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

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1: Important Days



Odisha Foundation Day : 01 April :-

Every year on April 1, Utkal Divas, also known as Utakala Dibasha, is observed to commemorate the creation of the Odisha state following a protracted battle for statehood. Odisha was a part of the Bengal presidency, which included West Bengal, Bihar, and Odisha, during the British colonial era. The state was originally called Orissa but the Lok Sabha passed the Orissa Bill, and Constitution Bill (113rd amendment), in March 2011 to rename it Odisha. Naveen Patnaik of the Biju Janta Dal (BJD) is currently the Chief Minister of Odisha.



World Autism Awareness Day : 02 April :-

Every year, the global awareness event World Autism Day is commemorated to promote awareness about autism's causes, symptoms, and prevention strategies. This particular day, held every year on April 2, aims to raise awareness of autism as an illness and to help individuals who suffer from it. The World Health Organization (WHO) defines autism spectrum disorders (ASD) as a wide range of illnesses. They are characterised by some degree of difficulty with social interaction and communication. The theme for World Autism Awareness Day 2024 is 'Empowering Autistic Voices.'



International Day of Mine Awareness : 04 April :-

On 8 December 2005, the General Assembly declared that the 4th of April will be formally proclaimed and marked as the International Day for Mine Awareness and Assistance in Mine Action. It was originally celebrated on April 4, 2006. This day raises awareness about the threat that landmines pose to civilian populations' safety, health, and lives, and it encourages state governments to implement mine clearance programmes. The theme of International Mine Awareness Day 2024 is 'Protecting Lives, Building Peace.'

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NATIONAL MARITIME DAY



National Maritime Day (India) : 05 April :-

National Maritime Day is observed annually on April 5. The inaugural National Maritime Day took place on April 5, 1964. Since then, it has been observed annually on the same date. The day is observed with the goal of raising awareness and acknowledging the efforts and contributions of India's maritime industry to the country's economic growth and development. This day also aims to draw our attention to the struggles of this industry and help us come together to find solutions effectively.



International Day of Sports For Development And Peace : 06 April :-

The International Day of Sport for Development and Peace (IDSDP) is commemorated on April 6 to recognize the importance of sports and physical activity in our personal lives and communities around the world. On August 23, 2013, the United Nations General Assembly voted resolution 67/296, designating April 6 as International Day of Sport for Development and Peace, in its 67th session. The resolution report was published on September 18 that year. The global theme for 2024 is "Sport for the Promotion of Peaceful and Inclusive Societies".



World Health Day : 07 April :-

Every year, World Health Day is observed on the anniversary of the World Health Organization's (WHO) inception. Every year on April 7, the day is commemorated to raise awareness about global health challenges and emphasize the significance of well-being. The World Health Organization's constitution was adopted on April 7, 1948. The World Health Assembly (WHA) was established to oversee the operations of the WHO. The year 2024 marks the 76th anniversary of WHO and as a part of celebration WHO has chosen 'My Health, My Right' as the theme of World Health Day 2024.



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World Homoeopathy Day : 10 April :-

Every year on April 10, the world celebrates World Homeopathy Day in honor of German physician and chemist Dr. Samuel Hahnemann. Although homeopathy is thought to have originated in the fifth century BC, it wasn't until the nineteenth century that it became wellknown in Europe and eventually made its way to North America. Practitioners of homeopathy employ trace amounts of organic materials, such as plants and minerals, to encourage the body's own healing mechanism. The day is celebrated in India under the aegis of the Ministry of AYUSH, govt of India, for the last few years. The theme for World Homeopathy Day 2024 is 'Empowering Research, Enhancing Proficiency: A Homeopathy Symposium".



World Parkinson's Day : 11 April :-

Dr. James Parkinson discovered Parkinson's Disease for the first time in 1817. The European Association for Parkinson's Disease stated in 1997 that April 11 will be commemorated annually as World Parkinson's Day. Parkinson's disease is a progressive neurodegenerative ailment that primarily affects the neurological system and the body's nerve-controlled organs. Nerve cell damage in the brain leads to decrease in Dopamine levels – this leads to Parkinson's Disease. Some of the symptoms of Parkinson's Disease are tremors, slow movement, stiffness and loss of balance.



National Safe Motherhood Day (India) : 11 April :-

National Safe Motherhood Day is an annual event observed on April 11 in India. The White Ribbon Alliance India (WRAI) established this day to emphasize the importance of maternal health and minimize maternal mortality rates in the country. India has one of the world's highest maternal mortality rates, accounting for 12 percent of all maternal deaths. However, most of these deaths can be prevented with the use of right healthcare solutions to avoid or manage many complications during pregnancy, childbirth and the postpartum period.



Jallianwala Bagh Massacre : 13 April :-

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The Jallianwala Bagh massacre, which took place on April 13, 1919, in Amritsar, Punjab, is a devastating emblem of the crimes committed against the Indian people during British monarchy. A sad tragedy occurred at Jallianwala Bagh in Amritsar, where thousands of peaceful Indian protestors had congregated to commemorate the spring festival of Baisakhi. The area was enclosed by walls on all sides, with just one tiny entry. Without warning, Brigadier General Reginald Dyer, the British officer incharge of the Amritsar region, marched into Jallianwala Bagh with fifty armed soldiers and ordered them to open fire on the crowd.



Bhim Jayanti or Ambedkar Remembrance Day : 14 April:-

Ambedkar Jayanti, also known as Bhim Jayanti, is celebrated on April 14th each year to honor the memory of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, the first Law Minister of Independent India and the major author of the Indian Constitution. Ambedkar was born on April 14, 1891, in Mhow, Madhya Pradesh, which is now known as Ambedkar Nagar. He became a well-known activist against the inequalities of India's caste system, advocating for the advancement of Dalits and other impoverished communities. His efforts to advance the Hindu Code Bill demonstrated his dedication to increasing women's empowerment and gender equality in India.



World Art Day : 15 April :-

Every year on April 15th, World Art Day is observed to appreciate artists' accomplishments and to raise awareness of the value of art in our lives. This day commemorates the birth of Leonardo da Vinci, a brilliant artist recognized as one of the best of all time. The International Association of Art (IAA) proposed World Art Day in 2011 during its 17th General Assembly in Guadalajara, Mexico. The proposal was accepted, and the first World Art Day was celebrated on April 15, 2012. The IAA was founded in 1954 in UNESCO's headquarters in Paris, to promote art and artists worldwide. The chosen theme for World Art Day is "A Garden of Expression: Cultivating Community through Art."



World Haemophilia Day : 17 April :-

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Established by the World Federation of Haemophilia (WHF) started the World Haemophilia Day is observed on April 17 annually. Haemophilia is a hereditary illness that can be handed down from parent to kid. Generally, this condition is more common among men. This condition is transmitted by chromosomes, which impede blood clotting and cause bleeding. Haemophilia patients lack a protein in their blood known as a clotting factor. When an injury is detected, this protein and platelets work together to stop bleeding. This means that after an injury, a person bleeds longer and is more likely to have internal bleeding. High levels of bleeding can be deadly. The theme for World Hemophilia Day 2024 is "Equitable access for all: recognizing all bleeding disorders".



World Heritage Day : 18 April :-

The International Council on Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS) in 1982 proposed that World Heritage Day be observed annually on April 18th. The plan received approval from UNESCO's General Conference the following year. Since then, the special day has been honored annually on April 18. Human activity, natural catastrophes, and urbanisation frequently cause damage to heritage monuments and places. The day reinstates the importance of protecting and preserving them. The

theme for this year's World Heritage Day is "Discover and experience diversity".



World Liver Day : 19 April :-

In 2010, the European Association for the Study of the Liver (EASL) established the first World Liver Day to VERSI honor the organization's founding day in 1966. Since then, April 19 has been observed as World Liver Day every year. According to statistics, over 20 lakh people die each year from liver illnesses around the world, with the figure anticipated to rise by 35 percent by 2030. The day aims to urge people to have a healthier lifestyle and diet that can boost liver functioning and keep liver diseases at bay.



National Civil Service Day : 21 April :-


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National Civil Service Day is observed annually on April 21. After India gained independence, Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel talked to the nation's first batch of civil servants. In this stirring speech to the country's government officials, Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel referred to them as India's steel frame. Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel announced in 1947 that National government Service Day will be commemorated every year to honor government servants' services to the nation. In Vigyan Bhavan, on April 21, 2006, the first National Civil Services Day was observed.



World Earth Day : 22 April :-

Every year, April 22 is celebrated as Earth Day, an annual event where people take time out to demonstrate their support for protecting the planet and its environment. Gaylord Nelson, a Senator from Wisconsin, US, established Earth Day in response to growing concerns around pollution, biodiversity loss, and other ecological problems. This year, the theme of Earth Day 2024 is 'Planet vs. Plastics.' With this theme, the organisation aims to reduce plastic dependency and make the earth plastic-free.



World Book and Copyright Day : 23 April :-

World Book and Copyright Day, often known as World Book Day, is observed annually on April 23 to emphasize the value of reading books. UNESCO has designated April 23rd as World Book Day to honour renowned literary personalities such as William Shakespeare, Miguel Cervantes, and Inca Garcilaso de la Vega, who died on this date. This date was set in 1995 by the UNESCO General Conference in Paris to pay respect to and commemorate authors and books around the world. One of the main objectives of World Book and Copyright Day is to raise awareness about the importance of protecting copyrights and promoting the rights of authors and publishers. The theme for World Book and Copyright Day 2024 is 'Read Your Way'.



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English Language Day : 23 April :-

Every year on April 23, World English Day, also known as English Language Day, commemorates the birth and death anniversary of William Shakespeare, the English playwright and poet. It was established for the first time in 2010 by the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) to encourage multilingualism and cultural diversity, as well as to recognize the global importance of the English language. The English language is one of the most popular languages spoken around the globe. The day prospects the history, culture, development, and achievements associated with the language.



National Panchayati Raj Day : 24 April :-

National Panchayati Raj Day is observed annually on April 24. In the early 1950s, the first National Development Council urged the establishment of a democratic system of administration at the grassroots. However, until 1993, the formation did not go into effect. The Panchayat system was adopted in rural regions in 1993 as part of the 73rd Constitutional Amendment Act, allowing for grassroots development. The Panchayat Raj system had helped in uplifting the people in the rural areas by providing them a space to voice their opinions and being a part of development and empowerment.



