vulcan rocket that launched it, were constructed by private space businesses in the United States. The Mission is part of NASA's Commercial Lunar Payload Services (CLPS) initiative that seeks to involve private space sector in its ambitious Artemis programme that is planning a return to the Moon in a big way.



Ancient Tools Found In Telangana's Mulugu District :-Paleolithic tools, including a stone axe, were discovered in a stream near Gurrevula and Bhupathipuram villages in Telangana's Mulugu district. Charitra Brundam, a history enthusiast from Kotha Telangana, stated that scientists have proven that the tool dates back to the early Stone Age. A stone axe measuring 15.5cm long, 11cm wide, and 5.5cm thick was discovered. Paleolithic

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Age is also known as Paleolithic Age or Old Stone Age or early Stone Age. It dates back to 33 lakh years BC. It lasted for 10,000 years, International paleontologist Ravi Korisettar of Karnataka said.



China Deploys 'Einstein Probe,' A Lotus-Shaped Satellite, To Monitor Cosmic Turbulence :-

China has launched a new astronomical satellite fashioned like a lotus into orbit to investigate unexplained transitory phenomena in the universe that flicker like fireworks. Einstein Probe (EP), a satellite that uses innovative X-ray detection technology inspired by the operation of a lobster eye, was launched by a Long March-2C carrier rocket from the Xichang Satellite Launch Centre in southwest China's Sichuan Province. Weighing about 1.45 tonnes and as large as a full-size SUV, the satellite is shaped like a lotus in full bloom and features 12 petals and two stamens, state-run Xinhua news agency reported. Contries, according



Mitsubishi Heavy Launches H-IIA Rocket Carrying Japan's Spy Satellite :-

Mitsubishi Heavy Industries claimed in a social media X post that an H-IIA rocket carrying the Japanese government's Information-Gathering Satellite "Optical8" was launched. It was the 48th launch of Japan's flagship launch vehicle since 2001, increasing the rocket's success rating to 97.92% developed by Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA). Japan plans to retire H-IIA after two more launches and replace it with H3, but has been struggling with the transition after JAXA's first test launch failed in March last year. The H3's second test launch is slated for Feb. 15.



Oxford Scientists Initiates First Human Trials For Nipah Virus Vaccine :-

Scientists at the University of Oxford in the United Kingdom have begun first-in-human vaccine trials for the deadly Nipah virus, which affects numerous Asian countries, including India. The Oxford Vaccine Group will lead the trials for the ChAdOx1 NipahB vaccine, which will include 51 persons aged 18 to 55. Nipah virus is a severe disease that can be fatal in approximately 75% of cases, according to the researchers. Outbreaks have occurred in countries in Asia, including Singapore, Malaysia, Bangladesh and India, with a recent one in Kerala in September last year, they said.



Pixxel Inaugurates MegaPixxel: A State-Of-The-Art Satellite Manufacturing Facility In Bengaluru :-

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Pixxel, a space data firm recognized for its cutting-edge hyperspectral earth imaging technology, has opened its first spacecraft manufacturing facility, MegaPixxel, in Bengaluru. This cutting-edge facility, spanning more than 30,000 square feet, is intended to speed the satellite manufacturing process from idea to launch readiness. The MegaPixxel facility will handle spacecraft assembly, integration, and testing (AIT), allowing Pixxel's satellites to be built, integrated, and tested for the rigors of launch before being delivered to their separate launch sites.



China's Betavolt Unveils Groundbreaking Nuclear Battery: 50 Years Of Maintenance-Free Power Generation :-

Betavolt, a Chinese business, has revealed the development of a revolutionary battery that can power cellphones for up to 50 years without needing to be recharged. This nuclear battery, dubbed the world's first miniature atomic energy system, uses 63 radioactive isotopes that are compactly organized within a module smaller than a coin. The technology operates by converting the energy released from decaying isotopes into electricity, a concept initially explored in the 20th century and now realized by Betavolt.



Japan's Lunar Ambition: Smart Lander Mission Set For Success On January 20 :-

Japan is about to join a select group of nations that have successfully landed on the Moon. The Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency's (JAXA) Smart Lander for Investigating Moon (SLIM) is slated to land on the moon on January 20, 2024. SLIM, which was launched on September 6, 2023, aboard an H-IIA rocket, offers a huge leap forward in lunar exploration technology. The mission aims to demonstrate highly accurate landings, a capability that will enhance the science value of future lunar missions.



SpaceX Launches Ax-3 Mission To ISS With First Turkish Astronaut Onboard :-

In a historic moment, SpaceX successfully launched the Ax-3 mission to the International Space Station (ISS) from NASA's Kennedy Space Center. The Crew Dragon capsule, called "Freedom," was launched into orbit on a Falcon 9 rocket, marking Axiom orbit's third mission. The Ax-3 mission, directed by veteran NASA astronaut Michael López-Alegría, includes a diverse crew. Alongside mission pilot Walter Villadei and European Space Agency astronaut Marcus Wandt, it includes Alper Gezeravcı, Turkey's inaugural astronaut.



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Bhavish Aggarwal's AI startup Krutrim becomes India's first unicorn in 2024 :-

The Ola founder Bhavish Aggarwal's artificial intelligence startup Krutrim has raised \$50 million in funding at a \$1 billion valuation. Krutrim IS now India's first AI startup to reach unicorn status. The investors in Krutrim's latest funding round include Matrix Partners India. Interestingly, Krutrim has hit a billion-dollar valuation just a month after its debut as a large language AI model. Krutrim, which means "artificial" in Sanskrit, is also in the process of developing data centres across the country, aiming to create a supercomputer ecosystem for AI development in India.



ISRO adds another feather to its cap with POEM-3 success :-

The Indian Space Research Organisation has successfully completed all of the tests planned for its orbital platform, which was launched recently by the PSLV-C58 mission. The space agency is currently planning to make a controlled re-entry into Earth's atmosphere within the





next 75 days, ensuring that no space debris remains behind. After placing X-Ray Polarimeter Satellite into an orbit of 650km with 6-degree inclination, ISRO lowered the launch vehicle's fourth spent stage. It was used as a platform for onboard experiments.



ISRO To Launch INSAT-3DS Satellite From Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh :-

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) announced that the INSAT-3DS satellite has been flagged UNIVERSIT off to the launch port at the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota. The INSAT-3DS satellite is a unique meteorological satellite developed by ISRO with the primary goal of providing continuity of services to the existing in-orbit INSAT-3D and 3DR satellites while greatly increasing the INSAT system's capabilities. The satellite is likely to be launched onboard the GSLV F14 next month. ISRO said that the satellite had successfully completed satellite assembly, integration and testing activities at U.R. Rao Satellite Centre, Bengaluru.

Indian Teenager Anahat Singh Bags Girls' U-19 2023 Scottish Junior Open Title At Edinburgh :-

Anahat Singh, a budding star in Indian squash, won the girls' under-19 division at the 2023 Scottish Junior Open squash in Edinburgh in a brilliant display of ability and commitment. Anahat Singh demonstrated her squash court domination with a dominant performance in the final against home favorite Robyn McAlpine. The young talent claimed victory with a decisive scoreline of 11-6, 11-1, 11-5, leaving no room for doubt about her
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supremacy in the girls' under-19 division. The Delhibased player had earlier clinched both the under-19 and senior National championships.



Oman To Host FIH Hockey5s World Cup Qualifiers :-Oman is about to unveil its latest sporting marvel: a cutting-edge building built to host the FIH Hockey5s World Cup qualifiers. This magnificent facility demonstrates Oman's commitment to nurturing excellence in sports, notably in hockey. This cutting-edge stadium will host heated combat between Nelite R SIT mixed doubles match. With the score equal at 1-1 after international teams from January 15 to 21, 2024. With the world's eyes on Oman, players will battle it out on the field, showcasing their skills and determination to secure a place in the prestigious Summer 2024 Olympic Games in Paris.



Raghuram Iyer Appointed As CEO Of Indian Olympic **Association :-**

The Indian Olympic Association has selected Raghuram lyer as Chief Executive Officer, according to a news release. The lack of a CEO was highlighted by International Olympic Committee (IOC) chairman Thomas Bach during his visit to Mumbai for the IOC Session a few months ago. "His wealth of experience and proven track record in sports management and administration makes him an ideal candidate to lead the IOA in its mission to promote and develop Olympic sports in India," the IOA said in a statement.



Alexander Zverev-Led Germany Defeats Swiatek's Poland In United Cup :-

Germany defeated top seeded Poland to win the United Cup, with Alexander Zverev and Laura Siegemund defeating Hubert Hurkacz and Iga Swiatek in the deciding Swiatek and Zverev won their singles bouts, the Germans won the doubles match 6-4, 5-7, 10-4. Germany had a relatively poor group stage and just about qualified for the knockouts, but Zverev and Siegemund formed a formidable pair to rescue their side by winning three deciders in as many days to lead their team to the title.



Rhythm Sangwan Clinches 16th Olympic Quota For 2024 Paris Games :-

Rhythm Sangwan made history as the 16th Indian shooter to clinch a quota spot at the 2024 Paris Olympics. She accomplished this milestone by winning a bronze medal in the 25m sports pistol category at the Asian Olympic Qualifications in Jakarta. This accomplishment means that India will send its largest-ever shooting

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contingent to the Paris Olympics, surpassing the previous record of 15 shooters set at the Tokyo Olympics in 2020. Jakarta has proven to be a favorable venue for Indian shooters, with three athletes — Esha Singh, Varun Tomar (both in 10m air pistol), and now Rhythm—securing quota slots for the country during the Asian Olympic Qualifiers.



Tim Southee Achieves Historic Milestone In T20 Internationals :-

Tim Southee, a veteran New Zealand pacer, attained the milestone when he dismissed Abbas Afridi in his 150th T20I match wicket. Bangladesh all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan (140) is second, followed by Afghanistan spinner Rashid Khan (130) and Kiwi spinner Ish Sodhi (127). Southee made his T20I debut in 2008 and now has 746 international wickets, including over 350 in the Test format. In the match against Pakistan, Southee showcased his skills by dismissing Mohammad Rizwan, Iftikhar Ahmed, Abbas, and Haris Rauf during Pakistan's chase of 227.



Madhya Pradesh Clinches Overall Championship In Inaugural Diu Beach Games 2024:-

Madhya Pradesh won the inaugural Beach Games 2024, which took place on Diu's pristine blue flag-certified Ghoghla beach. The landlocked state won an incredible 18 medals, including 7 golds, demonstrating the depth of talent within its delegation. The competition had 1404 teenage athletes from 28 states and Union Territories competing in a variety of disciplines. Maharashtra clinched 14 medals, including 3 golds, while Tamil Nadu, Uttarkhand, and hosts Dadra, Nagar Haveli, Diu & Daman secured 12 medals each.



