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acknowledging the efforts made by the government through various programs and legislation to address these issues.

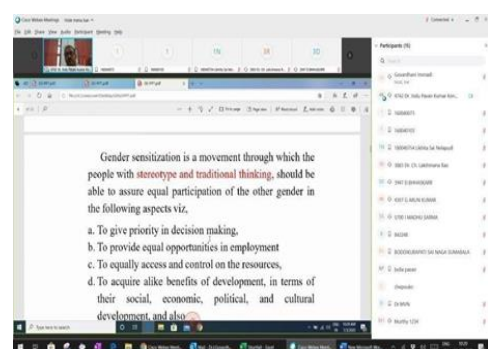

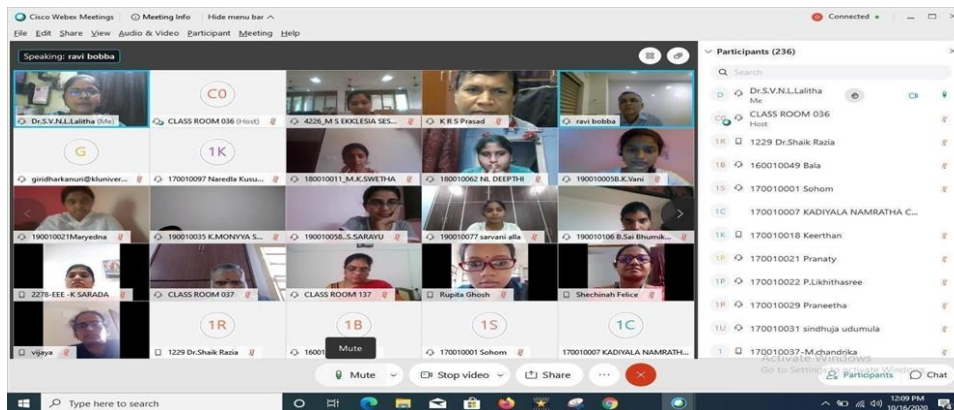


situation, the event was skillfully organized in an online mode, creating a unique and engaging learning experience for all.

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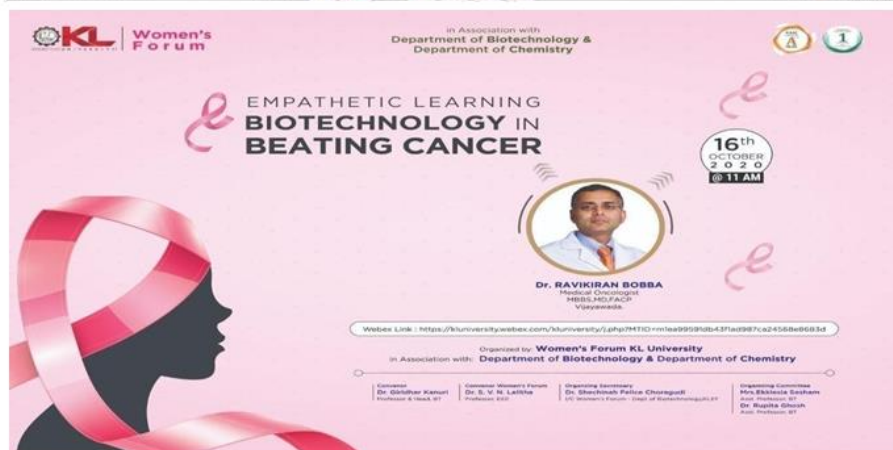

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leading to the growth of violence. Mrs. Radhika advised students to be wise and refrain from illegal activities, elucidating the legal consequences they may face.

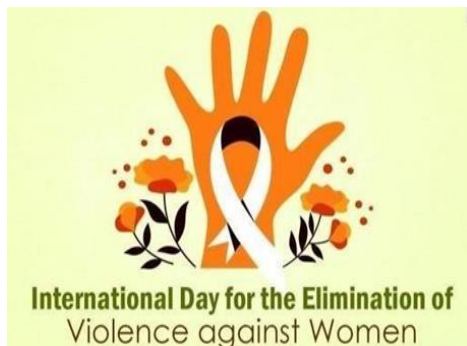

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Health camp on Hemoglobin testing in blood

Objective:

The objective of conducting the "Hemoglobin Testing in Blood" health camp by KLEF Women's Forum was to assess the hemoglobin levels of faculty and staff members. The camp aimed to raise awareness about the importance of maintaining healthy hemoglobin levels and to identify individuals with low hemoglobin levels who may be at risk of anemia or other related health issues.