World Intellectual Property Day : 26 April :-

World Intellectual Property Day is observed annually on April 26. The Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property, signed in 1883, provided additional protection for intellectual property. This was intended to protect inventions, trademarks, and industrial designs. The World Intellectual Property Organization Convention, signed in 1970, became known as WIPO. In 1974, WIPO became a specialised agency of the United Nations. The theme for this year's World Intellectual Property Day is – "IP and the SDGs: Building Our Common Future with Innovation and Creativity".



World Immunization Week 2024 : April 24 To 30 :-

World Immunization Week (WIW) is a global health event that takes place from April 24 to April 30. The aim is to raise vaccination rates and protect people of all ages from infectious diseases. The global immunization programs during the second half of the twentieth century rank among humanity's greatest achievements. In 2024, the Expanded Programme on Immunisation (EPI) of the World Health Organisation will commemorate its 50th anniversary with the theme "Humanly Possible: Saving lives through immunization" during World Immunisation Week.



World Malaria Day : 25 April :-

World Malaria Day, marked on April 25, raises awareness of the global fight to control and eventually eradicate malaria. World Malaria Day was first celebrated in 2008. It evolved from Africa Malaria Day, an event recognized by African countries since 2001. The parasite Plasmodium is the cause of malaria. The parasite can be spread to humans through the bites of infected female Anopheles mosquitoes called 'malaria vectors'. When a mosquito bites parasite is released into the bloodstream. The theme for this year is "Accelerate the fight against malaria for a more equitable world."



World Penguin Day : 25 April :-

Every year on April 25th, we celebrate World Penguin Day. This day is notable because it marks the start of the Adelie penguins' northern migration. Adelie penguins are one of the penguin species that have been recognized worldwide. The majority of penguins live in the southern hemisphere, with approximately 20 identified species. The Emperor Penguin is the largest species of penguins, whereas the smallest are found along the coastal areas of New Zealand and Australia. Penguins are flightless birds, and their habitats are found in the southern hemisphere.



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World Veterinary Day 2024 : 27 April :-

Once a year, the final Saturday of April is designated as World Veterinary Day to honour the tireless work of veterinarians around the world. The day recognizes the veterinarians' societal duties and responsibilities. This year's World Veterinary Day will be held on April 27. The World Veterinary Association (WVA) was founded in 1959 in Madrid, Spain. It was the WVA which came up with the World Veterinary Day in the year 2001. As of 2023, the association boasts of members from more than 70 countries and national veterinary associations from across the globe. The theme of World Veterinary Day 2024 is 'Veterinarians are Essential Health Workers'.



World Day for Safety and Health at Work : 28 April :-

The World Day for Safety and Health at Work is commemorated on April 28th and promotes the prevention of workplace accidents and diseases around the world. Worker's Memorial Day is held to encourage workplace safety and health, and it pays tribute to those who have died as a result of a work-related injury or sickness. The World Day for Safety and Health at Work was first observed in 2003 by the International Labour Organisation in an effort to minimise workplace accidents and illnesses.



International Dance Day : 29 April :-

International Dance Day, also known as World Dance Day is all about celebrating the amazing art of dance and showing how it brings people together. International Dance Day was created in 1982 by the Dance Committee of the International Theatre Institute (ITI). The ITI is a partner of UNESCO, which works to promote education, science, and culture around the world. They chose April 29th for International Dance Day because it's the birthday of Jean-Georges Noverre, a famous French dancer who helped create modern ballet.




Ayushman Bharat Diwas : 30 April :-

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Ayushman Bharat Diwas is a day set aside to commemorate the success and achievements of the Ayushman Bharat initiative, also known as the Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY). Every year on April 30, the day is held to commemorate the government of India's founding of the Ayushman Bharat initiative on that date in 2018. The Ayushman Bharat scheme is the Government of India's main healthcare effort, with the goal of giving financial security to more than 10 crore poor and disadvantaged households in the country by allowing them to access secondary and tertiary healthcare services without using cash or paper.

2: Agreements



Odisha joins PM SHRI school initiative, signs MoU with ministry of education :-

In order to execute the PM SHRI school project, Odisha has consented to sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Central Government, joining the other states in the initiative. With this ruling, the only states that have not yet finalized accords of a comparable nature are Delhi, Kerala, and West Bengal. The Ministry of Education emphasized how important this partnership is to improving student growth and education in Odisha. The PM SHRI scheme aims to upgrade thousands of schools across the country, aligning with NEP 2020 principles.



SIA-India And ABRASAT Sign MoU To Boost Space Sector Advancements :-

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) has been signed by SIA-India, the premier space association in India, and ABRASAT, the well-known Satellite Communications Association in Brazil, to establish a cooperative relationship. The goal of this partnership is to advance both nations' space industries and foster greater cooperation. This partnership is anticipated to facilitate business expansion and mutual cooperation between India and Brazil across various domains such as

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satellite communication, rocket launches, payload development, and ground instrumentation.



SJVN Partners With IIT Patna To Enhance Tunneling Project Performance :-

SJVN Ltd, a public sector undertaking involved in hydroelectric power generation and transmission, has signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the Indian Institute of Technology Patna to use advanced geological models in tunneling projects, significantly reducing time and cost overruns, according to a press release from the Union Ministry of Power. SJVN chairperson & Managing Director Geeta Kapur said that the primary focus of the MoU is to develop cutting-edge methodologies which integrate diverse geotechnical data sources.



CSC e-Governance and Vision Karnataka Foundation ink MoU to train 5 lakh youths :-

CSC e-Governance Services India Limited (CSC SPV) and Vision Karnataka Foundation (VKF) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the aim of revolutionizing rural empowerment and digital inclusion throughout Karnataka. According to an a representative, the strategic collaboration seeks to use over 50,000 digital service centers to deliver comprehensive rural coverage across the state's 6,000 gram panchayats. According to a press statement, this collaboration will reach out to 5 lakh youth in the state. The initiative will offer 100% rural penetration of gram panchayats with solutions and self-employment opportunities.



India Secures Second Overseas Port: Sittwe Agreement Approved By MEA :-

India now has the authority to run Sittwe in Myanmar, a second overseas port in addition to Chabahar. An agreement to transfer management of the entire port situated on the Kaladan River to India Ports Global (IPGL) has been authorized by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA). The Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways owns all shares in IPGL. China and India are fighting each other to gain more economic clout in the Indian Ocean. Ports have become highly significant in this rivalry.

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KABIL And CSIR-IMMT Forge Alliance For Critical Minerals Advancement :-

Khanij Bidesh India Limited (KABIL) entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research - Institute of Minerals and Materials Technology (CSIR-IMMT) for Technical and Knowledge Cooperation in Critical Minerals. Under the terms of the MoU, KABIL will use CSIR-IMMT's technical expertise and services to complete a variety of projects, including the design and analysis of metallurgical test work plans, the development and review of process flowsheets, and the selection of process technologies for mineral processing, beneficiation, and metal extraction.



PhonePe Partners With ESewa, HAN Pokhara To Promote UPI In Nepal :-

PhonePe, a fintech company, has announced a partnership with Nepal's digital wallet provider eSewa and the Hotel Association of Nepal (HAN) Pokhara to promote digital payments via UPI on the Himalayan country's payment processor Fonepay Network. The partnership is part of Nepal's Fewa New Year Festival, which is being held from April 11 to 14. With kiosks showing how to use digital payments and other interactive activities, PhonePe along with eSewa and HAN Pokhara will showcase the ease of UPI (Unified Payments Interface) payments.



Amendment To India-Mauritius Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement :-

India and Mauritius recently filled another crack in their Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA), strengthening the vigilance on tax evasion on investments entering India. The most recent revision incorporates a Principal Purpose Test (PPT) to determine whether a foreign investor is truly qualified for treaty advantages, or if the tax benefit is the major purpose for routing investments through Mauritius. DTAA is a bilateral agreement aimed at preventing double taxation of income earned in one country (India) by residents of the other country (Mauritius).

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IMGC And Bank Of India Partner To Offer Mortgage Guarantee-Backed Home Loans:-

Bank of India and India Mortgage Guarantee Corporation (IMGC) have teamed to provide mortgage guaranteebacked home loan products to salaried and selfemployed consumers in the affordable housing segment. IMGC is India's first mortgage guarantee organization, with over 5,100 branches, and intends to offer customers more flexible and secure home loan products. With healthy growth in the affordable housing segment, this partnership aims to mitigate the risk of defaults for the bank and offer more favourable loan terms to its customers.



BEL signs MoU with IIT Mandi for cooperation in various fields :-

Bharat Electronics Ltd. (BEL), a defence PSU, has inked a memorandum of understanding with the Indian Institute of Technology, Mandi, to collaborate on research and technology, product development, semiconductors, quantum technologies, and drones. According to BEL, the MoU aims to use BEL and IIT-Mandi's complementary strengths and skills. "It will support indigenisation of products/solutions being supplied by BEL to its customers and is in line with the Government of India's 'Make in India' initiative," BEL said.



Apple And CleanMax Collaborate To Advance Renewable Energy In India :-

CleanMax, a major renewable energy firm, has formed a cooperation with tech behemoth Apple in an effort to promote sustainable energy practices. The alliance intends to speed the spread of renewable energy alternatives throughout India. CleanMax has successfully installed 14.4 megawatts of rooftop solar at six industrial locations across the country as part of this partnership. These installations are forecasted to curtail approximately 207,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions throughout their operational lifespan.

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IIT Delhi, armed forces sign MoU for novel medical device research :-

Armed Forces Medical Services and IIT-Delhi have joined forces to conduct collaborative research to develop breakthrough medical equipment and address health challenges unique to serving soldiers in diverse terrains. AFMS and the Indian Institute of Technology-Delhi signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to conduct collaborative research and training. "The scope of this MoU includes undertaking research and innovation to develop novel medical devices and focus on solving health issues specific to serving soldiers in varied terrains," the defence ministry said in a statement.



Aramco And FIFA Forge Global Partnership :-

In a historic declaration, Saudi Arabia's oil powerhouse, Aramco, and FIFA, the international football governing body, have formed a strategic global collaboration. The agreement, which runs until 2027, establishes Aramco as FIFA's Major Worldwide Partner exclusively in the energy sector, with sponsorship rights for big events such as the FIFA World Cup 2026 and the FIFA Women's World Cup 2027. Aramco's President & CEO, Amin Nasser, emphasized the company's commitment to leveraging sports, particularly football, as a vehicle for societal impact and community development.



