ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

FIVE YEAR INTERGRATED B.A.,LL.B. (Hons.) and B.B.A.,LL.B. (Hons.)

A. OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMMES

The 5 year Integrated Programmes of B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) and B.B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) are aimed at integrating the Legal Education as a major with the knowledge of Arts or Business Management education as subsidiaries. The mandatory courses in Law as prescribed by the Bar Council of India (BCI) are linked with the courses of Arts or Business Management in such a way that the study of these subsidiary courses would enhance the understanding and help interpreting the law in a better way in any given situation. Law as an instrument of social engineering, aimed at social change and social justice, requires proper understanding of various disciplines across the streams and subjects. With this view in mind some basic courses in social sciences like Economics, Sociology are also integrated into these Programmes. The courses on Communication skills and Personality Development are also included as integral part of these Programmes.

With the above objectives the 5 years B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) and B.B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) Programmes are designed to include the following Courses:

1. Mandatory Law Courses	-20 papers
2. Optional Law Courses	-6 papers
3. Clinical Law Courses	- 4 papers
4. Management Courses/ Arts Courses	-12 papers
5. English Courses	-2 papers
6. Honors Courses	-8 papers
7. Value Added Courses-	-8 papers

60 papers

B. OUTCOMES OF THE PROGRAMMES:

- The graduates will be able to acquire adequate theoretical and practical knowledge to take up legal profession in any Court of law as well as in any other Tribunal in the Country.
- The graduates will be able to gain comprehensive knowledge required to discharge the duties of a judicial officer.
- The graduates will be able to get analytical and application skills required to work as legal advisors in any organisation.
- The graduates will be able to synthesize and evaluate the knowledge obtained by them which will help to develop an aptitude for higher learning and research in different areas of law.

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C. ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

I. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMMES:

The duration of the Programmes shall be 5 years divided into 10 semesters (Full-Time). In each semester there shall be not less than 90 working days, with a 7-hour working day.

II. INTAKE:

The permitted intake by the Bar Council of India is 60 seats for B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) and 60 seats for B.B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.). Rules of reservation as laid down by the Central Government shall be followed.

III. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

The candidate should have passed Intermediate examination or its equivalent in a regular stream (10+2) with a minimum of 45% marks. Relaxation of 5% marks will be applicable to S.C., & S.T., candidates.

IV. SELECTION PROCEDURE:

Students who have qualified and obtained ranks in **CLAT** or State Level **LAWCET** are eligible for admission. However, admission of other students will be based on personal interview and writing ability test.

V. FEE STRUCTURE:

The tuition fee per semester shall be as decided by the BOM. Scholarships will be awarded to deserving students, as given below:

- Secured good rank in CLAT/AP LAW CET.
- Secured more than 60% in qualifying examination (10+2).
- Concession is also available in Sports Quota.

VI. COURSE WORK AND ATTENDANCE:

- The registration of a candidate is valid for a period twice the prescribed duration of the Programme from the date of registration.
- A candidate shall be deemed to have eligibility to appear for end-semester exams in any course, if the student has attended a minimum of 70% of classes held in the course concerned, including the moot-court exercises, tutorials and practical training conducted in the course.
- If any student for any exceptional reasons fails to attend 70% of the classes held in any course, the Principal of the College may allow the student to take the exam, if the student concerned attended at least 65% classes held in the course concerned and 70% of the classes in all the courses in entire semester taken together.

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VII. EVALUATION:

The performance of a candidate in each semester shall be evaluated course-wise, for a maximum of 100 marks per course, on the basis of Comprehensive Examination at the end of the semester and internal continuous evaluation.

1. The Comprehensive Examination shall be of three-hour duration and conducted for 60 marks per course.
2. Internal evaluation shall be carried out on a continuous basis by the Course Instructor. This carries 40 marks per course.
3. The pattern of the comprehensive examination and various components of continuous evaluation are provided in the succeeding Regulation 9.
4. A candidate shall be deemed to have secured the minimum academic requirement in a course if the candidate secures a minimum of 40% of marks in the Internal Evaluation and Comprehensive Examination put together as well as 40 % of marks in the Comprehensive Examinations. The same is applicable for all courses.
5. In case a candidate does not secure the minimum academic requirement in any of the courses (as specified above), the candidate has to re-appear for the Comprehensive Examination when that examination is conducted next in that course.
6. In case a candidate is detained for want of attendance or other reasons, the candidate has to repeat the course when offered next on the campus or do any other specified course as may be prescribed.

