- 1. SAll faculty belonging to a course team must be at a uniform knowledge and delivery level. Appropriate short term FDPs may be planned as per the requirement in coordination with Academic Staff College.

- 4. Course teams must discuss and frnalize the course material prepared by the individual faculty.
- 5. Course teams must consolidate and finalize ALMs, Quizzes & Assignments for all topics (Benchmarking).