Tata Motors signs MoU with South Indian Bank for commercial vehicle financing :-

Tata Motors announced a partnership with South Indian Bank to provide finance solutions to its commercial vehicle customers and dealerships. Under a part of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), South Indian Bank will provide financing options for the automaker's whole commercial vehicle portfolio, Tata Motors stated in a statement. Tata Motors sells an extensive range of sub 1-tonne to 55-tonne cargo vehicles and 10-seater to 51-seater mass mobility solutions, ranging in small commercial vehicles and pickups, trucks and buses.

Ms Sheyphali Sharan Takes Charge As Principal Director General, Press Information Bureau :-

Sheyphali B. Sharan, a senior IIS officer, succeeded Manish Desai as Principal Director General of the Press Information Bureau (PIB). Ms. Sharan is an Indian Information Service officer from the 1990 batch. Throughout her illustrious career spanning three decades, she has handled numerous roles, primarily overseeing media PR work as a Press Information Bureau officer for ministries such as Finance, Health and Family Welfare, and Information and Broadcasting. She has also served as the spokesperson for Election Commission of India (ECI).



Veteran Dealmaker Atul Mehra Joins Axis Capital As MD & CEO :-

Axis Capital has named Atul Mehra as its managing director (MD) and chief executive officer. The appointment is subject to receipt of the necessary permissions. Mehra, who formerly worked at JM Financial, would lead Axis Capital's investment banking and institutional equities businesses. His appointment follows the departure of Axis Capital's existing MD and co-CEO, Salil Pitale. In December, JM Financial roped in Chirag Negandhi — who was the co-CEO at Axis Capital — as its MD. Mehra is a veteran dealmaker with over three decades of experience and was the joint MD at JM Financial.



Sanjay Nayar Appointed As New ASSOCHAM President :-

Sanjay Nayar, Chairman of Sorin Investment Fund, has taken over as Assocham president for 2024-25, according to the industry group. He succeeds SpiceJet Chairman and Managing Director Ajay Singh, who served as the chamber's president. Nayar, the Founder and Chairman of Sorin Investment Fund, has four decades of expertise in global financial and capital markets, including 25 years

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at Citi and nearly 14 years at KKR India before retiring last year. He had established KKR India operations in 2009 after leaving Citigroup.



Meenesh Shah Elected As Chairman Of NCDFI :-

The National Cooperative Dairy Federation of India Limited (NCDFI), the top body of dairy cooperatives, has chosen Meenesh Shah as chairman. SJVN Awarded For Outstanding Corporate Social Responsibility :-



HDFC Bank looking to sell its 100% stake in HDFC Education and Development Services :-

HDFC Bank has chosen to sell its whole stake in HDFC Education and Development Services Private Limited. The transaction would be carried out via the Swiss challenge technique, according to HDFC Bank's regulatory filing. HDFC Bank will finalise the purchaser once the Swiss challenge procedure is completed, it said, adding that the bank and the selected bidder will then

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enter into definitive documentation for the purposes. HDFC Education is engaged in providing services to three education schools, it said.



J&K Bank Introduces Virtual ATM Facility In Collaboration With Paymart India :-

J&K Bank has established a cooperation with Paymart India Pvt Ltd to launch a Virtual ATM (VATM) facility. The cooperation intends to provide cardless cash withdrawals to the Bank's customers through local retailers. The collaboration's purpose is to improve banking convenience for its customers across its activities, particularly in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh. The move is to leverage technology to enhance banking accessibility and convenience for the bank customers.



RBI Imposes Penalties On IDFC First Bank And LIC Housing Finance :-

The Reserve Bank announced that it has imposed a penalty of Rs 1 crore on IDFC First Bank and Rs 49.70 lakh on LIC Housing Finance for violating certain regulations. The penalty was imposed on IDFC First Bank for failing to comply with specified guidelines on 'Loans and Advances - Statutory and Other Restrictions', according to the central bank's statement. In another statement, it said the penalty on LIC Housing Finance has been levied for non-compliance with certain provisions of the 'Non-Banking Financial Company - Housing Finance Company (Reserve Bank) Directions, 2021' issued by RBI.



Singapore Tourism Board, PhonePe sign MoU to boost UPI for Indian tourists :-

In an effort to encourage UPI transactions for Indian tourists visiting Singapore, the Singapore Tourism Board (STB) and leading fintech company PhonePe have signed a two-year Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). The partnership between the Bengaluru-based company and the tourism board expands upon the current Unified Payments Interface (UPI) connection between Singapore and India. It allows customers to instantly make crossborder transactions between the two countries directly from their existing Indian bank accounts.

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SBI billed govt Rs 10.68 crore as 'commission' for electoral bonds :-

A national daily reported that the State Bank of India (SBI) charged the Finance Ministry a total of Rs 10.68 crore as "commission" for the sale and redemption of electoral bonds between 2018 and 2024. The story cited communication between the two organizations to reach this point. This amount was charged across 30 phases of the electoral bond scheme, with fees ranging from Rs 1.82 lakh for the fourth phase to Rs 1.25 crore for the ninth phase before the 2019 Lok Sabha elections.



SIDBI Partners With KarmaLife To Offer Micro Loans For Gig Workers :-

Small Industries Development Bank of India (SIDBI) has signed an agreement with fintech Onion Life Private Limited to leverage the latter's technology platform KarmaLife in a pilot program to provide micro loans to gig workers. This is expected to improve gig workers' access to formal institutional finance. KarmaLife will allow gig workers receive micro loans via a smartphone app, eliminating the need for significant paperwork or physical documentation. This streamlined process will make it easier for gig workers to manage the liquidity needs of their enterprise activities.



Mudra Loans Surge Past ₹5 Lakh Crore Mark In FY24 :-

According to the most recent government data, small business loans under the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY) saw record increase in disbursals in FY24 and also passed the ₹5 lakh crore milestone. The amount of loans approved in the most recent fiscal year was ₹5.28 lakh crore. In the fiscal year that concluded in March 2024, the total disbursals were ₹5.20 lakh, compared to ₹4.40 lakh crore in the preceding fiscal year. Nearly 70 per cent of the beneficiaries of these loans are women. Mudra loans are extended in three categories — Shishu (up to ₹50,000), Kishor (above ₹50,000 and up to ₹5 lakh) and Tarun (above ₹5 lakh and up to ₹10 lakh).



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ICICI Lombard Partners With Policybazaar To Expand Insurance Distribution :-

ICICI Lombard, a private general insurance firm, and Policybazaar, an insurance marketplace, have formed a strategic relationship. The alliance would combine ICICI Lombard's product portfolio with Policybazaar's reach to provide accessible insurance solutions to nearly one crore clients, the companies said in a joint statement. The integration will extend across multiple business lines of the Policybazaar platform, including retail audiences, corporates, and channel partners, the companies said.



HDFC Bank Becomes First Private Bank To Open Branch In Lakshadweep :-

HDFC Bank, a commercial lender, has built a branch on Kavaratti Island in Lakshadweep, becoming the only private sector bank to do so in the union territory. This branch aims to improve the Union Territory's financial infrastructure by providing a diverse range of services, with a focus on personal banking and digital banking, which includes bespoke digital solutions for retailers, such as QR-based transactions. HDFC Bank has branches in the cold climes of Kashmir, the southern tip of Kanyakumari and now the island of Lakshadweep - a prominent tourist place.



Neobank Revolut India Receives In-Principle Approval For PPI License From RBI :-

Tiger Global and Softbank backed neobank Revolut India has got in-principle approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to begin issuing Prepaid Payment Instruments (PPI), such as prepaid cards and wallets, according to CEO Paroma Chatterjee's Linkedin post. This license expands on Revolut India's existing RBI licences, letting it to operate as a Category-II Authorised Money Exchange Dealer (AD II) for issuing multi-currency forex cards and providing cross-border remittance services. The RBI nod is expected to strengthen Revolut's position as a key player in that space.



MUFG To Acquire 20% Stake In HDB Financial Services :-

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According to reports, Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi UFJ (MUFG) is buying a 20% share in HDB Financial Services, a non-banking subsidiary of HDFC Bank, for \$9-10 billion ahead of its anticipated IPO. The acquisition is expected to be completed for 5 times the book value, and once revealed, it will be one of the largest transactions in India's shadow banking market. A non-deposit-taking lender, HDB Financial could fetch a valuation in the range of \$9 billion to \$12 billion (₹75,000 crore to ₹1 lakh crore) during the IPO, contingent upon prevailing market conditions.



RBI's Ban On Bank Of Baroda World App :-



RBI turns down two small finance banks' applications after finding them not suitable :-

The Reserve Bank of India has rejected two additional applications to establish small financing banks, Dvara Kshetriya Gramin Financial Services and Tally Solutions Private, the central bank announced in a statement. Dvara Kshetriya Gramin Financial Services applied for a small bank licence in April 2021, while Tally Solutions applied in August 2021. "Based on the assessment of the applications, they were not found suitable for granting of in-principle approval to set up a small finance bank," the RBI said, adding that the remaining two applications are under examination.

The Finance Ministry is apparently proposing more stringent measures to safeguard citizens from online fraud. This follows a spike in occurrences, including the recent Bank of Baroda World app scam. These measures are reportedly part of a larger national effort to tackle cybercrime. In 2023 alone, India's National Crime Records Bureau reported over 1.1 million cyber fraud cases worth a staggering Rs 7,488.63 crore (\$8.9 billion). To address this growing threat, the Ministry of Home Affairs established the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C).



RBI Penalizes Five Co-Operative Banks With Rs 60.3 Lakh Fine :-

The Reserve Bank levied penalties of Rs 60.3 lakh on five cooperative banks for violating various regulatory norms.

Rajkot Nagarik Sahakari Bank faces a penalty of Rs 43.30 lakh for failing to comply with RBI guidelines. The central bank has imposed a monetary penalty of Rs 5 lakh each on The Kangra Co-operative Bank (New Delhi), Rajdhani Nagar Sahkari Bank (Lucknow), and Zila Sahakari Bank, Garhwal (Kotdwar, Uttarakhand). Besides, a penalty of Rs 2 lakh has been imposed on District Co-operative Bank (Dehradun).







CRED Secures In-Principle Approval For Payment Aggregator License :-

According to persons familiar with the matter, fintech firm Cred has acquired in-principle approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for its payment aggregation (PA) business. Once final clearance is received, the Peak XV-backed Bengaluru-based startup, which primarily operates a credit card bill payment platform for creditworthy consumers, will be able to expand into the merchant payments market, joining Razorpay and Cashfree. It usually takes about six months after the inprinciple nod for a company to get the final approval from the RBI.