VIII. EVALUATION SCHEME

(1) **Comprehensive Examination:** A Comprehensive Examination of **three hour-duration** is held at the end of the semester for 60 marks. The entire curriculum is covered in the comprehensive examination. General Structure of the Question Paper for the Comprehensive Examinations is provided below:

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(2) Continuous Assessment: Continuous Assessment carries 40% weightage in aggregate marks. Various components which are included in the continuous assessment are furnished below:

- A Surprise Test is of objective or subjective nature decided by the faculty concerned and is conducted without prior intimation. There will be two such tests in a semester.
- Home assignments (Written) are given in each course by the faculty member concerned. There will be one assignment in each semester in each course. The assignments shall be submitted before the deadline fixed by the respective faculty member. The defaulter shall lose marks allotted for that assignment.
- Class attendance is monitored by each faculty member and based on the percentage of attendance; marks are awarded by the faculty member concerned.
- In order to maintain transparency in evaluation, the answer sheets of all components of continuous assessment should be shown to the students within one week of conducting the tests. If a student is not convinced with the marks awarded, he/she can apply for recheck. However, the student can apply for recheck on the day of returning the answer sheet within the classroom only.

(3) Evaluation for Clinical Papers: The scheme of Evaluation for Clinical Papers shall be as recommended by BCI.

(4) Practical Courses: The evaluation of courses like Practical Training, Internships, Moot Courts, Court Attendance, Seminar and SIP will be based on the diaries and project reports submitted by the students, in addition to the continuous performance of the candidates, their presentation skills and viva voce.

IX. GRADING

- The overall performance of the student is described by Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) and is calculated taking into consideration grade obtained by the student in all credited courses and credits attached to it. It is the weighted average of the grade points of all the letter grades obtained in credited courses by the student from his entry into the University. CGPA is computed as follows:

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$$CGPA = \frac{c_1g_1 + c_2g_2 + \dots + c_n g_n}{c_1 + c_2 + \dots + c_n}$$

where c_1, c_2, \dots, c_n denotes credits associated with the course applied and g_1, g_2, \dots denotes grades obtained by the student.

- b) At the end of the evaluation of all components based on the performance of the student in the course, each student is awarded with a letter grade on a **relative scale**. The list of letter grades and its connotation is given below.

c) A student getting less than 40% of overall score and less than 40% in the comprehensive examination will be considered to have earned **F** grade. In combined theory and clinical courses along with overall 40% score, the student should get independently 40% in both theory and clinical components.

d) A student who obtains **F** grade in any course has to reappear for the comprehensive examination in that course. However, such a student need not attend the classes and marks obtained in continuous internal assessment for 40 marks, will be carried forward for the subsequent attempts of the student.

e) In case of a student who has earned **F** grade, after the student has fulfilled all the requirements for passing, it will be converted into a valid grade by considering grade cut offs of the batch in which candidate has passed the course.

f) At the end of each semester the University issues grade sheet indicating the CGPA of the student. However, grade sheet will not be issued to the student if the candidate has any outstanding dues.

g) To convert CGPA into equivalent marks a multiplication factor of 9 is adopted. Ex: CGPA 7 is equivalent to $7 \times 9 = 63$ marks.

X. REPORTS/GRADES

The Course Coordinator can award the following Reports/ Grades depending on the cases:

a) Grade forms **X, A, B, C, D, E** and **F** are awarded to the student if the student satisfies the corresponding requirements as specified above.

b) **NA** (Not attended) is awarded to the student if the student has shortage of attendance. When student is given NA, the candidate must repeat the course. It should be noted here that NA is different from F grade. For a student with F grade his/her marks obtained in internal evaluation component will

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be carried forward. While for a student awarded with NA Report, the candidate has to reregister for such course/s and attend the classes by paying the prescribed fee.

b) **RC** (Registration Cancelled) is awarded to a student for various reasons specified by the university including examination malpractice cases. Such a student will have to re-register for the course/s in subsequent semesters, whenever the course/s is offered.

XI. AWARD OF DEGREE:

A Candidate shall be eligible for the award of B.A., LL.B.(Hons.) or B.B.A., LL.B.(Hons.) Degree, if the candidate satisfies the minimum academic requirements in every course. The Degree with Third Class will be awarded to candidates who obtain a minimum CGPA of 5 and less than 6.5. The Degree with Second Class will be awarded to those candidates obtaining CGPA ≥ 6.5 and above up to CGPA < 7.5 . The Degree of First Class will be awarded to those obtaining CGPA ≥ 7.5 and above up to CGPA < 8.5 . The Degree of First Class with Distinction will be awarded to candidates obtaining CGPA ≥ 8.5 .

XII. WITHHOLDING OF RESULTS:


If the candidate has not paid dues to the University or if any case of indiscipline is pending against him/her, the result of the candidate shall be withheld and he will not be allowed/ promoted into the next higher semester. The issue of degree is liable to be withheld in such cases.