Sue Redfern: ICC's First Female Neutral Umpire In Bilateral Series :-

Sue Redfern of England will become the first ICCappointed female neutral umpire to take part in a bilateral series, the upcoming WT20I against Australia and South Africa. Redfern's appointment comes after the International Cricket Council (ICC) decided to appoint one neutral umpire for all ICC Women's Championship series and any T20I matches scheduled with them, ensuring some neutrality in running matches while also considering the long-term development of female umpires. Seven female neutral umpires will officiate across ICC Women's Championship series with matchday pay on par with those on the ICC Elite Panel of Umpires.

Wrestler Ravi Kumar Dahiya Claims Bronze At France's Grand Prix :-

Ravi Kumar Dahiya, the Tokyo Olympic silver medalist who missed the entire 2023 international season owing to injury, returned won a bronze medal at the Grand Prix De France Henri Deglane 2024 wrestling event in Nice, France. The Indian star wrestler defeated Kazakhstan's Kairat Amirtayev 10-4 in the men's 61kg freestyle bronze medal battle. Dahiya trailed 2-4 in the first minute but used his experience to clinch the contest convincingly. Ravi Kumar Dahiya last competed on the international stage at the 2022 World Wrestling Championships.



ICC Announced The Men's And Women's T20I Teams Of The Year For 2023 :-

The Men's ODI Team of the Year predominantly features eight players from the final of the ICC ODI World Cup 2023. Six players from the Indian Cricket team and two players from the Australian Cricket team find themselves in the ICC's ODI team of the year. The ICC Men's T20I Team of the Year 2023 included four players from the Indian cricket team - Yashasvi Jaiswal, Suryakumar Yadav, Ravi Bishnoi and Arshdeep Singh. Suryakumar Yadav was also adjudged as the captain of the ICC Men's T20I Team of the Year 2023.



Raiza Dhillon and Gurjoat Khangura Win Bronze in Skeet Mixed Team in Asia Olympic Shotgun Qualifiers :-

Young Raiza Dhillon, who secured India's Paris Olympics quota, teamed up with Gurjoat Khangura to win bronze in the skeet mixed team event and her third medal in the Asia Olympic Qualification Shotgun competition. In the second bronze medal match, the Indian pair defeated local favourites Abdullah Alrashidi and Eman Al Shama 41-39. The 19-year-old Raiza had won a silver and a Paris Olympic berth in the women's skeet individual event, as did Anantjeet Singh Naruka in men's skeet.



ICC Awards 2023: Rohit Sharma Named Captain Of ICC ODI Team Of The Year :-

India skipper Rohit Sharma has been picked as the captain of ICC Men's ODI Team of the Year 2023, which

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comprises Men in Blue players like batting lynchpin Virat Kohli, batter Shubman Gill, top pacers Mohammed Siraj, Mohammed Shami and spinner Kuldeep Yadav. The playing XI is likewise dominated by Australian players who performed admirably during the ODI World Cup. In 2023, Rohit's remarkable performance resulted in 1255 runs at an average of 52. His exceptional form extended to the ODI World Cup, where he played a pivotal role at the top of the order.



Rohan Bopanna won the Men's Doubles Title at the Australian Open:-

Indian tennis sensation Rohan Bopanna has scripted history by becoming the oldest man to win a grand slam after clinching the Australian Open 2024 men's doubles title, pairing with Matthew Ebden. Bopanna, who turns 44 in March this year, also unlocked a new milestone by becoming the oldest World Number One in men's doubles history by winning the title in Melbourne on Saturday, thereby making India proud. This triumph happened to be their maiden title as a pair and Bopanna's first in men's doubles after 60 previous Grand Slams.



Sports Ministry Approves Avinash Sable and Parul Choudhary's Training in USA :-

On January 29, the Sports Ministry approved the request of Asian Games medalist long distance runners Avinash Sable and Parul Choudhary to train in Colorado, USA. The government also approved training stays for wrestlers Anshu Malik and Sarita Mor in Japan and the United States, respectively. While national record holders Sable and Choudhary will train at high altitude centre at Colorado Springs under coach Scott Simmons, Mor will head to United States Olympic/Paralympic Training Center (USOPTC), which is a training base of several top grapplers, including a few Olympic medallists.

ISSF WORLD CUP Cairo Egypt 2024



Sonam Maskar Wins Silver In Women's Air Rifle In Cairo, Egypt:-

Sonam, competing in her first World Cup, finished 0.9 behind Germany's Anna Janssen at the Egypt International Olympic City Shooting range with a score of 252.1 in the eight-woman final. Aneta Stankiewicz of Poland won bronze. In the men's event, Divyansh Singh Panwar had previously won gold by setting a world record in the final. In other results, debutant Simranpreet Kaur Brar finished a creditable fifth in the women's 25m pistol event. Two other Indians in the fray could not make it to the top eight as Rhythm Sangwan shot 582 to finish ninth and Manu Bhaker ended 14th with a score of 580.

Jharkhand government reduced the qualifying age for old-age pension for tribals and Dalits to 50 years :-Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren announced plans to reduce the age restriction for old-age pensions for SCs, STs, and OBCs from 60 to 50. The state now gives a Rs 1,000 monthly pension to senior persons and intends to lower the age limit to assist Adivasi and Dalit beneficiaries. Soren also presented letters to lab technicians, trained graduate teachers and health department personnel, and launched infrastructure projects worth Rs 4,500 crore. The government will be hiring cooks for colleges and universities to provide meals for students in far-flung areas.



Gujarat Sets Guinness Record In Mass Surya Namaskar On January 1, a Guinness World Record was set in Gujarat when more than 50,000 individuals performed the Surya Namaskar simultaneously at 108 locations, even as Prime Minister Narendra Modi praised the performance, adding that Gujarat "welcomed 2024 with a remarkable feat." Gujarat's name was entered into the Guinness World Records on the first day of 2024 for the biggest number of persons conducting Surya Namaskar simultaneously at 108 places, according to the state administration.



PM Modi Launches Projects Worth Rs 20,000 Crore In Tamil Nadu:-

In Tamil Nadu's Tiruchirappalli, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated and lay the foundation stones for multiple development projects totaling over Rs 20,000 crore in the aviation, rail, road, oil and gas, shipping, and higher education sectors. He also dedicated the new Tiruchirappalli International Airport terminal building. The two-level terminal building has been developed at a cost of over Rs 1100 crore. It has the capacity to serve more than 44 lakh passengers annually and about 3,500 during peak hours.



Czech PM To Be Chief Guest At Vibrant Gujarat Summit Petr Fiala, Prime Minister of the Czech Republic, is slated to be the Guest of Honor at the 10th Vibrant Gujarat Global Investors Summit, which will be held in Gandhinagar from January 10 to 12. PM Fiala will be

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joined by Timor-Leste President José Ramos-Horta, United Arab Emirates (UAE) President Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, and Mozambique President Filipe Nyusi. The Prime Minister will open the event on January 10th in Gandhinagar. Czech PM Andrew Babis attended the last summit in 2019.



PM Inaugurates Rs 400 Crore Fast Reactor Plant In Tamil Nadu :-

Prime Minister Narendra Modi commemorated a historic occasion by dedicating to the country the Rs 400 crore Demonstration Fast Reactor Fuel Reprocessing Plant (DFRP) at the Indira Gandhi Centre for Atomic Research (IGCAR), Kalpakkam. The Kalpakkam-based fast reactor power generation business, Bharatiya Nabhikiya Vidyut Nigam Ltd (BHAVINI), is at the forefront of this endeavor. BHAVINI is currently setting up the PFBR and has plans for two additional fast reactors in the future. The DFRP, a pilot project for larger facilities, plays a vital role in reprocessing fuel from the upcoming PFBRs.



Punjab Becomes First State To Map All Accident Prone Sites :-

Punjab Police has mapped all 784 accident black spots around the state on their navigation system Mappls App, in partnership with MapMyIndia. Punjab Police Chief Gaurav Yadav described it as "another road safety initiative" ahead of the introduction of the chief minister's showpiece project, "Sadak Suraksha Force." "Citizens navigating using Mappls App will now receive voice alerts in Punjabi alerting them about a black spot ahead, making Punjab the first state to map accidentprone sites as part of the road safety," he added.



Adidas To Set Up Its First Asia GCC Outside China In Tamil Nadu :-

According to individuals familiar with the developments, Adidas is establishing its first and only global capacity center (GCC) in Asia outside of China in Chennai, to focus on "key processes." The sports footwear and clothing behemoth's plan adds to the recent surge of multinationals investing heavily in India to establish GCCs to capitalize on the country's vast software capabilities. The German corporation headquartered in Herzogenaurach, Bavaria, will set up its Global Business Services (GBS) hub with Akhil Kapoor leading operations.



West Bengal Secures GI Tags For Unique Products, Boosting Local Economies :-

As part of the National GI Drive Mission, West Bengal has obtained Geographical Indication (GI) status for certain items, including Sundarban honey, Black Nunia rice from Jalpaiguri district, and Tangail, Gorod, and Kadiyal sarees.

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West Bengal Forest Development Corporation Limited (WBFDCL) has applied for an exclusive GI designation for Sunderban honey. WBFDCL had to compete with a Punebased company to win the case. This honey was collected by the 'Mouli' community from the Sunderban forest. WBFDCL collects and processes the honey and sells it with the brand name Mouban.



Vietnam To Invests \$2 Billion In Tamil Nadu EV Facility :-

VinFast, a Vietnamese electric vehicle (EV) manufacturer, announced plans to develop an integrated EV plant in the state, with a total expenditure of up to \$2 billion. According to a statement, the corporation has invested \$500 million for the first phase of the project, with a total outlay of five years from the start date. The company is signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Tamil Nadu state government to establish an EV manufacturing facility in Thoothukudi, which it says will grow into a first-class electric vehicle production hub in the region with an annual capacity of up to 150,000 units.



Naveen Patnaik Inaugurates Malkangiri Airport In Odisha :-

Naveen Patnaik, Chief Minister of Odisha, has opened the Malkangiri airport in the state's southwest. The airport, which covers an area of 233 acres, is located in Katelguda, Goudaguda panchayat. It cost Rs 70 crore to build and has a 1620-meter-long, 30-meter-wide runway, according to an official. This brings the state's total number of operational airports to seven. The other six are located in Bhubaneswar, Jharsuguda, Jeypore in Koraput, Utkela in Kalahandi, Rourkela in Sundergarh and Rangeilunda in Ganjam.



Maharashtra Government Declares New Atpadi Conservation Reserve In Sangli District:-

The Maharashtra government has designated a new conservation reserve, Atpadi Conservation Reserve, in the forest land of Sangli district. This newly established Conservation Reserve has three types of forest cover: semi-evergreen, moist deciduous, and dry deciduous. This area has 36 tree species, 116 herb species, 15 shrub species, 14 vine species, and one parasitic plant. The Atpadi Conservation Reserve will help preserve the habitat of wolves, jackal, deer, foxes, civets, rabbits and other mammals in the area.