Aegon Life Insurance rebranded as Bandhan Life :-

Bandhan Financial Holdings has formally acquired Aegon Life Insurance, which will now be renamed Bandhan Life. Bandhan Life will hire 1,000 new staff as part of its immediate "aggressive growth strategy," strengthening its commitment to expanding its customer base and providing excellent service, according to the company. The updated product names, such as Bandhan Life iTerm Prime, reflect this new direction, inviting customers to explore the company's enhanced offerings on its website, said the company.



Kotak Mahindra Bank Share Plunges 10% On RBI Action :-

Shares of Kotak Mahindra Bank fell 10% on April 25, a day after the Reserve Bank of India prohibited the private sector lender from onboarding clients through online channels and issuing credit cards. Analysts believe that the central bank's action may have an impact on Kotak's retail operations and stock price sentiment. The bank has seen a significant number of savings accounts opened using its 811 digital platform, and the majority of unsecured products processed digitally. The digital segments have shown an impressive growth of 40 percent on-year, outpacing the overall growth rate of 18 percent.



BharatPe Introduces BharatPe One: Revolutionizing Payment Solutions :-

BharatPe has introduced a payment device that integrates POS, QR code, and speaker functionality. The payments firm will launch BharatPe One in 100 cities and grow to another 450 in six months. BharatPe One will simplify transactions for merchants by providing flexible payment acceptance choices like as dynamic and static QR codes, POS, and speaker capabilities, according to the company. The device is part of BharatPe's suite of simple, easy-to-use, and secure fintech products, which includes payments and business loans for its merchant partners.



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
Vocalist Nagamani Srinath's book "Antaraalada Alaapane" to be released on April 7 :-

role they can play in its survival and thriving in the coming era.








Book on India's road to renaissance launched in Hyderabad :-


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stagnation and societal challenges facing the Indian Republic," he said. The launch also featured a panel of experts and retired bureaucrats, including Jaya Prakash Narayana.

The launch of AeroSpace Services India (ASI) aligns with the 'Make in India' and 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' policies of the Indian government, it stated. "This also shows the commitment to a strong partnership between IAI and DRDO in developing and supporting advanced systems for the Indian armed forces," the statement said. IAI boasts a workforce of approximately 50 employees, with 97 per cent being Indian nationals.



"Indian Defence Exports crossed Rs 21,000 crore mark for the first time", says Defence Minister Rajnath Singh :-

Union Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said on social media that the country's defence exports have reached historic heights, surpassing Rs 21,000 crore for the first time in Independent India's history. According to a statement released by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, India's defence exports increased to a stunning Rs 21,083 crore in fiscal year 2023-24, a 32.5 percent increase over the previous year. India's defence exports span across 84 countries and regions worldwide.



IAF's 10-Day Mega Exercise 'Gagan Shakti' Being Held From April 1 :-

The Indian Air Force (IAF) began a 10-day Gagan Shakti war training on April 1 to test its capabilities. The Indian Army will provide logistical assistance for the major exercise, which will take place around the country,

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notably at the Pokhran Field Firing Range in Jaisalmer. According to an official statement, "The Indian Army has facilitated a comprehensive pan-India movement of approximately 10,000 IAF personnel and ammunition in order to validate the Operational Rail Mobilisation Plan (ORMP) aspects of the IAF."



New generation ballistic missile Agni-Prime successfully flight-tested :-

According to a notice issued by the Ministry of Defence, RSI India successfully tested the new generation ballistic missile Agni-Prime from the APJ Abdul Kalam Island off the coast of Odisha. "The test met all the trial objectives validating its reliable performance, as confirmed from the data captured by a number of range sensors deployed at different locations, including two downrange ships placed at the terminal point," it said. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh extended his congratulations to DRDO, SFC, and the Armed Forces for the test's success.



DRDO Initiates Project For Test Centre In West Bengal :-

According to officials, the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has begun implementing a project in Junput village, West Bengal, to create a modest test site for the country's armed systems. Junput, like Odisha's Chandipur, known for its Integrated Test Range (ITR), is located on the Bay of Bengal. Since its inception, the DRDO has aimed at designing and developing state-of-the-art sensors, weapon systems, platforms and allied equipment in defence and security domains of land, air, sea, space and cyber, an official said.



Army Inducts Akashteer System :-

To improve its air defense capabilities, the Indian Army has started implementing control and reporting systems under 'Project Akashteer'. This project intends to provide the force with an unprecedented level of situational awareness and control in order to safeguard the safety of friendly aircraft while engaging hostile aircraft in contested airspace. Developed by Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) as part of the 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' initiative, this project is poised to significantly enhance the operational efficiency and integration of the Army's air defense mechanisms.

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Cochin Shipyard becomes US Navy's latest docking station :-

According to a new deal, US military ships will now dock and undergo repairs at Cochin Shipyard as part of a broader naval cooperation framework agreed upon by India and the US during last year's G20 summit. Officials from Cochin Shipyard, a Government of India undertaking, signed a Master Shipyard Repair Agreement (MSRA) with the United States Navy effective from April 5, 2024, as part of a bigger plan for India to support the US' forward naval presence in Asia. Cochin Shipyard is the third port to sign the agreement with the US Navy.



Indian Army Enhances Air Defence With Igla-S MANPADS :-

As part of a wider arrangement that includes local production in India, the Indian Army has received the first batch of 24 Igla-S Man Portable Air Defence Systems (MANPADS) made in Russia together with 100 missiles. The Indian Army is acquiring the Igla-S system in order to improve its Very Short Range Air Defence (VSHORAD) capabilities. Compared to the lesser emergency purchase made in 2021, this procurement is significant, according to sources in the defense establishment. The Igla-S is a hand-held defence system that can be operated by an individual or crew.



India-Kazakhstan To Enhance Counter-Terror Cooperation In Response To Moscow Attacks :-

India and Kazakhstan, its close Central Asian partner, have reviewed counter-terrorism concerns and discussed cross-border terrorism in South Asia. The conference was significant in light of the recent terror incident in Russia carried out by extremists of Central Asian descent who may have been influenced by Pakistan-based seminaries. The Indian delegation was led by Joint Secretary (CT), Ministry of External Affairs, KD Dewal; while the Kazakh delegation was spearheaded by Talgat Kaliyev, Ambassador-at-Large, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Kazakhstan.

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Indian Army Conducts Anti-Tank Guided Missile Training Exercise In Sikkim :-

The Indian Army's Trishakti Corps performed an anti-tank guided missile (ATGM) training exercise at a super-high altitude of 17,000 feet in Sikkim. Missile Firing Detachments from Mechanized and Infantry Units across Eastern Command took part in the training exercise, according to a defense ministry statement. "The training exercise encompassed comprehensive continuity training and live firing from different platforms on moving as well as static targets depicting battlefield conditions," the ministry said.



India-Uzbekistan Joint Military Exercise DUSTLIK 2024 :-

The fifth iteration of the India-Uzbekistan Joint Military Exercise Dustlik will begin on April 15 in Uzbekistan's Termez District, according to an Indian Army release. During the exercise, contingents from the Indian Armed Forces and the Armed Forces of the Republic of Uzbekistan will train together. The fourth edition of the joint military exercise between the Indian Army and Uzbekistan Army was held on February 20 last year at the Foreign Training Node, Pithoragarh in Uttarakhand.



Army carries out field trials of anti-tank guided missile weapon system :-

The Indian Army has successfully conducted field trials of its indigenously built man-portable anti-tank guided missile (MPATGM) weapon system, opening the road for its integration into the force's arsenal. The Defense Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) created and developed the weapon system, according to officials. The MPATG weapon system has been field evaluated in different flight configurations several times with an objective of proving the technology with high superiority, the defence ministry said.

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DRDO Successfully Test Fires Indigenous Technology Cruise Missile :-

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) reported an adequate flight test of a "long range subsonic indigenously developed cruise missile" from the Integrated Test Range (ITR) at Chandipur, off the coast of Odisha. "The missile followed the desired path using waypoint navigation and demonstrated very low altitude sea-skimming flight. During the test, all subsystems performed as per expectation," DRDO said in a statement. The details or the specifications of the missile were not mentioned but the missile looked a lot similar to the Nirbhay subsonic cruise missile that has been tested several times.



Vice Admiral Dinesh Kumar Tripathi Appointed As Next Chief Of The Naval Staff :-

Vice Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi has been named the new Chief of the Naval Staff. He will take over the role on April 30, after Admiral R Hari Kumar retires from duty. Vice Admiral Dinesh Kumar Tripathi, born on May 15, 1964, joined the Indian Navy's Executive Branch on July 1, 1985. He has been in the service for about 39 years and specializes in communication and electronic warfare. The most senior officer in the Indian Navy has served in various positions, including most recently as Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief of the Western Naval Command.



Indian Navy conducted Exercise Poorvi Lehar on East Coast:-

Indian Navy conducted Exercise Poorvi Lehar on East Coast under the Operational Control of The Flag Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Eastern Naval Command. The exercise aimed at validation of procedures towards assessment of Indian Navy's preparedness to meet Maritime Security challenges in the region. The Exercise offered valuable lessons to participating forces operating under realistic conditions, thereby enhancing their readiness to respond effectively to maritime challenges in the region.

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Army developing missile systems to counter threats along China, Pakistan borders :-

In an effort to strengthen the country's defense capabilities against threats from enemy drones and fighter jets, the Indian Army is working on two critical programs to build indigenous shoulder-fired air defense missiles. These programs aim to improve the armed forces' readiness to counter potential threats along China and Pakistan's borders by delivering 350 launchers and around 2,000 missiles to Army and Air Force troops. The first project focuses on the development of a highly effective laser beam riding Very Short Range Air Defence System (VSHORADS).



IAF holds investiture ceremony at National War Memorial:-

The Air Force Investiture Ceremony was held on 26 April 2024 near the Param Yodha Sthal, which is a part of the National War Memorial (NWM) complex in New Delhi. The ceremony began with the awardees paying homage to the fallen heroes of the country by laying a wreath at the Amar Chakra of the NWM. This solemn ceremony was followed by the Chief of the Air Staff, Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari, conferring Presidential awards to 51 air warriors. This is the first time that any service conducted its Investiture Ceremony in the NWM complex.