XIII. CHANGES IN THE RULES OR SYLLABI:

1. The University may change or amend these rules or syllabi at any time and the changes or amendments shall be made applicable to all students on rolls with effect from the dates notified by the University.
2. The Examination Malpractice Rules shall be as prescribed by the appropriate authority of the University.

XIV. GENERAL UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS

In cases not covered by the above Academic Regulations, the common Academic Regulations of the University shall apply.

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

A. OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMME


The 5-year Integrated Programme for B.B.A., LL.B. is aimed at integrating the Legal Education as a major with the knowledge of Business Management Education as subsidiary. The mandatory courses in Law as prescribed by the Bar Council of India (BCI) are linked with the courses of Business Management in such a way that the study of these subsidiary management courses would enhance the understanding and interpreting the law in a better way in any given situation. Law as an instrument of social engineering, aimed at social change and social justice, requires proper understanding of various disciplines across the streams and subjects. With this view in mind some basic courses in social sciences like Economics, Sociology is also integrated into the Programme. The courses dealing with enhancement of communication skills and personality development is also included as integral part of this Programme.

With the above objectives the 5 years B.B.A., LL.B. Programme is designed to include the following courses:

OUTCOMES OF THE PROGRAMME

- The graduates will be able to acquire adequate theoretical and practical knowledge to take up legal profession in any Court of Law as well as in any other Tribunal in the Country.
- The graduates will be able to gain comprehensive knowledge required to discharge the duties of a judicial officer.
- The graduates will be able to get analytical and application skills required to work as legal advisors in any organisation.
- The graduates will be able to synthesize and evaluate the knowledge obtained by them which will help to develop an aptitude for higher learning and research in different areas of law.


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C. ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

I. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME:

The duration of the Programme shall be 5 years divided into 10 semesters (Full-Time). In each semester, there shall be not less than 90 working days, with a 7-hour working day.

II. INTAKE:

The permitted intake by the Bar Council of India is 120 seats for BB.A., LL.B. It is proposed Rules of reservation as laid down by the Central Government shall be followed

III. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

The candidate should have passed Intermediate examination or its equivalent in a regular stream (10+2) with a minimum of 45% marks. Relaxation of 5% marks will be applicable to S.C., & S.T., candidates.

I. SELECTION PROCEDURE:

Students who have qualified and obtained ranks in **CLAT** or State Level **LAWCET-2022** are eligible for admission. However, the admission of other students will be based on the performance of the student in the written test on Legal Aptitude and Personal interview.

II. FEE STRUCTURE:

The tuition fee per semester shall be as specified in the University Website. The Scholarships will be awarded to deserving students.


- Secured good rank in CLAT/AP LAW CET
- Secured more than 60% in qualifying examination (10+2)
- Concession is also available in Sports Quota.

IV. DETAILS OF COURSES OFFERED:

The details of the courses offered is provided in Annexure VI.

V. COURSE WORK AND ATTENDANCE:

- The registration of a candidate is valid for a period twice the prescribed duration of the Programme from the date of registration.
- A candidate shall be deemed to have eligibility to appear for end-semester exams in any course if the student has attended a minimum of 70% of classes held in the course concerned, including the moot-court exercises, tutorials and practical training conducted in the course.
- If any student for any exceptional reasons fails to attend 70% of the classes held in any course, the Principal of the College may allow the student to take the exam, if the student concerned attended at least 65% classes held in the course concerned and 70% of the classes in all the courses in entire semester taken together.


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VI. EVALUATION:

The performance of a candidate in each semester shall be evaluated course-wise, for a maximum of 100 marks per course, on the basis of Comprehensive Examination at the end of the semester and internal continuous evaluation.

1. The Comprehensive Examination shall be of three hour duration and conducted for 60 marks per course.
2. Internal evaluation shall be carried out on a continuous basis by the Course Instructor. This carries 40 marks per course.
3. The pattern of the comprehensive examination and various components of continuous evaluation are provided in the succeeding paragraphs.
4. A candidate shall be deemed to have secured the minimum academic requirement in a course if the candidate secures a minimum of 40% of marks in the Internal Evaluation and the Comprehensive Examination put together. The same is applicable for all courses.
5. In case a candidate does not secure the minimum academic requirement in any of the courses (as specified above), the candidate has to re-appear for the Comprehensive Examination when that examination is conducted next in that course.
6. In case a candidate is detained for want of attendance or other reasons, the candidate has to repeat the course when offered next on the campus or do any other specified course as may be prescribed.