Summary:

KLEF Women's Forum organized a health camp on "Hemoglobin Testing in Blood" for the faculty and staff members. The camp took place on 24th February 2022 at C Block Room no C-511 Bio-Tech Lab, starting from 11.00 AM and concluding at 01.00 PM.

During the camp, a simple and non-invasive hemoglobin test was conducted on the participants. The test measured the amount of hemoglobin present in their blood, which is essential for carrying oxygen to the body's organs and tissues and transporting carbon dioxide back to the lungs. The test results provided valuable information about the participants' hemoglobin levels.

The normal range of hemoglobin levels varies for men and women. For men, the normal range is 13.5 to 17.5 grams per deciliter, while for women, it is 12.0 to 15.5 grams per deciliter. If the hemoglobin test revealed that an individual's hemoglobin level was lower than the normal range, it indicated a low red blood cell count, also known as anemia. Anemia can have various underlying causes, including vitamin deficiencies, bleeding, and chronic diseases.

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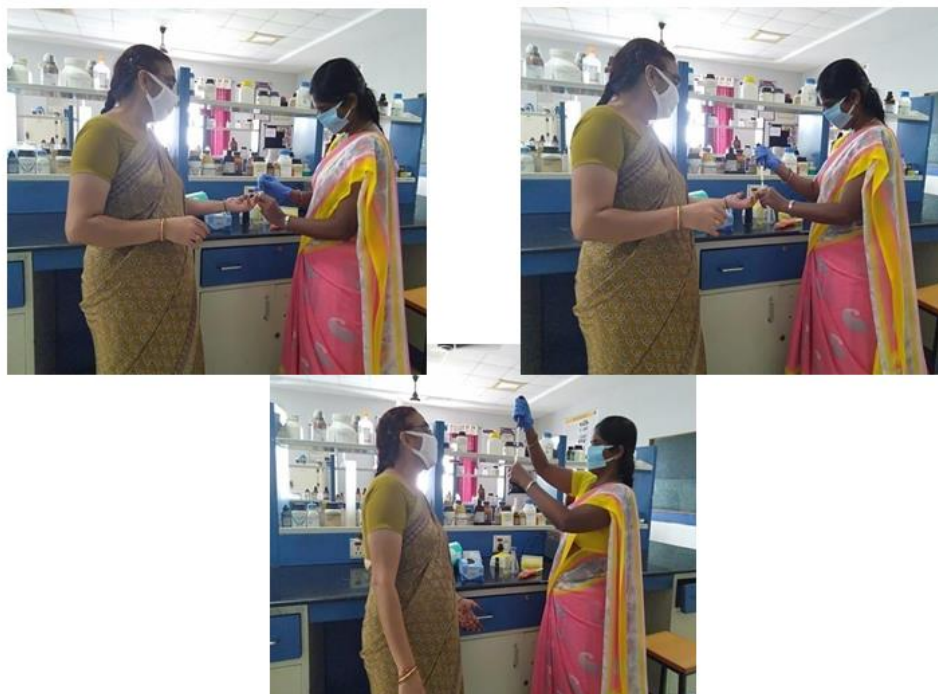
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Outcomes:

4. Potential Referrals: Participants found to have low hemoglobin levels could be referred for further medical evaluation and appropriate treatment, if necessary.
5. Encouragement for Health Check-ups: The camp encouraged faculty and staff to be more proactive about their health and undergo regular health check-ups to monitor their well-being.



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Student Feedback:

As the health camp was conducted for the faculty and staff members, there may not have been specific student feedback. However, the participants appreciated the initiative taken by KLEF Women's Forum to conduct the health camp, as it provided a convenient opportunity to assess their hemoglobin levels. Those identified with low hemoglobin levels may have found the camp to be beneficial in potentially identifying health concerns early on. The health camp may have also motivated the participants to prioritize their health and engage in regular health check-ups in the future.