8: Economy



SBI Foundation signs MoU with ICAR-IIRR :-

An agreement has been reached between the Indian Council of Agriculture Research–Indian Institute of Rice Research (ICAR–IIRR), Hyderabad, and SBI Foundation, the CSR arm of State Bank of India, regarding the promotion of direct seeded rice (DSR). As an alternative to the conventional technique of raising seedlings in a

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nursery before moving them into flooded fields, direct seeding involves planting rice seeds straight into the field. The shift from transplanted rice to the DSR will result in multiple savings, including irrigation water, as well as reduce cost of cultivation and crop duration.



Indian Oil And Panasonic Partner For Lithium-Ion Cell Manufacturing In India :-

Indian Oil said that it has signed a binding term sheet with Panasonic Energy Co. to establish a framework for forming a joint venture to manufacture cylindrical lithium-ion cells in India. The agreement was reached in anticipation of rising demand for batteries for two- and three-wheel vehicles, as well as energy storage systems, in Indian markets. Both the companies are engaged in feasibility study regarding the utilization of battery technology to facilitate the transition to clean energy in India, with the aim of finalizing details of their collaboration by the summer of this year.



Adani Green Energy Ltd Surpasses 10,000 MW Operating Portfolio :-

Adani Green Energy Ltd said that it has commissioned 2,000 MW of solar power at the massive Khavda solar park in Gujarat, making it India's first company with more than 10,000 MW of renewable energy capacity. The company presently has India's largest operating portfolio, totaling 10,934 MW. According to a corporate statement, it brought 2,848 MW of renewables capacity on stream in fiscal year 24. AGEL's operational portfolio consists of 7,393 MW solar, 1,401 MW wind and 2,140 MW wind-solar hybrid capacity. The firm is aiming for 45 GW renewable energy by 2030.



RBI Monetary Policy, Repo Rate To Remain Steady For Seventh Time :-

Governor Shaktikanta Das said on April 5 that the RBI Monetary Policy Committee has agreed by a 5:1 majority to leave policy rates unchanged. He also stated that core inflation had steadily fallen. It is the first bi-monthly monetary policy for 2024-25. The Governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) also indicated that the MSF and bank rates will remain at 6.75%. The Governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has left the policy rate unchanged at 6.5%. As RBI has held key policy rates steady, the EMIs on home and auto loans are likely to remain stable for some more time. The central bank has kept interest rates unchanged since February, 2023.

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RBI Postpones Implementation Of New Rules For Exchange-Traded Forex Derivatives :-

The RBI has delayed the implementation of new restrictions on exchange-traded currency derivatives by one month, leaving traders scurrying to square off their positions. The RBI's circular, which was set to go into effect on April 5, stated that only traders with underlying forex exposure could trade currency derivatives. Companies can use exchange-traded currency derivatives, such as futures contracts, to hedge against currency risk. The circular, issued on Jan 5, retained most of the earlier regulations, including a requirement that trades over \$100 million would require proof of exposure.



Ashneer Grover Ventures Into Fintech With ZeroPe Medical Loan App :-

Ashneer Grover, co-founder of BharatPe and previous managing director, is gearing up for a new venture in the fintech space with ZeroPe, a medical lending app. According to its Google Play store listing, Third Unicorn developed ZeroPe, which is now in the testing phase. In conjunction with Mukut Finvest, a Delhi-based nonbanking financial company (NBFC), the ZeroPe app will offer quick pre-approved medical loans of up to Rs 500,000. The service is exclusively available at partnered hospitals, as mentioned on the ZeroPe app website.



India's retail inflation eases to 10-month low of 4.85 per cent in March :-

India's retail inflation fell to 4.85 percent on an annual basis in March, down from 5.09 percent the previous month, according to the ET department. A Reuters survey predicted that the figure would fall to 4.91 percent. The figure has maintained within the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) tolerance range of 2 to 6 percent. The inflation in the food basket was at 8.52 per cent in March, down from 8.66 per cent in February, reported PTI, citing the National Statistical Office (NSO). The official data is yet to be released by the government.



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Government Sets Coal Production Target At 170 Million Tonnes For FY25 :-

The government has set a target of 170 million tons of coal from captive and commercial coal blocks in the country for the current fiscal year. In FY24, captive and commercial coal blocks produced 147.12 million tonnes (MT) of dry fuel, a 26% increase from 116 MT generated throughout FY23. Out of the total output of 147.2 MT in FY24, power sector captive mines produced around 121.3 MT, captive mines of the non-power sector produced 8.4 MT while commercial mines generated 17.5 MT of fuel.



LIC Increases Equity Stake In Hindustan Unilever By Over 5% :-

The Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) announced that its shareholding in FMCG major Hindustan Unilever Limited (HUL) has surpassed 5%. The Corporation boosted its stake in Hindustan Unilever Limited from 11,74,63,555 to 11,77,18,555 equity shares, representing 4.99 percent to 5.01 percent of the company's paid-up capital, according to a regulatory filing. According to the Corporation, it purchased extra shares on the open market as part of its normal business operations. Holding in the company touched 5 per cent and the acquisition of shares was done on April 12 at an average cost of Rs 2,248.59 per unit.



Adani family infuses Rs 20,000 crore in Ambuja Cements, raises stake to 70.3% :-

Billionaire Gautam Adani's family invested an additional ERSITRS 8,339 crore in Ambuja Cements, increasing its ownership to 70.3%, to boost the cement maker's manufacturing capacity. The Adani family had earlier invested Rs 5,000 crore in the company on October 18, 2022 and Rs 6,661 crore on March 28, 2024. The additional investment brings the company's projected infusion of Rs 20,000 crore to completion, according to a statement. The fund infusion will help Ambuja accelerate its growth ambitions to almost double its existing capacity to 140 million tonnes per annum by 2028 from 76.1 million tonnes as of December 31.



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Net Direct Tax collections for Financial Year 2023-24 exceed Union Budget Estimates:-

The provisional figures of Direct Tax collections for the Financial Year (FY) 2023-24 show that Net collections are at Rs. 19.58 lakh crore, compared to Rs. 16.64 lakh crore in the preceding Financial Year i.e. FY 2022-23, representing an increase of 17.70%. The Budget Estimates (BE) for Direct Tax revenue in the Union Budget for FY 2023- 24 were fixed at Rs. 18.23 lakh crore which were revised and the Revised Estimates (RE) were fixed at Rs. 19.45 lakh crore. The provisional Direct Tax collections (net of the refunds) have exceeded the BE by 7.40% and RE by 0.67%.



Karnataka And Gujarat Lead India's Clean Energy Transition: Report :-

According to a new assessment, while Karnataka and Gujarat remain at the forefront of the clean energy transition, states such as Jharkhand, Bihar, West Bengal, and Uttar Pradesh must speed up their efforts. The Institute for Energy Economics and Financial Analysis (IEEFA) and renewable energy think tank Ember collaborated on a paper that assesses subnational clean electricity transition preparation. The report's authors said Karnataka and Gujarat continue their strong performance across dimensions, effectively integrating renewable energy sources into their power sectors, making strong strides in decarbonisation.



Target is to achieve \$1 trillion goods exports by 2030: Commerce Ministry :-

The Commerce Ministry has launched an exercise to figure out the necessary building needs, potential sectors, and clusters that will help the country meet its \$1 trillion merchandise export target by 2030, but sustainability will be a major concern in the future, according to senior government officials. This comes a day after the European Parliament voted for a new law that will require larger companies operating in the bloc to check if their supply chains use forced labour or cause environmental damage and act to take action if they do.



China's share in India's industrial goods imports jump to 30% from 21% in last 15 years :-

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With India's growing reliance on Chinese industrial goods such as communications, equipment, and electronics, Beijing's share of New Delhi's imports of such goods increased to 30% from 21% in the previous 15 years, according to a research. According to a paper released by the economic think tank Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI), the expanding trade deficit with China is cause for alarm, and the strategic ramifications of this dependency are far-reaching, affecting not just economic but also national security dimensions. In 2023-24, India's total merchandise imports amounted to USD 677.2 billion, with USD 101.8 billion of that coming from China.

Romania And Bulgaria Partially Join Schengen Travel Zone :-

Romania and Bulgaria have partially joined Europe's IDcheck-free travel zone, marking a new step in the two nations' integration into the EU. After years of discussions to join the so-called Schengen area, travelers coming by air or water can finally enter freely. Land border checks will continue in place, owing to opposition, particularly from Austria, which has long resisted their request because to fears over illicit migration. After years of negotiations to join the socalled Schengen area, there is now free access for travellers arriving by air or sea.



Congo Appoints First Female Prime Minister Amid Eastern Violence :-

President Felix Tshisekedi of the Democratic Republic of Congo has named the country's first female Prime Minister, fulfilling a campaign pledge and taking a key step toward forming a new cabinet after being reelected late last year. Former Planning Minister Judith Suminwa Tuluka will take up the position at a time of rising instability in the country's mineral-rich east, which borders Rwanda. The long-running conflict has displaced more than 7 million people according to the United Nations, making it one of the world's worst humanitarian crises.



Zimbabwe Declares State Of Disaster Over Devastating Drought :-

Zimbabwe has declared a state of calamity in response to the severe drought that is affecting a large portion of southern Africa, along with Zambia and Malawi. President Emmerson Mnangagwa issued the emergency

declaration in a speech, requesting two billion dollars (£1.6 billion) in humanitarian relief. He said more than 80% of the country had received "below-normal rainfall" due to an "El Nino-induced drought". El Nino is a naturally occurring climatic phenomenon that warms parts of the Pacific Ocean every two to seven years.



Bilquis becomes first Indian woman appointed as jury for Paris Olympics :-

Bilquis Mir of Jammu and Kashmir is set to make history as the first Indian woman to serve on a jury at the forthcoming Summer Olympics in Paris, which will take place from July 26 to August 11 of this year. The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) notified the Jammu and Kashmir administration of her appointment as a jury member for the Paris Games in a letter. Expressing her gratitude after being appointed as a jury member for the prestigious Summer Olympics, Bilquis said it is a dream come true, as the Olympics represents the ultimate destination for athletes and sports promoters like herself.



Peter Pellegrini Wins Slovakia Presidential Elections :-

Peter Pellegrini, a government supporter renowned for his skepticism toward Ukraine, won the Slovakia presidential election, defeating pro-Western diplomat Ivan Korcok. Korcok received 47% of the vote to former Prime Minister Pellegrini's 53%. The election was dominated by opposing viewpoints on the Ukraine situation, with Russia's invasion playing a large role, with Pellegrini pressing for peace talks in contrast to the dividing views within Slovak politics. Mr. Pellegrini becomes Slovakia's sixth President since the country gained independence after the split of Czechoslovakia in 1993.