'Yuva Nidhi' Scheme Launched For Jobless Youth In Shivamogga, Karnataka :-

Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar introduced the Yuva Nidhi initiative in Shivamogga, the Congress's fifth poll guarantee for educated unemployed young in Karnataka. Aside from

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their Cabinet colleagues, hundreds of residents and youths from Shivamogga and surrounding regions attended the ceremony. The scheme provides financial assistance to graduates and diploma holders who have yet to find work, but only for a maximum of two years. Training will be provided to the graduates and diploma holders who register themselves on the skill connect portal of the State Government.



MeitY Secretary Launches India's First Graphene Centre And IoT CoE In Kerala :-

MeitY Secretary S Krishnan has established a Centre of R S I Excellence (CoE) in Intelligent Internet of Things (IIoT) Sensors, as well as India's first graphene center, the India Innovation Centre for Graphene (IICG), in Kerala. The professionals from these agencies will develop a fully functional facility for R&D, incubation, innovation, skilling, capacity building, testing, and certification at these centers. The technical partners for establishing these facilities are Digital University Kerala (DUK) (previously IIITMK) and the Centre for Materials for Electronics Technology (CMET) in Thrissur.



Bihar CM Nitish Kumar reshuffles portfolios of 3 RJD ministers, Chandra Shekhar loses education ministry:-Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar reorganized his cabinet, reassigning three members from his alliance with the RJD. Chandra Shekhar, the minister of education, was appointed minister of sugarcane industries. According to an announcement, Alok Mehta, who formerly served as the state's minister of sugarcane industries, revenue, and land resources, was appointed as the new education minister. Lalit Kumar Yadav was given the Department of Revenue and Land Resources assignment. He will still be in charge of the Public Health and Engineering Department.



Maharashtra Secures Investments Of Rs 3.53 lakh crore At Davos :-

At the World Economic Forum Annual Meeting, the state administration received investment Memorandums of Understanding worth Rs 3.53 lakh crore (USD 44 billion). Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde declared that he is committed to seeing the state through to its ambitious goal of becoming a USD 1 trillion economy. A statement from the state stated that it has received an expression of interest for an additional investment of Rs 1 lakh crore, bringing the total to Rs 4.5 lakh crore (about USD 57 billion). This investment has the potential to create roughly two lakh jobs across various sectors, including electronics, IT, data centers, gems and jewelry, agriculture, automotive, and renewable energy.



Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy Inaugurates Five New Galleries At Salar Jung Museum In Hyderabad :-

G. Kishan Reddy, Union Culture and Tourism Minister, inaugurated five new galleries at the Salar Jung Museum in Hyderabad. Speaking at the event, the minister stated that Salar Jung Museum, one of India's most prominent museums, has made efforts to innovate and improve by reorganizing old galleries and introducing new ones from collections that have the potential to appeal to the public. The Indian Sculpture Gallery has some of the 40 sculptures dated back to the 2nd century B.C. like an 'Anantsayana Vishnu' from the Kakatiya period.



Telangana To Unveil Gruha Jyothi Scheme In February :-Revanth Reddy, the Chief Minister of Telangana, has made tremendous efforts to expedite the implementation of many social projects, notably the much-anticipated Gruha Jyothi Scheme. The state government intends to implement this initiative in the first week of February, providing relief to many households. As part of this program, every home with a Below Poverty Line (BPL) card will receive 200 units of free power beginning in February. For households with electricity consumption within the 200-unit threshold, there will be no electricity charges.



Indian Navy To Establish Second VLF Communication Station In Telangana :-

The Telangana government has transferred 1,174 hectares of forest land in the Dammaigudem forest region of Vikarabad district to the Indian Navy's Very Low Frequency (VLF) communication transmission station. According to the chief minister's office (CMO), the station will be finished in 2027. The Navy communicates with ships and submarines via VLF communication transmission facilities. The officials of Vikarabad DFO and Naval Command Agency signed the agreement for transfer of forest lands.



Odisha's CM Naveen Patnaik Announced World's First 'Black Tiger Safari' :-

Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik declared that the state will establish a melanistic tiger safari, the first of its type in the world. The safari would take place near the Similipal Tiger Reserve (STR) in Mayurbhanj, he said on X. "Tourists and visitors can now have a glimpse of the rare and majestic species found only in Odisha," he said. Melanistic tigers, often known as black tigers, have been spotted in Similipal National Park recently. These unusual animals are distinguished by a prominent dark stripe pattern on a lighter background of white or golden fur.



Odisha to have a melanistic tiger safari in Mayurbhanj:-

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Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has said Odisha will soon have a melanistic tiger safari near the Similipal Tiger Reserve in Mayurbhanj district. The NTCA in 2020 asked Odisha to start the melanistic tiger safari on the fringe of the tiger reserve. Odisha's Simlipal Tiger Reserve is the only tiger habitat in the world with melanistic tigers, which have broad black stripes running across their bodies which are thicker than those seen on normal tigers, so much so that their tawny skin colour is barely visible. The melanistic tiger safari will come up on around 200 hectares.

Mr. Billa stated that the summit would be organized in collaboration with the State Department of Industry. The IT Parks, Kerala Startup Mission, Digital University, and APJ Abdul Kalam Technological University would collaborate.



12th Divya Kala Mela 2023 is being held in Surat, Gujarat:-

The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India's Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) is organizing a unique event to showcase the products and workmanship of Divyang entrepreneurs and craftsmen from across the country. The festival, dubbed 'Divya Kala Mela,' is being held in Surat, Gujarat, from December 29, 2023 to January 7, 2024. Around 100 Divyang artisans, artists, and entrepreneurs from approximately 20 states and Union Territories will participate in the Surat event.

Switzerland To Host Ukraine Peace Summit On Zelenskiy's Request :-

Switzerland has agreed to hold a global peace summit on Ukraine at the invitation of Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky. Neutral Switzerland has already functioned as a conflict resolution broker, and it could now assist in resolving the war that began on February 24, 2022, when Russia launched troops into Ukraine. "At the request of the Ukrainian president, Switzerland has agreed to host a summit on the peace formula," the Swiss government said. "Further details are now being worked out."



External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar recently participated in the 19th Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) Summit, which began in Uganda. The two-day summit, themed 'Deepening Cooperation for Shared Global Affluence,' brings together more than 120 developing nations, marking a watershed point in history. India, as a leading and founding member of NAM, completely endorses Uganda's theme, confirming its dedication to the movement's principles and values. On the sidelines of the NAM Summit, EAM Jaishankar held meetings with counterparts from Egypt and Belarus.

- Mid-1980s–Late 1990s: Cities and slums started to be viewed as economic assets with the National Commission on Urbanization's 1985 report. During this time, interventions were motivated by economic considerations and the construction of infrastructure and housing policy.
- 4. 2000s–2014: Targeted plans were developed as a result of the 2001 Census, which produced extensive data about slums. Slums changed from being social issues to being commercial and technological objects. The main points of emphasis were property rights, legal rights, and upgrading tactics for slum inhabitants.

First Advance Estimates of India's GDP out



Introduction

- Growth Projection: According to the government's First Advance Estimates (FAEs), India's GDP is expected to rise by 7.3% in the fiscal year 2023–2024.
- Comparing This Year with Last: This rate is marginally greater than the growth of 7.2% observed in 2022–2023.

What is Gross Domestic Product (GDP)?

- Definition: GDP measures the entire monetary value created inside a nation's borders during a given period of time, usually a year.
- GDP is not the same as GNP, which is a measure of the total value of goods and services produced by the citizens of a nation, regardless of where those goods and services are produced.

First Advance Estimates of GDP

• Introduction and Timing: The First Advance Estimates (FAE), which were first released at the

start of January, were first implemented in the financial year 2016–17.

- Type of Estimates: Released before to the end of the fiscal year, they are the first official estimates of GDP growth for the year.
- Notably, official GDP data for the third quarter (October to December) is not included in the FAE. This data is issued with the Second Advance Estimates (SAE) at the end of February.

Significance of FAE

- Election Year Context: Although there won't be a formal Union Budget this year, the FAEs take on more importance given the impending Lok Sabha elections in April and May.
- Budgetary Relevance: Since the SAE are released after the budget is finalized, the FAE are essential to the Union Finance Ministry's budgetary planning for the upcoming fiscal year.
- Emphasis on Nominal GDP: When creating a budget, consideration should be given to the observable variable, or nominal GDP, which includes both its growth rate and absolute amount.
- Real GDP vs. Nominal GDP: Real GDP is a derived number that is adjusted for inflation, while nominal GDP is the starting point for all budget calculations.

GDP Growth Analysis

- Real GDP Growth: By March 2024, the real GDP (adjusted for inflation) is predicted to approach Rs 172 lakh crore.
- In contrast to Modi's Tenure: From the commencement of Prime Minister Modi's first term to the start of his second, the GDP increased from Rs 98 lakh crore to about Rs 140 lakh crore.
- Trends in Growth Rates: Compared to other estimates, the predicted 7.3% growth for 2023– 24 shows a robust economic recovery. On the other hand, Modi's second term has seen a discernible slowdown in growth in contrast to his first.

Introduction

- Echoes of the Past: According to the Tea Association of India (TAI), the issues affecting the tea business in India are reminiscent of the "dark phase" that lasted from 2002 to 2007.
- Principal Issues: A tendency toward less expensive teas, overstock, the imbalance between supply and demand, and stagnant prices are the main problems facing the sector.

Historical Context and Recent Developments

- Previous Crisis: From 2002 to 2007, the industry had a severe downturn as a result of regulatory obstacles, declining demand, competition from lower-cost international teas, and worries about export quality.
- Present Situation: In spite of India's economic achievements, the tea sector suffers from rising input costs and stagnating prices, which forces estate closures and increases need on subsidies.

Demand-Supply Imbalance and Quality Concerns

- Problems with overstock: The important issue of overstock causing an imbalance between availability and demand was brought up throughout the conference.
- Quality Decline: In an effort to lower prices, tea's quality has declined, causing a "race to the bottom."

Proposed Measures and Tea Board of India's Role

- Repositioning Tea: In order to improve tea's perception and consumption habits, TAI advises repositioning tea.
- Regulations: Actions include limiting the import of inferior teas, controlling the amount of tea waste sold domestically, and highlighting the health advantages of tea.
- Potential Effect: Import restrictions might eliminate an extra 30 million kg of inferior teas, while waste regulations could cut supply by 15– 20 million kg.

Tea Industry Statistics and Trends

 Production and Export: Between 2008 and 2022, India's tea output climbed by 39%; a little increase is anticipated in 2023. Nonetheless,

shipments through October 2023 were 2% lower than in 2022.