VII. EVALUATION SCHEME

1. A comprehensive examination of three hour-duration is held at the end of the semester for 60 marks. The entire curriculum is covered in the comprehensive examination. General Structure of the Question Paper for the Comprehensive Examinations is provided below:

2. **Continuous Assessment:** Continuous Assessment carries 40% weightage in aggregate marks. Various components which are included in the continuous assessment are furnished below:

- a) A Surprise Test is of objective or subjective nature decided by the faculty concerned and is conducted without prior intimation. There will be two such tests in a semester.
- b) Home assignments (Written) are given in each course by the faculty member concerned. There will be one assignment in each semester in each course. The assignments shall be submitted before the deadline fixed by the respective faculty member. The defaulter shall lose marks allotted for that assignment.
- c) Class attendance is monitored by each faculty member and based on the percentage of attendance; marks are awarded by the faculty member concerned.
- d) In order to maintain transparency in evaluation, the answer sheets of all components of continuous assessment should be shown to the students within one week of conducting the tests. If a student is not convinced with the marks awarded he/she can apply for recheck. However, the student can apply for recheck on the day of returning the answer sheet within the classroom only. The evaluation of courses like practical training, internships, moot courts and court attendance will be based on the diaries and project reports submitted by the students, in addition to the continuous performance of the candidates and viva voce.

VIII. GRADING

a) The overall performance of the student is described by Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) and is calculated taking into consideration grade obtained by the student in all credited courses and credits attached to it. It is the weighted average of the grade points of all the letter grades obtained in credited courses by the student from his entry into the University. CGPA is computed as follows:

$$CGPA = \frac{c_1g_1 + c_2g_2 + \dots + c_n g_n}{c_1 + c_2 + \dots + c_n}$$

where c_1, c_2, \dots, c_n denotes credits associated with the course applied and g_1, g_2, \dots, g_n denotes grades obtained by the student.

b) At the end of the evaluation of all components based on the performance of the student in the course, each student is awarded with a letter grade on a **relative scale**. The list of letter grades and its connotation is given below:

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- c) A student getting less than 40% of overall score and less than 40% in the comprehensive examination will be considered to have earned F grade. In combined theory and clinical courses along with overall 40% score, the student should get independently 40% in both theory and clinical components.
- d) A student who obtains F grade has to reappear for the comprehensive examination. However, such a student need not attend the classes and marks obtained in continuous internal assessment for 40 marks, will be carried forward for the subsequent attempts of the student.
- e) In case of a student who has earned F grade, after the student has fulfilled all the requirements for passing, it will be converted into a valid grade by considering grade cut offs of the batch in which candidate has passed the course.
- f) At the end of each semester the University issues grade sheet indicating the CGPA of the student. However, grade sheet will not be issued to the student if the candidate has any outstanding dues.
- g) To convert CGPA into equivalent marks a multiplication factor of 9 is adopted. Ex: CGPA 7 is equivalent to $7 \times 9 = 63$ marks.

IX. REPORTS/GRADES

The Course Coordinator can award the following Reports/ Grades depending on the cases:

- a) Grade forms X, A, B, C, D, E and F are awarded to the student if the student satisfies the corresponding requirements as specified above.
- b) NA (Not Attended) is awarded to the student if the student has shortage of attendance. When student is given NA the candidate has to repeat the course. It should be noted here that NA is different from F grade. For a student with F grade his/her marks obtained in internal evaluation component will be carried forward. While for a student awarded with NA Report, the candidate has to reregister for such course/s and attend the classes by paying the prescribed fee.
- c) RC (Registration Cancelled) is awarded to a student for various reasons specified by the university including examination malpractice cases. Such a student will have to re-register for the course in subsequent semester/summer term whenever the course is offered.

X. AWARD OF DEGREE:

A Candidate shall be eligible for the award of B.B.A., LL.B. Degree, if the candidate satisfies the minimum academic requirements in every course. The degree will be awarded only to candidates who obtain minimum CGPA of 5. The B.B.A., LL.B. degree with second class will be awarded to those having $CGPA > 5.5$ and above up to $CGPA < 6.5$. The degree of first class will be awarded to those having $CGPA > 6.5$ and above up to $CGPA < 8$. The degree of first class with distinction will be awarded to candidates having $CGPA > 8$.

XI. WITH-HOLDING OF RESULTS:

If the candidate has not paid dues to the University or if any case of indiscipline is pending against him, the result of the candidate shall be withheld and he will not be allowed/ promoted into the next higher semester. The issue of degree is liable to be withheld in such cases.

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XII. CHANGES IN THE RULES OR SYLLABI:

1. The University may change or amend these rules or syllabi at any time and the changes or amendments shall be made applicable to all students on rolls with effect from the dates notified by the University.
2. The Examination Malpractice Rules shall be as prescribed by the appropriate authority of the University.

XIII. GENERAL UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS

In cases not covered by the above Academic Regulations, the common Academic Regulations of the University shall apply.


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