Simon Harris Becomes Ireland's Youngest Prime Minister :-

Simon Harris became Ireland's new prime minister, succeeding Leo Varadkar, who abruptly resigned last month for personal and political reasons. The Irish parliament voted 88 to 69 in favor of Mr. Harris, 37. He was officially installed later in a ceremony alongside President Michael D. Higgins, becoming the country's youngest prime minister. Mr. Varadkar, who was in his second stint as prime minister and at 45 was one of Europe's youngest leaders, said last month that he felt he was no longer the "best person" to lead the country.

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Israel Deploys C-Dome Defense System Against Aerial Threat Near Eilat :-

Israel used its ship-mounted defense system, known as the C-Dome, for the first time to intercept a "suspicious" target that entered the country's airspace near the southern city of Eilat, according to the military. The C-Dome is a naval version of the Iron Dome air defense system, designed to protect against rocket and missile attacks. Earlier, the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) reported an alert in the area of Eilat, which was targeted in February by intercepted ballistic missile fire from Yemen's Houthi rebels, allies of Palestinian militants Hamas.



UK's First Woman High Commissioner To India: Lindy Cameron :-

Lindy Cameron has been appointed as the first woman from United Kingdom to serve as High Commissioner to India. She is anticipated to join later this month. "Lindy Cameron CB OBE has been appointed British High Commissioner to the Republic of India in succession to Alex Ellis CMG who will be transferring to another diplomatic service appointment," a British government statement said. While Cameron is UK's first woman envoy to India, Delhi has had three women envoys in London since the 1950s.



Russia's Successful Angara-A5 Rocket Test Launch :-

Russia successfully test-launched its Angara-A5 space rocket from the Vostochny Cosmodrome in the Far East, placing a test load into low orbit as part of an effort to create a new post-Soviet launch vehicle. The test launch of Russia's first post-Soviet space rocket, the Angara-A5, was intended to highlight Moscow's aspirations to be a major space power, as well as the growing importance of Vostochny, located in the woods of Russia's Far East. The defence ministry is also involved in the project.



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India Donates Ambulances And School Buses To Nepal :-

India has contributed 35 ambulances and 66 school buses to various Nepalese NGOs, therefore improving local health and education facilities. Naveen Srivastava, the Indian Ambassador to Nepal, handed off the vehicles to Nepalese officials during a ceremony attended by Finance Minister Barshaman Pun. Out of 101 vehicles, two ambulances were handed over on location in the earthquake-affected Jajarkot and West Rukum districts by the representative of the Embassy of India in the presence of district officials and local residents.



Kristalina Georgieva Re-Appointed As IMF Managing Director:-

The IMF executive board confirmed Kristalina Georgieva's reappointment to lead the international financial agency for a second five-year term. After her current term ends on September 30, 2024, Ms. Georgieva, who was the only contender to manage the International Monetary Fund, will remain in office as a result of the decision. The decision was taken by consensus, the IMF said in a statement confirming the board's decision. Ms. Georgieva, a 70-year-old Bulgarian, has run the IMF since 2019.



Kuwait Names Ahmad Abdullah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah As New Prime Minister:-

Kuwait's Emir has nominated Ahmad Abdullah al-Ahmad al-Sabah as Prime Minister. Former Prime Minister Sheikh Mohammed Sabah al-Salem al-Sabah resigned in April, barely a few months after being appointed to form a government. His resignation was a procedural act, as a new parliament was elected that month, the fourth since December 2020. The OPEC producer, which bans political parties, has one of the most open political systems in the Gulf, though the emir has the final say in state matters.



General Manoj Pande Inaugurates High-Tech IT Lab At Academy Of Armed Forces In Uzbekistan :-

During his recent visit to Uzbekistan, Indian Army Chief Gen. Manoj Pande opened a state-of-the-art IT

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laboratory facility at the Uzbek Academy of Armed Forces, which also includes a cutting-edge cybersecurity lab, sources said. The development marks a watershed moment in bilateral defence cooperation, after a commitment made at the Defence Ministers' meeting in September 2018, according to Indian Army sources. The establishment of the IT lab is expected to enrich the training resources available to the Uzbek armed forces.



North Korea announced it launched a "super-large" cruise missile warhead and a new anti-aircraft missile in a western coastal area as it increases its military capabilities amid rising tensions with the United States and South Korea. North Korean official media reported that the country's missile agency conducted a "power test" for the warhead built for the Hwasal-1 Ra-3 strategic cruise missile, as well as a test launch of the Pyoljji-1-2 antiaircraft missile. It said the tests attained an unspecified "certain goal." Photos released by the North's official Korean Central News Agency showed at least two missiles being fired off launcher trucks at a runway.

India delivers first batch of BrahMos to Philippines :-

India delivered the first batch of BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles to Philippines on 19 April 2024. In January 2022, Philippines concluded a \$375-million deal with India for three batteries of shore-based, anti-ship variant of the BrahMos becoming the first export customer for the joint venture missile between India and Russia. Specifics of the delivery made were not immediately available. Philippines is acquiring the systems under the Horizon 2 of the Revised Armed Forces of the Philippines Modernization Programme.



North Korea Tests New Missiles: Increasing Tensions :-

Google fires over 20 more employees over protest against contract with Israeli govt, Project Nimbus :-

According to The Verge, Google has dismissed more than 20 employees as a result of sit-in protests at its offices in California and New York. This comes after the firm removed 28 employees, raising the total number of employees fired for protesting to almost 50. The protests were against Google's \$1.2 billion Project Nimbus, a cloud computing collaboration with the Israeli government. Google's CEO, Sundar Pichai, has reminded employees that while the company encourages open debate and discussion, there are limits to this.

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India-Kuwait Relations Strengthened With Inaugural Hindi Radio Broadcast :-

The Indian Embassy in Kuwait announced that the first Hindi radio transmission has begun in Kuwait. The Indian Embassy in Kuwait praised Kuwait's Ministry of Information for launching a Hindi programming on Kuwait Radio on FM 93.3 and AM 96.3 every Sunday. This measure will boost the two countries' relations even more. The Indian community with a strength of around 1 million is the largest expatriate community in Kuwait and is regarded as the community of first preference among the expatriate communities, according to Indian Embassy in Kuwait.



UK's India Gate To Honour Role Of Indian Soldiers Who Fought In Two World Wars :-

A municipal council in Brighton, south-east England, has approved plans for an annual multi-faith event to honor the role of Indian soldiers in the two World Wars at the town's India Gate memorial beginning in October. It was unveiled on October 26, 1921, by the Maharaja of Patiala, Bhupinder Singh, and is located at the southern entrance of the Royal Pavilion, one of three buildings in Brighton that served as a base hospital for these undivided Indian soldiers wounded on the Western Front. These included soldiers from the modern-day countries of India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, Myanmar and Bhutan.



Prabowo Subianto Declared Indonesia's President-Elect Amid Controversy :-

Indonesia's electoral commission declared Prabowo Subianto president-elect in a ceremony after the country's top court dismissed challenges to his overwhelming victory filed by two losing presidential contenders. Mr. Subianto, who is presently the defense minister, won the election with 58.6% of the vote, or more than 96 million ballots, more than doubling the total received by the other two contenders. But his rivals alleged that his victory had depended on large-scale fraud and widespread state interference.

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U.S. Places India On Priority Watch List For IP Protection :-

The US administration's 2024 Special 301 Report has placed India on the Priority Watch List because it continues to be "one of the world's most challenging" big economies in terms of intellectual property (IP) protection and enforcement. According to a Business Standard study, India continues to face a number of longstanding issues, including insufficient IP enforcement, high rates of online piracy, a large trademark opposition backlog, and insufficient legal mechanisms to safeguard trade secrets.



Iran unveils new 'kamikaze' drone:-

The Iranian military on April 28 presented a new attack drone designed to fly into targets and explode, like the kind used by Russia in the war in Ukraine. This new Iranian drone is similar to the Russian Zala Lancet drone, which was first produced in 2020. Iranian Shahed drones have been used by Russian forces in air attacks in Ukraine. After Iran's recent air attack on Israel, the United States, United Kingdom, and Canada imposed new sanctions on Tehran targeting the production and export of drones.



Dubai to build world's largest airport with 400 terminal gates :-

Dubai's ruler Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al-Maktoum on 28 April announced that his government has approved the designs for the new passenger terminals at Al Maktoum International Airport worth \$34.85 billion. The Al Maktoum International Airport will be the largest in the world having a capacity of handling up to 260 million passengers. It will be five times the size of the current Dubai International Airport. With five parallel runways, the airport will accommodate 400 terminal gates.



20 Soldiers Killed In Explosion At Army Base In Cambodia :-

Prime Minister Hun Manet announced that twenty Cambodian troops were killed in an ammunition explosion at an army facility in the country's west. The explosion, which also injured multiple soldiers, occurred in the afternoon at an army post in Kampong Speu province, Hun Manet said in a Facebook statement, without providing any other information. "I am deeply shocked to receive the news of the ammunition explosion incident," Hun Manet said, expressing his "deepest condolences" to the families of those killed.

Isro launches 'START' training program for space science enthusiasts :-

In an effort to interest young people in the subject of space science and technology, Isro has launched a new introductory-level online training program called "Space Science and Technology Awareness Training (START)." Students pursuing physical sciences and technology at the graduate and final year undergraduate levels are the target in particular. The START 2024 program will be carried out by the space agency in April and May. The training will also focus on the cross-disciplinary nature of space science, giving students insights into how their individual acumen can be applied to the field.



EC Ropes In Ayushmann Khurrana To Urge Youth To Vote :-

The Election Commission of India teamed up with actor Ayushmann Khurrana to encourage young people to vote in the forthcoming Lok Sabha elections. The 39-year-old actor appears in the ECI's campaign video, which encourages young people to vote in the next elections. Khurrana, known for critically praised films such as "Andhadhun," "Dream Girl," "Bareilly Ki Barfi," and "Dum Laga Ke Haisha," believes it is vital that young people engage in selecting the country's future. "Every vote counts and every vote is important. Voting is a symbol of empowerment in a democratic nation like ours," Khurrana said in a statement.



Archaeological excavation reveals 5,200year-old Harappan settlement in Kachchh, Gujarat :-

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The Indus Valley civilisation, often regarded as one of the earliest cradles of civilization, has captivated both academics and history buffs. Excavations at many sites where the ancient city of Harappa existed centuries ago are still revealing the civilization's secrets. Archaeologists from Kerala University, who had previously conducted numerous successful expeditions to discover an Early Harappan necropolis Juna Khatiya in Gujarat in 2019, have discovered additional important findings from a 5,200-year-old Harappan settlement at Padta Bet, approximately 1.5 kilometers away, near Khatiya village in Kachchh district.