 Increase in Imports: In 2022, tea imports totaled 30 million kg, up from 27 million kg in 2021.

Overview of the Indian Tea Industry

- Global Status: With a sizeable domestic tea market, India is the world's fourth-largest exporter and the world's second-largest producer of tea.
- Employment and Regulation: The Tea Board of India regulates cultivation, and 1.16 million people are directly employed in the sector.
- Primary Growing Regions: The Northeast, which includes Assam, and north Bengal are important regions for the production of tea, with the Nilgiris in south India seeing substantial production as well.

Challenges and Issues

- Global Competition and Decline in Quality: India's market position has been impacted by competition from nations like Kenya as well as the demand for organic tea.
- Poor working conditions for tea workers and the difficulties small-scale tea growers face—such as problems with recognition and cost—are serious concerns.
- External Factors: The industry's issues have been made worse by international occurrences like the conflict between Russia and Ukraine.

Tea Board of India Initiatives

- Establishment: The Tea Board operates as a statutory entity within the Ministry of Commerce, having been established by the Tea Act of 1953. Every three years, the Board is reformed, with its headquarters situated in Kolkata.
- Promotional Activities: The Board funds participation in international fairs and launches a number of campaigns to raise awareness of packaged Indian tea.

- The Tea Development and Promotion Scheme is designed to improve worker welfare, productivity, quality, and market promotion.
- Assistance for Small Growers: To help small tea growers, the Board established FPOs, FPCs, and SHGs.

Way Forward

- The One District One Product (ODOP) initiative may aid in the marketing of Indian tea.

Direct Tax Collections cross 80% of 2023-24 target



Introduction

- With net direct tax collections of ₹14.7 lakh crore, or more than 80% of the target for the fiscal year, as of January 10, India has accomplished a noteworthy milestone.
- This performance shows a strong 19.4% gain over the same period in the previous fiscal year, demonstrating the effective tax administration and the nation's healthy economic recovery.

Overview of Tax Collection Performance

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- Total revenues: 80.61% of the budget estimates for the fiscal year 2023–24 were achieved with net direct tax revenues of ₹14.7 lakh crore.
- Growth Rate: Compared to net collections for the same period previous year, this indicates a 19.41% growth.
- Growth in Gross Collection: The amount collected in gross direct taxes increased by 16.77% to ₹17.18 lakh crore. This was attributed to a 26.11% increase in Personal Income Tax (PIT) and an 8.32% increase in Corporate Income Tax (CIT) inflows.

Detailed Analysis of Tax Collection

- Post-Refund Growth: Following the adjustment for refunds, there was a net growth of 12.37% in CIT collections and a 27.26% increase in PIT collections.
- Growth in PIT and STT Receipts: PIT and Securities Transaction Tax receipts increased by 27.22% after accounting for refunds.

What are Direct Taxes?

- A direct tax is a kind of tax in which the incidence and the impact are classified under the same heading.
- The organization or the individual pays the tax directly to the body that imposed the payment.
- No one else may receive payment of the tax; it must be made directly to the government.

Types of Direct Taxes

The various types of direct tax that are imposed in India are mentioned below:

(1) Income Tax:

- Income taxes are due based on an individual's age and wages.
- The Government of India establishes various tax slabs to determine the required amount of Income Tax.
- Income Tax Returns (ITR) are required to be filed by the taxpayer annually.
- Depending on their ITR, people can be eligible for a refund or might have to pay taxes. People who fail to file their ITRs face penalties.

(2) Wealth Tax:

- The yearly tax payment is contingent upon both the property's market value and ownership status.
- If someone possesses real estate, they are required to pay wealth tax regardless of whether the property brings in money or not.
- Wealth tax is a requirement for corporate taxpayers, Hindu Undivided Families (HUFs), and individuals based on their residential status.
- Assets such as gold deposit bonds, stock holdings, real estate, and commercial property rented for longer than 300 days are all excluded from wealth tax payment provided the real estate is owned for business or professional purposes.

(3) Estate Tax:

 It is also called Inheritance Tax and is paid based on the value of the estate or the money that an individual has left after his/her death.

(4) Corporate Tax:

- Domestic businesses must pay corporate tax, in addition to their shareholders.
- In India, foreign firms that generate revenue are also required to pay corporate tax.
- Dividends, royalties, interest, asset sales proceeds, and technical service fees are all taxed in India.
- The below-mentioned taxes are also included under Corporate Tax:
- Securities Transaction Tax (STT): Any income derived from taxable securities transactions is subject to this tax.
- Dividend Distribution Tax (DDT): DDT is imposed on domestic enterprises that declare, distribute, or receive any sums as dividends from their shareholders. However, international businesses are exempt from the DDT tax.
- 3. Fringe perks Tax: This tax is imposed on businesses that offer drivers, maids, and other employees fringe perks.

 Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT): MAT is imposed on zero-tax corporations whose accounts are prepared in accordance with the corporations Act.

(5) Capital Gains Tax:

- It is a type of direct tax that must be paid as a result of revenue received from investments or asset sales. Capital assets include investments in houses, farms, bonds, stocks, companies, and artwork.
- Tax can be divided into two categories: longterm and short-term, depending on how long it is held.
- Short-term gains are any assets—aside from securities—that are sold within 36 months of their acquisition.
- If any money is received from the sale of properties that have been owned for longer than 36 months, it is deducted from long-term assets.

Advantages of Direct Taxes

The main advantages of Direct Taxes in India are mentioned below:

- Economic and Social Equilibrium: The Indian government has implemented equitable tax rates based on an individual's age and wages. The nation's economic status is taken into consideration when determining the tax slabs. In order to balance out all income disparities, exemptions are also implemented.
- Productivity: The number of people working and contributing to the community grows along with the returns from direct taxation. As a result, direct taxes are thought to be very productive.
- Taxes are raised by the government to counteract inflation. Tax increases decrease demand for goods and services, which causes inflation to slow down.
- Certainty: Both the government and the taxpayer feel certain because direct taxes are in place. The taxpayer and the government are aware of the amount that needs to be paid and

the amount that needs to be collected, respectively.

 Equitable wealth distribution occurs when the government levies higher taxes on those people or entities who can afford them. The excess cash is utilized to support India's lower classes and impoverished people.

What are the disadvantages of direct taxes?

- Simple to get around: Not everyone is prepared to give their taxes to the government. To get around taxes, some people are prepared to file a fictitious income return. These people have no accountability to the law of the land, thus they may easily hide their money.
- Arbitrary: The Finance Minister sets taxes at random, if they are progressive. It places a great burden on the impoverished if it is proportionate.
- Disincentive: High taxes prevent people from saving or investing, which exacerbates the nation's economic problems. It damages industries and enterprises by preventing them from expanding.

- Formation: The main goal of KABIL's 2019 founding was to obtain vital minerals from foreign sources, such as cobalt and lithium.
- Ministry Oversight: NALCO, HCL, and MECL each receive 40% of KABIL's equity participation, whereas MECL is under the Ministry of Mines' jurisdiction.

Mission and Functions

- Strategic Mineral Security: Ensuring India's mineral security and achieving self-reliance in vital and strategic minerals is the main goal of KABIL. It locates and purchases foreign mineral resources, such as cobalt and lithium.
- Functions: In order to satisfy the nation's commercial needs, KABIL identifies, acquires, explores, develops, mines, and processes strategic minerals overseas.
- Exploration: It looks at many ways to find resources, such as through trade, partnerships with governments, smart acquisitions, and investments in mining and exploration equipment.
- Global Partnerships: By utilizing India's proficiency in mineral processing and exploration, KABIL builds business relationships with mineral-rich nations across the globe, including Australia, Africa, and South America.

Key Developments

• Argentina's Lithium Resources: With Chile, Bolivia, and Argentina, the three countries make up the "Lithium Triangle," which accounts for more than half of the world's lithium resources. With the third-largest lithium reserves, the second-largest lithium resources, and the fourthlargest production worldwide, Argentina stands out.

- Acquisition of Block: Exploration and Exclusivity Rights for five lithium brine blocks in Argentina have been acquired by KABIL, a state-owned company.
- Branch Office in Argentina: To further demonstrate its dedication to the initiative, KABIL is preparing to open a branch office in Catamarca, Argentina.

Significance of this acquisition

- Strategic Significance: India's move toward sustainable energy solutions depends critically on this ground-breaking project. Known as "white gold," lithium is essential for many uses, such as electric vehicles (EVs), mobile phone batteries, and energy storage systems.
- Minimizing Dependency on Imports: China accounts for a large amount of India's imports, which are used to meet the country's lithium requirements, which are estimated to be worth ₹24,000 crore.
- Unlocking Technical Expertise: The Union Minister for Mines emphasizes that this project delivers significant operational and technical knowledge in brine-type lithium exploration, exploitation, and extraction, in addition to meeting India's demands for lithium sourcing.

A magnitude 7.6 earthquake struck Japan's Ishikawa prefecture on Monday afternoon. It is the strongest earthquake to have hit the country's western coast in many decades. Large intensity earthquakes are more common along its eastern coast, close to the Japan Trench that runs along the boundary of the Pacific and North American tectonic plates.

On January 1, 2024, a 7.5-magnitude earthquake hit Ishikawa prefecture in Japan, triggering tsunami waves over a meter high.

Japan's Geographical Vulnerability

- One of the main causes of Japan's environmental and catastrophe management issues is its geographic fragility, especially with regard to plate tectonics.
- The nation is particularly vulnerable to seismic activity due to its placement at the meeting point of many major tectonic plates.

Here's a detailed look at how plate tectonics contribute to Japan's geographical vulnerability:

[1] Convergent Plate Boundaries:

 Pacific Ring of Fire: Japan is situated on the Pacific Ring of Fire, an area known for its frequent tectonic plate borders and intense seismic activity.

- Plates Involved: The Pacific Plate, the Philippine
 Sea Plate, the Eurasian Plate, and the North
 American Plate are the main tectonic plates
 interacting close to Japan.
- Subduction Zones: Underneath the Eurasian and North American plates are the Pacific and Philippine Sea plates. A major source of seismic activity, including strong earthquakes and volcanic eruptions, is this subduction process.

[2] Earthquake Activity:

- Regular Earthquakes: These earthquakes are caused by the movement of these plates. Every year, thousands of earthquakes, ranging in intensity from mild to devastating, strike Japan.
- Major Earthquakes: Japan's geological setting has the ability to cause enormous destruction and a high death toll. Past occurrences such as the Great East Japan Earthquake of 2011 and the Great Hanshin Earthquake of 1995 illustrate this.

