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

Over the years, NHRC has played a significant role in organizing various seminars and consultative meetings which led to the creation of a viable institutional mechanism for the Human Rights Council.

About Training Programme:

Human rights have long been understood to apply universally—to all people, at all times, in all places. However, in the case of women's human rights, this principle continues to be challenged. Even thirty seven years after the adoption of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), many girls and women still do not have equal opportunities to realize rights recognized by law. In many countries, women are not entitled to own property or inherit land. By placing limitations on the universality of the human rights of women, cultural values rooted in unequal power relations between women and men become justification for the systematic denial of civil, cultural, economic, political and social rights. Social exclusion, honor killings, female genital mutilation, trafficking, restricted mobility and early marriage among others, deny the right to health to women and girls and increase illness and death throughout the life-course. It is not possible to see sustainable progress unless we create awareness among girl students and women regarding their rights to enjoy equal access to health services, education, employment and political positions. Hence this workshop aims to empower the women and girl students by providing the practical insights regarding their rights and enlighten them to enjoy equitable status on par with men in the society
