

**ACADEMIC REGULATIONS FOR LL.M PROGRAM**

1. Duration of The LL.M Program

a).The duration of the LL.M program shall be **One Year in two semesters**, with minimum of 30 contact hours in each week and eighteen weeks for each of the two terms including class room teaching, library work, seminars and research;

b).The **entire program shall be spread evenly** for the duration of the programme, with 13 credits in each semester.

c). **Each of the semester shall be of a working duration of 18 weeks respectively.**

2. Program structure

The LL.M Program structure/curriculum shall have the following components:

**i) Foundation/Compulsory Courses (3 Courses three credits each)**  
**ii) Optional/Specialization Courses (6 Courses with two credits each)**  
**iii) Dissertation (five credits)**

Provided, in case the candidate takes a minimum of four specialization courses from any particular Group/Cluster only, then that Course can be called after the discipline the candidate selects; the candidate can opt for remaining course/courses of his/her choice in order to complete the number of courses/credits prescribed for the Degree.

**i). Compulsory Courses:**  
**The Compulsory Courses consist of the following three subjects/courses, which should be completed in the first semester:**

**ii).Specialization/Optional Courses:**  
**Each of the four branches of Specialization shall comprise of six courses with two credits each course:**  
 Provided, in case the candidate takes a minimum of four specialization courses from any particular Group/Cluster only, then that Course can be called after the discipline the candidate select; the candidate can opt for remaining course/courses of his/her choice in order to complete the number of courses/credits prescribed for the Degree.

6.	Selection Procedure	Students who have qualified and obtained ranks in State Level PGLAWCET are eligible for admission. However, admission of other students will be based on merit in personal interview.