[3] Tsunami Risk:

- Tsunami Formation: Tsunamis can be caused by earthquakes that occur beneath the sea or along the shore, which can move significant amounts of water. A strong underwater earthquake in 2011 sent up a tsunami that resulted in severe destruction and the Fukushima nuclear accident.
- Impact on the Coast: Because of its long coastline, Japan is especially susceptible to tsunamis, which can strike minutes after an earthquake beneath the surface and leave little time for evacuation.

[4] Volcanic Activity:

- Volcanic Eruptions: Significant volcanic activity is a result of the subduction of the Pacific and Philippine Sea plates, which also produces earthquakes. Volcanic eruptions result from the rising magma caused by the subducted plate melting.
- Over 100 active volcanoes can be found in Japan as a direct result of the country's geological

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setting. Eruptions can affect local economy and air transport, as well as endanger the communities in the vicinity.

[5] Geological Complexity:

- Intersecting Faults: When two or more tectonic plates collide, a complex network of faults is created that makes seismic activity more unpredictable and variable.
- Diverse Seismic Phenomena: Because of this complexity, there are many different types of seismic phenomena that can occur. For example, deep-focus earthquakes can occur at deeper depths and have wider effects.

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Experts and forest officials in West Bengal's Buxa National Park were encouraged when camera traps there produced pictures of a tiger. The tiger had been absent from the reserve for decades, as evidenced by the fact that the last sighting was 23 years prior to December 2021.

- Ambitious Goals: In 131 Indian cities, the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP) seeks to cut particulate matter concentrations by 40% by 2026.
- Variable Outcomes: Respirer Living Sciences and Climate Trends' investigation shows that

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different cities have made different amounts of progress, with very few of them reaching the desired reductions in PM 2.5 levels.

About National Clean Air Programme (NCAP)

Notable Pollution Increases: PM 2.5 levels have marginally decreased or increased in cities like Delhi, Navi Mumbai, Mumbai, Ujjain, Jaipur, Visakhapatnam, and Pune.

Success Stories and Regional Disparities

- Significant Reductions: PM 2.5 and PM 10 levels have significantly decreased in cities like Varanasi, Agra, and Jodhpur.
- Progress in Uttar Pradesh: With the exception of Jodhpur, most of the cities meeting the 2026 reduction targets are located in Uttar Pradesh.
- Pollution in the Indo-Gangetic Plain (IGP): Eighteen of the twenty most polluted cities are found in the IGP, which continues to be a hotspot for elevated PM 2.5 levels.

Factors Influencing Pollution Levels

- Annual Variations: The amount of pollution can vary greatly in a single year, peaking in winter in northern and eastern Indian cities.
 - Infrastructure for Monitoring Air Quality: The quantity and dispersion of continuous ambient air quality monitors have a major influence on the precision of pollution data.
 - Geographical and Meteorological Influences: The report notes that additional investigation is required to fully comprehend how location, meteorology, and emissions affect pollution levels.

NCAP's Progress and Future Outlook

- Notable Efforts: Although the NCAP has reduced pollution in some cities, its overall efficacy is yet unknown.
- Improved Monitoring: It is anticipated that the installation of more air quality monitoring stations will improve the picture of pollution levels and support mitigation measures.

Conclusion

 Persistent Pollution Challenges: Despite certain achievements, growing pollution levels are still a problem in many urban areas.

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- Commitment to Environmental Goals: India's dedication to challenging environmental goals is shown in the NCAP's updated aim.

Project Tiger and India's Conservation Landscape



Introduction

• Launch and Growth: Started in 1973, Project Tiger has transformed over time from an effort managed by the forest administration to a statutory category in 2006, turning into a worldwide conservation success story.

Tiger Reserve Expansion: India presently has 54 reserves spread over 18 states, accounting for 2.38% of the nation's total land area, up from nine reserves in 1973.

Tiger Population and Conservation Efforts

- Population Growth and Census Methods: With the switch from the pug-mark method to camera-trap techniques, there has been a notable increase in the number of tigers; threequarters of the world's tiger population currently resides in India.
- The Wildlife (Protection) Act (WLPA) of 1972 changed the rights of forest inhabitants and centralized control with the State government. It also established National Parks and Wildlife Sanctuaries.

Project Tiger's Transformation and Critical Tiger Habitats (CTH)

- Transitioning from a Centrally Sponsored Scheme to a CTH: Project Tiger's move to emphasize CTHs sought to give tiger-centric conservation top priority by enacting buffer areas surrounding CTHs.
- 2006 Amendment and Establishment of NTCA: The National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) and a tiger conservation strategy were established as a result of the WLPA amendment in 2006, however CTHs were not violated.

Forest Rights Act (FRA) 2006 and Its Implications

- Rights of Forest inhabitants Recognized: The Forest Rights Act (FRA) designated Gram Sabhas as the supreme authority for managing forests and acknowledged the rights of forest inhabitants, including those residing in Tiger Reserves.
- Critical Wildlife Habitat (CWH) Introduction: The FRA implemented CWH to prevent the diversion of notified areas for non-forestry uses.

Challenges in CTH Delineation and Legal Compliance

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- Hasty CTH Notifications: In 2007, 26 Tiger Reserves were not fully compliant with legal requirements as a result of a hurried process.
- Absence of Buffer Areas: Prior to the Supreme Court's intervention in 2012, the majority of CTHs were devoid of buffer areas.

Relocation and Rehabilitation Issues

- The legal framework for relocation is outlined by the WLPA and LARR Act 2013, which include standards for rehabilitation and particular compensation.
- Gaps in Implementation: Real-world relocation procedures frequently don't meet legal criteria, which results in a lackluster level of consent and pay.

Conflict between Tiger Conservation and Forest Dwellers' Rights

- Opposition to the Recognition of Forest Rights: Conflicts frequently arise in Tiger Reserves as a result of opposition to the recognition of the rights of forest inhabitants.
- The role of the NTCA and its legal challenges: The NTCA has occasionally infringed on the legal rights of forest inhabitants through its activities, such as interim prohibitions and obligations for wildlife clearance.

Conclusion

- The journey of India with Project Tiger emphasizes the necessity to strike a balance between the rights and livelihoods of forest inhabitants and the conservation of tigers.
- upcoming prospects: India must manage rising human-wildlife conflicts while maintaining sustainable conservation methods as tiger populations and sanctuaries expand.
- Evolution of Laws and Policies: The changing laws and policies pertaining to the conservation of tigers are a result of a dynamic process of adjustment to the ecological, social, and legal intricacies.

Madhya Pradesh's Ken-Betwa River Project



Introduction

 The Ken-Betwa river interlinking project, a significant initiative of the Madhya Pradesh government and part of the Centre's ambitious plan, has come under scrutiny.

Overview of the Project and Violations

- Project Details: Work on the Lower Orr dam, which is a component of the second phase of the Ken-Betwa river interlinking project, started in 2019.
- Breaking the Laws of Clearance: According to a 2022 expert appraisal committee (EAC) study, the project was started without official Environment Ministry approval.
- Unfinished Construction: According to the most recent report, approximately 82% of the dam and 33.5% of the network of canals had been finished without the required permissions.
- Recent Recommendations from the EAC: The EAC requested additional information and a new assessment in December 2023 regarding possible harm brought on by the construction.

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What is the Ken Betwa Link Project?

- First of its Kind: The National Perspective Plan's first attempt to connect Indian rivers is this initiative.
- River linking is the process of moving water between the Betwa and Ken rivers, which are both Yamuna tributaries.

Phases of the Project

- The Daudhan dam complex, the Ken-Betwa link canal, the High Level Tunnel, the Low Level Tunnel, and the Power houses are the Phase I components.
- Phase-II Components: The Lower Orr dam, the Bina complex project, and the Kotha barrage will all be built during this phase.

Utility of the Project

- Benefits of Irrigation: The project intends to irrigate 10.62 lakh hectares per year.
- Drinking Water Supply: An estimated 62 lakh individuals will have access to drinking water.
- Power Generation: 27 MW of solar power and 103 MW of hydropower will be produced by the project.
- Regional Development: By boosting employment and agricultural activity, it aims to provide socioeconomic prosperity to the Bundelkhand region.
- Fighting Rural Distress: The project is also seen to be a way to stop this area's distressed migration.

Ecological Issues with the Project

- Scientific Basis: Questions have been raised concerning the Ken River's water availability as well as the "surplus and deficit" paradigm.
- Disputes over Water Sharing: UP and MP have clashed over sharing water, particularly in non-monsoonal months.
- Environmental Impact: The downstream Ken Gharial Sanctuary will be impacted by the project's construction of a reservoir dam in the Panna National Park and Tiger Reserve.

 Compliance with the Wildlife Act: It is not yet established that the National Board for Wildlife has given its approval, as mandated by the Wildlife (Protection) Act of 1972.

Issues with the Projects

- Displacement: A large number of people will be displaced as a result of the project.
- Topographical Changes: Building dams in the Ganga basin is difficult due to its level terrain.
- Seismic and Inundation Hazards: In the Himalayan region, large-scale water transfer poses a risk of flooding forests and causing earthquakes.
- Financial and Political Difficulties: The project necessitates a significant outlay of funds as well as political backing.
- Ecological Feasibility and Land Acquisition: Reaching a consensus on ecological issues and land acquisition presents significant challenges.

Criticisms of Such Projects

- Dubious Science: Opponents claim that the foundation of these initiatives is out-of-date knowledge about water management.
- Natural processes are perceived as being violated by them, as they present more risks than opportunities.

Way Forward

- Expert Scrutiny: It is essential to conduct a thorough and impartial expert examination throughout the approval phase.
- Independent Hydrological Study: To evaluate the viability and impact, a thorough investigation of these rivers is required.

Conclusion

- Developmental initiatives such as the Ken-Betwa Link shouldn't jeopardize vital wildlife habitats or delicate ecosystems.
- In addition to legal compliance, the potentially detrimental effects on water flow and sanctuary ecosystems must be carefully evaluated and taken into account.

Pakke Paga Hornbill Festival

- This event, which takes place at Seijosa in the RST Pakke Kessang area on January 18–20, 2024, unites several communities in their attempts to preserve these unique birds and raise public awareness of environmental issues.

Pakke Paga Hornbill Festival

- The festival's theme is "Paga hum Domutoh, Domutoh Domutoh."
- Meaning: This year's theme, which translates to "Let Our Hornbills Remain" in Nyishi, emphasizes how vital it is to protect these amazing birds.
- Advocating for conservation: The PPHF provides a forum for promoting the preservation of hornbill populations and their native environments.

Emphasis on Wildlife Conservation

- Four species of hornbills may be found in the Pakke Tiger Reserve (PTR) in Arunachal Pradesh: the endangered Rufous-necked hornbill, the Great Indian, Oriental Pied, and the wreathed hornbill.
- The celebration honors the Nyishi, the biggest tribal group in Arunachal Pradesh, for their significant contribution to hornbill conservation.

They stopped hunting hornbills and started working to protect them instead.