GUJCOST Designated As Nodal Centre For ISRO's START Programme :-

The Gujarat Council on Science and Technology (GUJCOST) has been appointed as the nodal centre for Isro's Space Science and Technology AwaReness Training (START) initiative. This effort seeks to foster a greater understanding of space science and technology among postgraduate and final-year undergraduate students in physical sciences and technology. The registration for the inaugural online programme, Exploration of Solar System, ends on April 19, said officials. The event will take place from April 24 to May 10.



Gopi Thotakura: First Indian Pilot To Embark On Space Tourism With Blue Origin :-

Gopi Thotakura, an entrepreneur and pilot, will become the first Indian to travel to space as a tourist on Amazon founder Jeff Bezos' Blue Origin's NS-25 mission. Thotakura was chosen as one of the mission's six crew E R S I Tmembers, becoming the first Indian space tourist and the second Indian to travel into space after Indian Army Wing Commander Rakesh Sharma in 1984. This mission will be the seventh human flight for the New Shepard programme and the 25th in its history. The flight date is yet to be announced, the aerospace company said.



SPACE India Named Sanjana Sanghi As Its Brand Ambassador :-

SPACE India, founded in 2001, has inspired over 1.5 million children and helped 1,000 schools throughout

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India integrate Astronomy and Space Science into their educational programs, developing a new generation of space enthusiasts and scholars. It has played a significant influence in dispelling myths about rocket science. Sanjana Sanghi is a budding Bollywood star and the UNDP Youth Champion. Her commitment to social activism and advocacy for education make her the ideal fit for this role at SPACE India and SPACE Arcade.



Dharamsala To Get India's First 'Hybrid RS Pitch' :-

The scenic Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association (HPCA) stadium has become the first BCCI-accredited site to build a cutting-edge 'hybrid pitch', which will be used for future international and IPL matches. The first hybrid pitch installation will be carried out by 'SISGrass', a company of the SIS Pitches group based in the Netherlands. According to a press release, "this cutting-edge technology will transform the game by providing a more durable, consistent, and high-performing playing surface."



Indian Girls Shine At 13th European Girls' Mathematical Olympiad 2024 :-

A four-member Indian girls' team educated at Chennai Mathematical Institute (CMI) won two silver and two bronze medals at the 13th European Girls' Mathematical Olympiad (EGMO) in 2024. This is the second time all four members of the Indian squad have won medals at EGMO since the country's debut in 2015. The students are Gunjan Aggarwal (17) from Gurugram, Sanjana Philo Chacko (15) from Thiruvananthapuram, Larissa (16) from Hisar, and Saee Vitthal Patil (17) from Pune.



Takshvi Vaghani Sets New World Record For The Lowest Limbo Skating Over 25 Metres :-

Takshvi Vaghani holds the record for the lowest 25meter limbo skate. Guinness World Records (GWR) confirmed the story. The record keeper also uploaded a video of the six-year-old child from Ahmedabad, Gujarat, completing the task with ease. She achieved a new world record on March 10, last year. While GWR's official website notes that Takshvi had attempted the record for personal achievement, the video instantly went viral on social media after it was posted on social media on the official handle of Guinness World Records on April 10.

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PM inaugurates 2550th Bhagwan Mahaveer Nirvan Mahotsav :-

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the 2550th Bhagwan Mahavir Nirvan Mahotsav on the auspicious occasion of Mahavir Jayanti at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi on 21st April. Shri Modi paid tributes with rice and flower petals to Bhagwan Mahavir's Murti and witnessed a dance drama presentation by school children on Bhagwan Mahavir Swami titled "Vartaman mein Vardhaman". The Prime Minister also released a commemorative stamp and coin on the occasion.



Citroen India Ropes In MS Dhoni As Brand Ambassador :-

Citroen, a Stellantis company, has appointed Indian cricketer Mahendra Singh Dhoni as its brand ambassador. According to sources familiar with the situation, the business made an initial payment of INR 7 crore. Citroen got into the Indian passenger vehicle market in April 2021 with the debut of the C5 Aircross. It currently sells three more models: C3, eC3, and C3 Aircross. Since its market entry, the company has recorded wholesales of about 17,000 units for its four products. The maker of C3 models rolls out its vehicles from the PCA Motor plant in Thiruvallur, Tamil Nadu.



SEBI Approval For CRISIL's ESG Ratings Unit :-

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has designated Crisil ESG Ratings & Analytics as a Category 1 provider of environmental, social, and governance (ESG) ratings. Crisil ESG Ratings, a Crisil subsidiary, was established after Sebi revised the SEBI (Credit Rating Agencies) Regulations, 1999, to include provisions for ESG Rating Providers (ERPs) last year. The rating provider launched its ESG scoring business in 2021 and now tracks over 1,000 companies across 65 sectors. The company said this business will now be transferred to the subsidiary Crisil ESG Ratings.

Union home ministry extends validity of FCRA registered NGOs till June 30 :-

To the comfort of those whose applications for renewal are still pending, the Ministry of Home Affairs has extended until June 30 the validity of all FCRA registered NGOs whose licences are expiring on March 31. Additionally, all NGOs whose five-year validity is about to expire between April 1, 2024, and June 30, 2024 have been granted till June 30 by the government. According to the law, all NGOs receiving foreign contributions have to be registered under the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act. There are 16,301 NGOs in the country with valid FCRA licences as of July 17, 2023.



Indian government raises \$1.98 billion by selling stakes in companies in 2023/24 :-

The Indian government raised 165 billion rupees (\$1.98 billion) in 2023/24 by selling shares in approximately ten state-run enterprises, according to official figures, 9% less than its internal aim of 180 billion rupees. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's aim to privatize state-owned enterprises has taken a back seat due to the upcoming general elections on April 19. Only twice in the last decade has Modi's government met its aim for privatisation and minority stake sales. His government has not set a target for the current financial year, which starts on April 1, in a break from usual practice.



India aims for 1st strategic petroleum reserve with pvt company by 2029-30 :-

According to the CEO of Indian Strategic Petroleum Reserves Ltd (ISPRL), India intends to construct its first privately managed strategic petroleum reserve (SPR) by 2029–2030, giving the operator the ability to exchange all of the stored oil. Enabling a fully commercial SPR is similar to the approach taken by nations like South Korea and Japan, which permit private lessees—mostly oil majors—to exchange crude. So far, India has allowed only partial commercialisation for its three existing SPRs in southern India, which have a combined capacity of 36.7 million barrels.

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Ahead Of Heatwave, Health Ministry Issues Guidelines :-

With temperatures rising and summer quickly approaching, the Union Ministry of Health has issued a list of measures to help prevent heat-related ailments. Health Minister Dr Mansukh Mandaviya stated that "continuous efforts towards generating awareness for people for better management of heatwaves is necessary as effective address leads to effective management." This comes days after the India Meteorological Department (IMD) issued a caution for heat waves and "extreme heat conditions" in the country from April to June.



India to stop importing urea by 2025 end: Mansukh Mandaviya :-

India will stop importing urea by the end of 2025, according to Chemicals and Fertilizers Minister Mansukh Mandaviya, as a big push for domestic manufacturing has helped bridge the supply-demand gap. The minister stated that the availability of fertilisers is critical for Indian agriculture. He said the country has been using chemical fertilisers for the last 60-65 years to enhance crop production. Now, Mandaviya said, the government is making efforts to promote alternate fertilisers like nano liquid urea and nano liquid di-ammonium phosphate (DAP).



Justice Aniruddha Bose Appointed Director Of National Judicial Academy :-

Justice Aniruddha Bose retired after serving as a Supreme Court justice for five years. Given Justice Bose's intellectual capacity, CJI Chandrachud stated that "we have decided, and he has graciously accepted the assignment to head the National Judicial Academy at Bhopal to train judges". CJI Chandrachud bids Justice Bose farewell as he joins the National Judicial Academy (NJA) in Bhopal, recognizing Bose's contributions to the legal landscape and efforts to modernize the judiciary. The NJA, established in 1993, operates under the guidance of the Supreme Court and aims to enhance the skills of judges and facilitate court administration.

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India's Trade Deficit Narrows To 11-Month Low :-

India's trade deficit fell to \$15.6 billion in March, marking an 11-month low, mainly to a substantial drop in item imports. The deficit totaled \$18.96 billion in March 2023 and \$18.71 billion in February 2024. Even while the trade deficit narrowed in March, exports declined by 0.3 percent from the previous year to \$41.68 billion, while imports plummeted by a considerably larger 5.98 percent to \$57.28 billion, according to the commerce ministry. The steep drop in imports in March 2024 were led by lower gold imports which more than halved on a year-on-year basis.



India starts working on indigenous bullet train with speeds exceeding 250 km/h :-

According to an English daily newspaper, India has begun development of an indigenous bullet train capable of reaching speeds of more than 250 km/hour. The designs are being created at the Integral Coach Factory (ICF) of Indian Railways in Chennai. To put things in perspective, high-speed trains like the French TGV and the Japanese Shinkansen reach speeds more than 250 km per hour. India is relying on Japanese technology to power bullet trains that will run on newly built track from Ahmedabad to Mumbai.



Permanent Education Number (PEN) Required For Students Starting Academic Year 2024-25 :-

The State's School Education Department has made the use of Permanent Education Number (PEN) mandatory beginning with the academic year 2024-25. PEN is a unique identifying number granted to each student by the Union Ministry of Education via the UDISE+ (Unified District Information System for Education Plus) site, which serves over 14.89 lakh schools, 95 lakh teachers, and 26.5 crore students. Commissioner, Andhra Pradesh School Education, S. Suresh Kumar said that implementation of PEN would pave the way for streamlining and simplifying the process of the students' transition from one school to the other in the new academic year.

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National Fertilizers Limited gets Navratna status:-

National Fertilizers Ltd has achieved "Navratna" status in April 2024 by the Department of Public Enterprise. This designation is reserved for top-performing Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) and grants them enhanced autonomy and financial powers. The granting of this status underscores the company's outstanding performance and its contribution to the national economy. Despite this notable achievement, National Fertilizers Ltd reported a substantial 73% drop in its consolidated net profit for the December quarter, amounting to ₹150.9 crore.