 Alternative Income: To promote economic development and environmental preservation, PPHF seeks to create alternative revenue streams for the area and increase public knowledge of PTR and its surrounds.

INSAT 3D's Role in Monitoring Foggy Conditions in North India



Introduction

- The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has been sending out alerts and advisories to advise locals about the current situation as a huge portion of North India, including areas like Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Haryana, Delhi, and Punjab, struggle with intense fog.
- The purpose of this paper is to explain the science underlying these alerts and how the INSAT 3D satellite contributes vital data for fog monitoring.

Fog Situation in North India

- Persistent Fog: Since December 2023, a thick layer of fog has covered much of North India.
- IMD Warnings: On January 16, the IMD issued warnings about "very dense fog" in a number of

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states, including Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Chandigarh, Delhi, Punjab, and Uttar Pradesh. During the night and early morning, visibility is predicted to plummet below 50 meters.

Decoding Satellite Images

- Perspectives from INSAT 3D: Using imagery, the INSAT 3D satellite is essential for tracking cloudy situations.
- Solar reflectance and brightness temperature are the two elements that affect the colors in these pictures.
- The quantity of solar energy that a surface reflects in proportion to the energy it receives is known as its solar reflectance.
- Brightness Temperature: Connects the surface brightness of an item, measured at different wavelengths, to its temperature.

Day Microphysics Data

- Wavelengths of Solar Reflectance are Studied by INSAT 3D's "Day Microphysics" Component: Visible radiation at 0.5 μm, shortwave infrared radiation at 1.6 μm, and thermal infrared
 Fu
- Color Determination: The RGB (red, green, and blue) colors of the image are determined by the strength of signals at these wavelengths.
- Applications: Cloud kinds, thunderstorm stages, snow identification, and fire detection are all aided by these photographs.

Night Microphysics Data

- Complex Color Determination: Two colors are obtained from the difference between two thermal infrared signals by INSAT 3D's "night microphysics" component.
- Variables in Color: Green indicates a signal between 10.8 μm and 3.9 μm, blue indicates a signal between 10.8 μm and 3.9 μm, and red indicates the difference between 12 μm and 10 μm signals.

 Characterizing Features: Cloud types and their temperature variations can be identified with the help of night microphysics data.

Combining Day and Night Data

- Comprehensive Insights: Meteorologists watch the creation, evolution, and depletion of meteorological events, including cyclones, and investigate temperature changes and moisture droplets by combining day and night microphysics data.
- Applications for advanced warning systems include the one- to three-hour advance prediction of thunderstorms.

Radiometers and Sounders

- Satellite Instruments: INSAT 3D and 3DR assess spectral properties with radiometers and analyze water vapor, temperature, and humidity with atmospheric sounders.
 - Better Technology: Compared to their predecessors, these satellites offer notable advances in spectrum channels and spatial resolution, which strengthen India's capacity to monitor the weather.

Future with INSAT 3DS

- Further Developments: In February 2024, the Indian Space Research Organization intends to launch the INSAT 3DS meteorological satellite.
- Enhanced Capabilities: By expanding on the achievements of its predecessors, this satellite will help India monitor and warn about the weather.

Conclusion

- With its capacity to record and process microphysics data both during the day and at night, the INSAT 3D satellite is essential for tracking and forecasting weather patterns, particularly those involving fog in North India.
- Through a thorough comprehension of the complex science underlying these satellite photos, meteorologists are able to offer useful insights and timely warnings to safeguard public

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safety while navigating the difficulties presented by severe weather conditions.

- Timeline for Implementation: As reported on December 29, 2023, there is a one-month window beginning on February 1 to be used for the CAA's implementation prior to the next Budget Session.

Key Provisions of the CAA

 Facilitation of Citizenship: The CAA seeks to grant citizenship to undocumented immigrants who unlawfully entered India from six non-Muslim groups in Pakistan, Bangladesh, and Afghanistan.

- Communities Eligible: People from the following three nations who entered India on or before December 31, 2014, including Hindus, Sikhs, Buddhists, Parsis, Christians, and Jains, are eligible.
- Decreased Residency Requirement: The Act lowers the qualifying candidates' 11-year cumulative stay in India to six years.

Salient Features of the Act

- Definition of unlawful Migrants: Certain populations from Afghanistan, Bangladesh, and Pakistan are not considered unlawful migrants under the revised Citizenship Act of 1955.
- Naturalization or Citizenship by Registration: The Act amends the requirements for citizenship, lowering the period of residency to five years for certain localities.
 - Exemptions: The Bengal Eastern Frontier Regulation, 1873's "Inner Line" areas and the tribal regions of Assam, Meghalaya, Mizoram, and Tripura are exempt from the rules.
 - Cancellation of OCI Registration: The Act adds new reasons for OCIs (overseas citizens of India) to withdraw their registration.

Recent discussions over CAA

- 2011 UPA Government Decision: In 2010, the Long Term Visas (LTVs) were issued to Sikhs and Hindus from Pakistan who claimed to be victims of religious persecution by the Congress-led UPA administration.
- Legal Amendments: The government representative said that if necessary, legislation might be changed to extend the 2014 deadline.
- Indeterminate Recipient Numbers: It is unknown how many undocumented individuals in states

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like West Bengal and Assam will gain overall from the CAA.

- High Application Volume: There are currently almost 80,000 Pakistani Hindu applications outstanding, of whom 35,000 are from Rajasthan alone.
- Online Citizenship Process: District collectors and home secretaries have the authority to grant citizenship to applicants from the six communities, and this has been the case since 2018.

Challenges in the Online Process

- Problem with Pakistani Passports: Passports that have expired cannot be renewed by the Pakistan High Commission; instead, they must be renewed online.
- Visa and Citizenship Pathway: The majority of Sikhs and Hindus from Pakistan came to India on pilgrimage or long-term visas, which come before citizenship.

Conclusion

- Security and humanitarian concerns must be balanced: A delicate balance between satisfying refugee humanitarian needs and national security considerations is necessary for the CAA's implementation.
- Impact to be Expected: The announcement of the CAA regulations will signal a dramatic change in India's citizenship laws, with a special impact on refugees from nearby nations.
- Current Developments: A close eye will be kept on the effects on impacted communities and the legal environment as the government completes the CAA regulations.

Project 'Devika': North India's First River Rejuvenation nears completion



North India's first river rejuvenation project, 'Devika', is nearing completion and will soon be inaugurated by Prime Minister.

About Project 'Devika'

- Beginning: The project was initiated by the PM in February 2019 and is based on the "Namami Ganga" concept.
- Demand: The project, which has long been called for rehabilitation and rejuvenation, picked up steam after 2014, which was a big step forward for North Indian river revitalization initiatives.
- Project Execution: The LWM project's construction is being handled by J&K's Urban Environmental Engineering Department (UEED).
- Cultural Importance: The Devika River, especially in Udhampur, Jammu & Kashmir, is highly significant religiously, as it is considered the sister of the holy Ganges.

Key Features

- Liquid Waste Management (LWM): In order to preserve the river's holiness, a different LWM project that connects homes with a system of pipelines and manholes is being carried out.
- Solid Waste Management (SWM): Maintaining the river's holiness requires both LWM and SWM initiatives.
- Infrastructure Development: Three sewage treatment facilities, a 129.27 km sewerage network, the construction of cremation ghats, protective fence, landscaping, tiny hydropower and solar power plants, and protection fencing are also part of this project.

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Maharashtra approves option for Old Pension Scheme



The Maharashtra Cabinet has approved a proposal allowing certain state government employees to opt for the old pension scheme (OPS). The option is extended to employees who joined the service after November 1, 2005, based on recruitment advertisements issued before that date.

Transition in Pension Schemes

- Old Pension Scheme (OPS): Without employee Cr contributions, the OPS promised, after a minimum of ten years of service, a pension equal to half the last basic pay + dearness allowance. In addition, it offered Death Cum Retirement Gratuity (DCRG) and a family pension.
- The NPS, or New Pension Scheme: The NPS, a market-linked, participatory program that requires contributions from both employers and employees, was introduced to solve the mounting pension bill.

Background and Implementation of NPS

- OASIS Project: Started in 1999, it resulted in the government of Atal Bihari Vajpayee's 2003 proposal of the NPS.
- Scheme Specifics: 10% of base pay is contributed by employees, with an employer match of up to 14%. The money is invested in market-linked pension funds that are subject to PFRDA regulations.
- Account administration: For lifelong account administration, NPS offers a Permanent Retirement Account Number (PRAN).

 State Adoption: The NPS has been adopted by every state but West Bengal. Plans to return to the OPS were announced by a few oppositionruled states.

Rationale Behind NPS Adoption

- Pension Debt Sustainability: The NPS depends on accumulated money, while the OPS was a financial burden in the absence of funds.
- Taking Care of the Aging Population: The OPS could no longer be maintained as life expectancy increased.
- Preventing Early Retirements: Because of its long-term investment fund philosophy, the NPS promotes longer service.
- Investment and Flexibility: NPS provides the flexibility to move between different investment options and fund managers.

Criticism of NPS

- Market Risks: Concerns regarding old age security are raised when retirement savings are subjected to market volatility.
- Pension Amount Concerns: Under NPS, pensions are not inflation-indexed, and there is no minimum pension guarantee.
- Accountability Concerns: There are still concerns around market failure accountability as well as the security of the invested corpus.

Conclusion

- State Governments' Challenge: The financial effects on future generations must be carefully considered before switching back to OPS.
- Examining and fortifying NPS: The NPS can be strengthened by taking steps like implementing inflation-indexed annuities, guaranteeing minimum returns, and making sure contributions and registration are made on time.
- Balanced Approach: It takes a careful strategy to strike a balance between pensioners' access to enough social security and the requirement to maintain fiscal sustainability.

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History

Kharsawan Massacre of 1948: A Tragic



A massacre that occurred on January 1, 1948, in the town RSITY. of Kharsawan in modern-day Jharkhand was similar to the one that took place in Jallianwala Bagh in 1919. A crowd had assembled for the weekly haat (market) and a protest when police opened fire, killing hundreds, or according to other sources, thousands of Adivasis.

Kharsawan Massacre: A Background

- Adivasis in the area have yearned for a separate state that would represent their distinct culture and complaints since the provinces of Bihar and Orissa were established in 1912.
- Over time, this need grew stronger, and in 1930 • the Simon Commission acknowledged the unique characteristics of the area.
- To further this objective, the Adivasi Mahasabha was founded in 1938 under the leadership of well-known figure Jaipal Singh Munda.

Kharsawan's Merger Controversy

Merger with Orissa: During the integration of • India's princely states, in 1947, Kharsawan, a princely state with a sizable population speaking Odia, made the decision to merge with Orissa.

Opposition from Adivasis: The majority of Adivasis, however, were against this merger and preferred a separate state.

The Massacre

- Protest assembly: To express opposition to the • merger, a sizable assembly was planned for January 1, 1948, the weekly market day, in Kharsawan. More than fifty thousand people, many of them from far-off villages, gathered to witness Jaipal Munda, who was supposed to arrive but never did.
- Police Open Fire: The Orissa military police opened fire, causing a massacre, due to the enormous crowd and stressful situation. There are differing estimates about the precise number of victims, ranging from several dozen to several thousand.
- Aftereffects: Numerous injuries went neglected, and the dead were dumped in a bush and a well. In Indian history, the tragedy is still a sordid and unresolved chapter.

Legacy

- Uncertain Death Toll: While 35 deaths are listed • in official records, figures as high as 2,000 are suggested by other sources, such as P.K. Deo's "Memoir of a Bygone Era."
- Absence of Accountability: No conclusive investigation or system of responsibility for the massacre has been put in place.
- Memorial and Remembrance: Political leaders frequently pay their condolences at the memorial located in Kharsawan, which serves as a remembrance of this catastrophe.

Conclusion

The Kharsawan massacre serves as a sobering ٠ reminder of the difficulties and tragedies encountered by India during its independence process, especially for underprivileged groups such as the Adivasis.

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• It highlights the continuing problems with regard to tribal status and rights in India's past.

Details of the Discovery

- Location of Find: In the Mulugu district, between the villages of Gurrevula and Bhupatipuram, the hand axes were found.
- Particular Discovery: An important stone axe with dimensions of 15.5 cm in length, 11 cm in width, and 5.5 cm in thickness was discovered by the researchers.

Context and Comparison

- Global Significance: Similar hand axes have been found all throughout the world, suggesting that early humans employed a similar tool type for a variety of tasks.
- Historical Context in India: In 1863, the first Paleolithic site in the country was discovered at Attirampakkam, close to Madras (now Chennai). This site is known as the Madras Hand-Axe Industry or Madrasian Culture, and it contains bifacial hand axes that date back around 15 lakh years.

Historical Significance

• Tools of the Paleolithic Era: The stone axe is thought to have originated about 30 lakh years

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ago during the Lower Paleolithic period, according to paleontologists.

 Identification of the implements: Paleolithic hunter-gatherers employed hefty quartzite for huge implements, and their chipping style, substance, and size were used to identify the artifacts.

India's Oldest Living City found in Vadnagar: IIT study



Introduction

- Significant findings from a recent collaborative study conducted by the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kharagpur have been found in PM Modi's hometown of Vadnagar.
- The study indicates a continuous cultural presence in the region, in contrast to the widely held concept of a "Dark Age" after the collapse of the Harappans.

Vadnagar: Mysteries Revealed

- Historical Significance: The finding indicates a continuous human settlement for 5,500 years, and it closes a gap in the history of Indian archaeology between 1,500 and 500 BCE.
- Multicultural Settlement: It was determined that Vadnagar was influenced by a number of different cultures and religions, including Islamic, Buddhist, Hindu, and Jain.

- Cultural Continuity: Based on available data, Vadnagar may have been established as early as 1,400 BCE, which would place it in the latter half of the post-urban Harappan period.
- Archaeological Artifacts: A wide range of artifacts were found at the site, including beautifully designed bangles, potteries, and objects made of copper, gold, silver, and iron.
- Climatic Influence on History: Over a 3,000-year span, the study shows that climatic shifts had a major impact on the development and collapse of Indian kingdoms as well as invasions.
- Vadnagar was ruled by several kingdoms and empires in succession, including the Rashtrakuta-Pratihara-Chawada kings, the Solanki kings (Chalukya rule), the Sultanate-Mughals, the Indo-Greeks, the Indo-Scythians (Kshatrapa kings), Maitrakas (Gupta kingdom), and the British. This information is based on radiocarbon dating.
- Trigger for Migration: The team surmised that migration from central Asia may have been sparked by cold, dry, or hyperarid circumstances.

Challenging the "Dark Age" Narrative

- Redefining Historical Gaps: The results cast doubt on the idea of a "Dark Age" that began when the Indus Valley Civilization collapsed about 4,000 years ago and ended before Iron Age cities such as Gandhar, Koshal, and Avanti emerged.
- The Significance of Vadnagar: Research indicates that Vadnagar is among the oldest continuously inhabited cities in India under a single fortification, refuting this myth.
- Possible Continuity of Harappanism: Vadnagar's town may have originated as early as 1400 BCE, according to preliminary radiocarbon dating, which places it in the late stages of the posturban Harappan period.

International Relations

Houthi Rebels and Regional Dynamics

- India-UAE CEPA: 90% of Indian exports to the UAE are now eligible for duty-free access because to this agreement, which went into effect on May 1, 2022, and reduced tariffs on over 80% of products. With a target of \$100 billion by 2030, non-oil trade increased to \$50 billion between May 2022 and April 2023.
- India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC): The UAE is essential to the IMEC, which

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provides a counterbalance to China's Belt and Road Initiative.

- Iran-Arab Conflict: Maintaining diplomatic relations with Iran and the UAE while they are at odds is difficult.

Chabahar Port: India's Gateway to Central Asia via Iran



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Introduction

 During his recent visit to Iran, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar held important talks with the Iranian Minister of Roads and Urban Development with the goal of establishing a framework for long-term collaboration for the strategically important Chabahar port.

Chabahar Port: A Strategic Gem

- Place: Chabahar Port is well situated in Iran near the mouth of the Gulf of Oman.
- Deepwater Port: It is the first deepwater port in Iran and is strategically located along major oceanic commerce routes.
- Geographic Positioning: It is in competition with China's Gwadar Port, which is situated east, and is situated west of Iran's border with Pakistan.
- Strategic Significance: Chabahar Port is strategically significant for both India and Iran.
- Reducing the Effect of Western Sanctions: It enables Iran to reduce the consequences of Western sanctions.
- Alternative commerce Route: By avoiding Pakistan's prohibitions on land access for commerce with Afghanistan and Central Asia, it provides India with an other trade route.

India's Engagement with Chabahar

- Establishing Relations: India's cooperation with Chabahar began in 2002 when talks between Iranian and Indian representatives were held.
- Strategic Cooperation: President Khatami signed a roadmap for strategic cooperation during his 2003 visit to India, with Chabahar serving as a focal point project.
- Opposing BRI: The project became well-known for India as it looked for alternate trade routes in the wake of China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) and the growth of Pakistan's Gwadar Port.
- Access to Central Asia: India's aspirations to get access to both Russia and Central Asia have increased the significance of Chabahar.

Development of Chabahar Port

- Two Different Ports: Shahid Beheshti and Shahid Kalantari are the two different ports that make up Chabahar Port.
- Indian Investment: The Shahid Beheshti port is the main target of India's investment.
- Trilateral Agreement: An agreement was signed by Afghanistan, Iran, and India in April of 2016.
- Quick Development: The port was developed quickly by India's Shipping Ministry.
- Operational Milestones: Indian wheat may now be transported to Afghanistan more easily after the first phase of Shahid Beheshti Port opened in December 2017.
- IPGL's Function: India Ports Global Limited (IPGL) was essential to the running of the port.
- Phased Expansion: The Shahid Beheshti port is being developed in four stages, with the goal of having 32 jetties and an annual capacity of 82 million tons.

Challenges and Delays

- Geopolitical Obstacles: Project delays have been caused by geopolitical complications, including Iran's relationship with the US.
- US-Iran Relations: Since the US withdrew from the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) in 2018, the relationship between the two countries has fluctuated, which has presented difficulties.
- Impact of Sanctions: India encountered difficulties locating foreign suppliers while sanctions were in place.
- Afghanistan Dynamics: Although things improved over time, the situation in Afghanistan nevertheless had an impact on India's relations with Kabul.
- Recent Developments: India provided funding for the Chabahar port project and reopened its embassy in Kabul in 2022.
- Proceeded Wheat Exports: In 2023, India intends to use the port to ship 20,000 metric tonnes of wheat to Afghanistan.

Future Outlook
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- US-Iran Ties: Regional dynamics and US-Iran relations continue to influence the rate of development of the Chabahar port.
- Persistent Difficulties: Persistent difficulties encompass vulnerability to US sanctions, unpredictability in Afghanistan, and alignment with the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI).
- Strategic diplomacy: Overcoming these obstacles and preserving Chabahar's standing as a workable transit center and an essential connection between Iran and India would need active diplomacy, effective execution, and effective operations.

Introduction

 Maharashtra Assembly Speaker ruled that the ruling faction of a political party was the legitimate and real, having the support of the majority of the party's MLAs.

Anti-Defection Law in India

- Rise of Political Instability: Referred to as "Aaya Ram Gaya Ram" after MLA Gaya Lal's frequent party switching in 1967, the late 1970s saw a widespread practice of legislators crossing the floor.
- Legislative Efforts: To address defections, a number of legislation were presented, including the 32nd and 48th Constitution Amendment legislation, but they either expired or were not passed.
- Adoption of the Law: The anti-defection law was included into the Constitution through the Tenth Schedule, which was added by Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi in the 52nd Amendment of 1985.

Features of the Anti-Defection Law

[A] Disqualification Criteria:

- Political Party Members: If a member voluntarily resigns from their party membership or disobeys an order without permission and it is not excused within 15 days, they will be disqualified.
- Independent Members: If they become members of a political party after the election, they will be disqualified.
- Nominated Members: If a member of the House joins a political party within six months after assuming office, they will be disqualified.

[B] Exceptions:

- Merger: If a member's original party combines with another party and at least two-thirds of its members approve of the merger, they will remain eligible to vote.
- Presiding Officers: Party members may reclaim their membership following their term without being removed from office if they want to step down as presiding officers.

- Deciding Authority: As determined by the Kihoto Hollohan case (1991), the presiding officer of the relevant House has the authority to make decisions about disqualification, subject to judicial review.
- Making Rules Power: With the House's consent, the presiding officer may create regulations to carry out the Tenth Schedule.
- Procedure for Disqualification: After receiving a complaint, the presiding officer handles defection cases. The accused member must be given an opportunity to clarify, and a committee may be asked to look into the situation.
- Speaker's position: The Speaker is exempt from party whip rules. However, a member chosen by the House will determine on matters of disqualification under the law pertaining to the Speaker or Chairman.

Judicial Interpretations and Election Commission's Role

- Important rulings: In the 1991 Kihoto Hollohan case, the Speaker's defection decision was open to judicial review. Other notable instances that shed light on voluntary membership relinquishment and expulsion are G. Viswanathan v. The Hon'ble Speaker, Tamil Nadu, and Ravi Naik v. Union of India.
- Election Commission Guidelines: When issues within the party cannot be addressed, the EC may freeze party symbols and settles disputes based on the support of the majority in both the legislative and organizational wings.

Challenges and Criticisms

- Discriminatory Features: The law has come under fire for treating individual defections differently from collective defections and for failing to distinguish between dissent and defection.
- Impact on Democratic Functioning: According to critics, the bill lessens the independence of lawmakers and the legislative branch's ability to check and balance the executive.

Leap Years: Their Significance and Calculation



2024 is a leap year, which occurs every four years, adding an extra day to the calendar. This means that February 2024 will consist of 29 days instead of the usual 28 days. What is a Leap Year?

- Definition: A leap year is one day longer than a regular year (366 days), with February receiving an extra day.
- Goal: By adding one day to the calendar, the Earth's orbit around the Sun is made longer than it would otherwise be.

Reason for Leap Year Introduction

- Astronomical Basis: The orbit of the Earth around the Sun takes around 365 days, 5 hours, 48 minutes, and 46 seconds.
- Adjustment for Time: In order to correspond with this duration, one extra day is added every four years, resulting in an additional time that is around six hours a year.

Historical Background

- Julian Calendar: The Julian calendar, which was originally used to implement leap years, was introduced in 46 BC by scholars working for Julius Caesar.
- Pope Gregory XIII changed the Gregorian calendar in 1582 by omitting ten days in order to make up for years of inconsistencies.

Leap Year Calculation

India will contribute Rs 1.250 crore to the multinational Square Kilometer Array (SKA) project, a significant international astronomical collaboration.

Square Kilometer Array (SKA) Project: An Overview

- Phases of Construction: The SKA project is being constructed in two stages, with the first stage (SKA1) starting in December 2022.
- Project Headquarters: The UK's Jodrell Bank Observatory serves as the home base for the SKA project.
- Site Location: The project entails building telescope arrays in South Africa and Australia with the goal of mapping galaxies and conducting unprecedented detail-rich space exploration.
- Operational Schedule: By 2029, SKA1 is anticipated to start up.

Design and Features of the SKA Telescopes

- The SKA's array composition will be made up of 131,072 low-frequency antennas in Australia and 197 parabolic radio antennas in South Africa.
- Antenna Design: The antenna design includes dipole and parabolic dishes that can detect radio signals even at great distances.
- The placement of the dishes and antennae will be planned to cover a wide area in order to accurately calibrate the source of the signals that are observed.

Global Collaboration in the SKA Project

- Consortium Members: Australia, South Africa, Canada, China, India, Japan, and a number of European countries are among the sixteen member countries of the SKA Observatory (SKAO).
- Frequency Range: While the Australian telescope will cover low-frequency bands, the South African array will concentrate on midfrequency sounds.
- Plans for Expansion: To improve the project's capacity for data triangulation and resolution, more dishes are intended to be installed in nearby African nations.

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Scientific Objectives of the SKA

- Investigating the Universe: By observing and mapping galaxies near the frontier of the observable universe, the SKA will shed light on the birth and evolution of galaxies.
- Examining the "Dark Ages": The telescope will explore the "Dark Ages" of the early universe and look at things like dark energy and dark matter.
- Search for Extraterrestrial Life: By studying the habitable zones surrounding stars, the SKA will also aid in the hunt for life beyond Earth.

India's Role

- Pathfinder Research Partner: An important project partner is the National Centre for Radio Astrophysics (NCRA) of Tata Institute of Fundamental Research (TIFR), which is home to India's Giant Metrewave Radio Telescope.
- Participation of the Consortium: The SKA India consortium is made up of more than 20 Indian schools and universities that provide input on different areas of the project.

About FCPS Experiment

- The main objective of the experiment was to evaluate Polymer Electrolyte Membrane Fuel cells' performance in space and collect information for next mission designs.
- Power Generation: Using hydrogen and oxygen gasses, 180 W of power was produced during the test, yielding important information on the power system's operation.

What is a 'Bio-Imaging Bank'?

- All-Inclusive Repository: The Bio-Imaging Bank is an archive of radiology and pathology images that have been connected to clinical data, outcome data, details on the treatments administered, and more metadata.
- AI Integration: Using data from 60,000 patients, the project applies deep learning to create a customized early detection algorithm for cancer.

Project Scope and Collaboration

- Concentration on Particular Cancers: The project's first focus will be on lung and head and neck cancers, and it intends to gather data for at least 1000 patients in each category.
- Multi-Institutional Effort: PGIMER-Chandigarh, RGCIRC-New Delhi, AIIMS-New Delhi, IIT-Bombay, and the Department of Biotechnology are all partners in this research.

Al's Role in Early Cancer Detection

- Fundamentals of Diodes: An anode and a cathode are the two terminals on a diode, which is a tiny electrical component. Because of a p-n junction, its main purpose is to permit current to flow in a single direction alone.
- P-N Junction: A p-n junction is made up of two nearby materials, an n-type with electrons as negative charge carriers and a p-type with holes as positive charge carriers. The diode's one-way current control is enabled by the ease with which electrons can move from the n-type to the ptype but not the other way around.
- Anode and Cathode: The p-type material is connected to the anode terminal, while the ntype material is attached to the cathode. The directionality of the diode is defined by these terminals.

Birth of Light-Emitting Diodes (LEDs)

 LEDs that produce light are known as electroluminescent diodes. When electrons occupy holes in the p-n junction, they release energy because electrons have greater energy

levels than holes. Electroluminescence is the term for the phenomena that occurs when energy is converted into light and falls inside the visible spectrum.

 Band Gap: The band gap determines the precise amount of energy that is released during electron-hole recombination, which is how LEDs produce different hues of light.

Significance of Band Gap

- Energy Levels: Electrons are limited to specific energy levels and distinct energy values. These electrons often occupy the lowest energy levels that are accessible, resulting in materials with a band gap, insulators, and conductors.
- The Function of Band Gap: The energy threshold that must be crossed by electrons in order for materials to conduct electricity is known as a band gap.
- Band Gap and LEDs: The color of light in LEDs is determined by the energy released during electron-hole recombination, which is correlated with the band gap.

LED's Color Palette

- Historical Context: Before creating blue LEDs, scientists spent forty years developing red and green LEDs. Producing gallium nitride crystals with the right characteristics for electroluminescence was the difficult part.
- Primary Colors: LEDs have a flexible color pallet because they can create red, green, and blue light. Display boards and screens can have a wide range of colors because to the combination of multiple LEDs.
- Breakthrough: Using gallium nitride, Japanese researchers Isamu Akasaki, Hiroshi Amano, and Shuji Nakamura achieved a major breakthrough in the late 1980s by producing a vivid blue LED. They were awarded the 2014 Nobel Prize in Physics for their accomplishment.

Advantages of LEDs

• Efficiency: In terms of luminous efficacy, LEDs perform better than fluorescent and

incandescent bulbs, emitting more light per watt of power.

- Durability: Because LEDs require less maintenance and waste less materials, they are very durable.
- Various Uses: LEDs are used in a wide range of industries, including air quality monitoring, greenhouse illumination, consumer electronics, and signs.
- Color Versatility: A wide range of applications can be served by the different colors and frequencies that LEDs can emit.

Future Prospects

- Haitz's Law: LEDs have followed this law, which predicts a decrease in cost and an increase in light output over time, just like Moore's law did.
- New developments in lighting technology include the investigation of skin-embedded LEDs, organic LEDs, and efficient LEDs derived from perovskites.

ISRO's develops 2nd Generation Distress Alert Transmitter (DAT-SG)



Introduction

- To improve the safety of fishermen at sea, the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) invented the ground-breaking Distress Alert Transmitter (DAT).
- The DAT-SG, a second-generation DAT with cutting-edge features and capabilities, is transforming the transmission of emergency signals from fishing boats.

About Distress Alert Transmitter (DAT-SG)

• Operating Since 2010: In 2010, fisherman were able to send emergency signals via a

communication satellite thanks to the launch of the first version of DAT.

- Central Control Station: Alert signals were deciphered at the Indian Mission Control Centre (INMCC), a central control station, to identify the fishing boat that was in distress.
- Coordination with MRCCs: The collected data was then sent to the Indian Coast Guard's (ICG) Maritime Rescue Coordination Centers (MRCCs), enabling coordinated search and rescue efforts.
- Widespread Use: More than 20,000 DATs were put into service and used to communicate in times of need.

Evolution to DAT-SG

- Technological Developments: ISRO developed the second-generation DAT (DAT-SG) by utilizing developments in satellite communication and navigation.
- Fishermen may now feel certain that their distress signal has been received and assistance is on its way thanks to the acknowledgement feature that has been added to DAT-SG.
- Two-Way Communication: DAT-SG may receive communications from control centers in addition to sending distress signals. This makes it possible

to send out early warnings about bad weather, cyclones, tsunamis, and other crises, giving fisherman the information they need to make safe decisions.

- Enhanced Fishing Zone Information: To maximize catch and save time and fuel, DAT-SG additionally periodically provides fishermen with information about possible fishing zones.
- Mobile Connectivity: Using a special mobile app, messages can be shown in the fishermen's native tongue when DAT-SG is linked to a phone using Bluetooth.

Central Control and Coordination

- Sagarmitra Network: Sagarmitra is a web-based network management system used by the central control station, INMCC. This technology allows MRCCs to access registered DAT-SGs in real time and keeps a database of them.
- Real-time Coordination: Sagarmitra improves search and rescue operations by allowing Indian Coast Guard personnel to react to distress calls quickly and without delay.
- Operational 24/7: DAT-SG services are offered around-the-clock to provide fisherman in need of assistance when they are at sea.

Akash Missile System: India's Iron Dome



During the most recent Exercise Astrashakti 2023, India showed off the firepower of its Akash surface-to-air (SAM) weapon system by engaging and destroying four unmanned targets at once with a single firing unit. Operation Sadbhavana

- The Indian Army's Operation Sadbhavana (Goodwill) in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh aims to provide aid to victims of terrorism, with primary funding from Pakistan.
- Welfare Activities: The operation comprises conducting educational trips for kids in rural locations, infrastructural improvement initiatives, and Army Goodwill Schools.
- Emphasis on Education: Operation Sadbhavana, which is located in the Ladakh Region, operates seven Army Goodwill Schools with the goal of raising educational standards.
- The operation's goals are to create jobs, empower women, integrate the country, and engage in development initiatives that support national development.
- Collaborative Approach: In consultation with the local civil government, projects chosen under Operation Sadbhavana take into account the desires of the community.

Adoption of Topa Pir Village

- Model Village Initiative: Taking Topa Pir village under Army control is a first step toward becoming a model village that prioritizes welfare and community development.
- Recent Incidents: Three people died in a contentious episode involving the Army's suspected torture of residents, which brought attention to the village.
- Relationships with the local Gujjar and Bakarwal people, who live mostly in areas close to the Line of Control (LoC), have been severely damaged by the incident.