Health ministry asks states, UTs to act strictly against hospitals involved in illegal organ transplant :- The Union Health Ministry has instructed all states and union territories to investigate any infractions and take appropriate action, including registration suspension, against hospitals that perform illicit organ transplants, according to officials. In a letter to all states and union territories, Dr. Atul Goel, Director General of Health Services (DGHS), Government of India, urged all states and union territories to ensure monthly collection and exchange of data on all transplant cases, including those of foreigners, with the National Organ and Tissue Transplant Organization (NOTTO).



RBI Releases New Guidelines For ARCs Effective April 24, 2024 :-

On April 24, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued a master direction for asset reconstruction companies (ARCs). The RBI has upped the minimum capital requirement for ARCs to begin securitization to Rs 300 crore, up from Rs 100 crore on October 11, 2022. The new guidelines take effect immediately. According to the directions, the RBI has provided a glide path to ARCs to achieve the minimum required net owned fund (NOF) of Rs 300 crore. As the minimum NOF was Rs 100 crore as on October 11, 2022, ARCs now have to increase it to Rs 200 crore by March 31, 2024, and to Rs 300 crore by March 31, 2026.

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Gem And Jewellery Sector Granted AEO Status By Indian Government :-

The finance ministry has granted the nation's gem and jewelry industry Authorized Economic Operator (AEO) status, which will speed up the processing of customs, central excise, and service tax cases, reduce bank guarantee requirements by 50% when compared to non-AEO entities, and enable faster export and import of gem and jewelry. The sector has received this status following the efforts by the Gem & Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC) to take up the matter with the finance ministry.



Centre okays export of 99,150 tonnes onion to six countries :-

The government has approved exports of 99,150 tonnes of onion to six countries since the ban on the shipment was imposed in December last year to ensure adequate domestic availability against the backdrop of estimated lower Kharif and Rabi crops in 2023-24. The total quota for onion shipment approved is Bangladesh (50,000 tonne), UAE (34,400 tonne), Sri Lanka (10,000 tonne), Bahrain (3000 tonne), Mauritius (1200 tonne) and Bhutan (550 tonne). The onion is sourced from Maharashtra and shipped through the National Cooperative Exports Limited (NCEL).

Actor Chance Perdomo Passed Away Aged 27:-

Actor Chance Perdomo, a British-American, died in a motorbike accident. He rose to stardom in TV shows including "Gen V" and "Chilling Adventures of Sabrina." His age was 27. Variety was notified of the actor's passing by the star's representative, who also verified that no other individuals were there during the incident. Perdomo was reared in Southampton, Britain, after

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being born in Los Angeles, California, on October 19, 1996. He became more mainstream after he became a regular in the American horror series 'Chilling Adventures of Sabrina' which also starred Kiernan Shipka, Ross Lynch and Jaz Sinclair.



Veteran Actress Barbara Rush Passes Away At 97 :-

Barbara Rush, a veteran actress, is no more. She was 97. Barbara Rush's daughter, Fox News Channel senior correspondent Claudia Cowan, confirmed her loving mother's death to Fox News Digital. Barbara Rush received a Golden Globe for best promising newcomer in "It Came From Outer Space" and went on to star in "Peyton Place" as well as numerous other films and television shows. Barbara Rush gained further prominence after starring in the critically acclaimed 1956 drama "Bigger Than Life" opposite James Mason.



Papua New Guinea's Legendary All-rounder Kaia Arua Dies, Aged 33 :-

The International Cricket Council (ICC) revealed that Kaia Arua, a great Papua New Guinea (PNG) all-rounder, died at the age of 33. Arua made her debut for the national squad in the East Asia-Pacific Trophy in 2010, and she has since become a fixture in various East-Asia Pacific route competitions and Pacific Games cricket. She was eventually picked to the PNG squad for the 2018 Women's Cricket World Cup Qualifier. While her first captaincy experience came at the 2018 T20 World Cup Qualifier where she led the team against Ireland, she was named as the ICC Women's Global Development Squad in the same year.



Telugu's first news anchor on Doordarshan Shanti Swaroop passes away :-

Shanti Swaroop, a news presenter for Doordarshan Telugu in the 1980s and 1990s, died in Hyderabad. Mamidi Somaiah, president of the Telangana Working Journalists Federation, recalled that Shanti Swaroop had worked as a Doordarshan news reader since 1983. He presented news on Doordarshan until 2011. Chief minister A Revanth Reddy has condoled the death of Shanti Swaroop. Former chief minister of Andhra Pradesh N Chandrababu Naidu also condoled the death of Shanti Swaroop.

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Former Judge Justice Ramalingeswara Rao Passed Away :-

Justice A Ramalingeswara Rao, who served in the Hyderabad High Court (the common HC for AP and T) from 2013 to 2018, died after a major heart attack in Germany. Justice Rao, known for his pro-people orientation as a lawyer and judge, authored various books on law and the Telugu language. As a lawyer he fought several cases including the historic Samata case wherein the Supreme Court restrained the governments from doling out land in agency areas to non-tribals through mineral development corporation and other govt agencies.



Gangu Ramsay, veteran filmmaker, producer, cinematographer of Ramsay Brothers fame, passes away SPORTS:- Gangu Ramsay, a veteran filmmaker, producer, and cinematographer, passed away lately. He was 83 and has been battling medical issues for the past month. The Ramsay Brothers were known for filming horror films in Hindi. Gangu Ramsay's successful career lasted decades and left an indelible effect on the Indian cinema industry. He lent his creative vision to over 50 films under the banner of Ramsay Brothers, including classics like "Veerana", "Purana Mandir", and "Bandh Darwaza", "Do Gaz Zameen Ke Niche", "Samri", "Tehkhana", "Purani Haveli", and "Khoj" with Rishi Kapoor.



R.M. Veerappan, The Most Trusted Lieutenant Of Late MGR, Passes Away :-

R.M. Veerappan, one of the key Ministers in the Cabinet led by late Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.G. Ramachandran in the 1980s and a close acquaintance of the matinee idol turned politician, died in Chennai on April 9 at the age of 97. Veerappan previously served as a minister in the Cabinets of former Chief Minister M G Ramachandran and late Chief Ministers Janaki Ramachandran and J Jayalalithaa. This Dravidian leader born on September 9, 1926, enjoyed good ties with DMK stalwart and former Chief Minister M Karunanidhi too. He launched the MGR Kazhagam party after quitting the AIADMK.

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Telangana: Senior IPS officer Rajiv Ratan passes away due to cardiac arrest :-

Rajiv Ratan, a senior IPS officer, died after a heart arrest at a private hospital, according to government sources. Ratan, a 1991 batch IPS officer aged around 60, was the Director General of Telangana Vigilance and Enforcement. Ratan led the state government-appointed vigilance and enforcement inquiry into the Medigadda (Laxmi) barrage of the Kaleshwaram project. During his stint, the IPS officer worked as Karimnagar Superintendent of Police, Director General of State Fire Services, Inspector General to Hyderabad Region, and Police Housing Corporation MD.

Nobel Laureate Physicist Peter Higgs Passed Away :-

British physicist Peter Higgs, whose theory of a massgiving particle known as the Higgs boson earned him a joint Nobel Prize in Physics, has died at the age of 94, according to the University of Edinburgh. The 2013 physics Nobel Prize was awarded to him and Belgian physicist Francois Englert for their 1964 theory of a massgiving particle known as the Higgs boson or the "God particle". Its existence was predicted in the 1960s, but it was found only in 2012 through elaborate experiments carried out at the Large Hadron Collider, located on the border of France and Switzerland.



K-Pop singer Park Bo Ram passes away at 30

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
Park Bo Ram, a well-known K pop singer, died at the age of 30, according to Xanadu Entertainment. The police are investigating the cause of death. Jain has become a household name through his show, which aired on a Kannada channel for over 20 years. Recently, the Karnataka government had conferred the Rajyotsava Award on him for his contributions in various fields.



Carnatic musician KG Jayan passes away :-

K.G. Jayan, a prominent Carnatic musician, died on April 16 at his home in Thripunitura, Ernakulam district of Kerala. He was ninety. Jayan and his brother K.G. Vijayan, known as the 'Jaya-Vijaya' pair in the world of music, were born on November 21, 1934, in Kottayam to the late Gopalan Thanthrikal and late Narayani Amma. Together, they created over 1,000 pieces for films, theater, and devotional albums. Though Vijayan died in 1988, Jayan continued his musical journey through devotional songs and Carnatic concerts.



BJP MP, ex-Union Minister Sreenivasa Prasad passes away at age of 76 :-

V Sreenivasa Prasad, 76, a former Union minister and BJP MP, died on April 29. The lawmaker, who represented the Chamarajanagar Lok Sabha constituency in Karnataka, had been battling illness and was being treated at a private hospital until his death in the early hours of the day. Prasad had a successful political career spanning five decades, serving as an MP six times from Chamarajanagar and MLA for Nanjangud in Mysuru district for two terms. In a significant milestone earlier this year, on March 18, he announced his retirement from electoral politics, marking 50 years of dedicated service to the public.

UP Leads With Most GI-Tagged Products :-

The inclusion of 15 Uttar Pradesh items to the list of Geographical Indication (GI) certified goods has moved the state to the top spot in India. Uttar Pradesh has 69 GI-tagged products, surpassing Tamil Nadu's 58. Varanasi has become a leader in GI-tagged goods manufacture, with 30 certified products—the most from a single geographical area. GI certification signifies that these products are unique representations of a specific culture, society, or craft. Varanasi secures Geographical Indication for Banaras Thandai and other regional products, expanding to 30 GI-tagged items.



UPI Ends FY24 With Record Transactions Worth ₹199 Lakh Crore :-

The Unified Payments Interface (UPI) closed FY24 on a high note, hitting new records for both the volume and value of transactions completed in March 2024. This was despite a modest decrease in transactions in February 2024 due to the shorter number of days in the month and greater investment activity ahead of the fiscal year's end. In FY24, the UPI platform completed 13,115 transactions worth ₹199.29 lakh crore, up from 8,376 crore worth ₹139 lakh crore the previous year. The value of transactions was 40 per cent higher, compared to that in March 2023.



Paradip Port Emerges As India's Top Cargo-Handling Port In 2023-24 :-

The state-owned Paradip Port in Odisha has surpassed Gujarat's Deendayal Port Authority as India's largest significant port in terms of cargo volumes, with 145.38 million tonnes throughput in FY24. For the first time in its 56-year history, Paradip Port has eclipsed Deendayal Port's records, according to a statement from the Ministry of Ports, Shipping, and Waterways. According to the statement, during FY24, the port achieved the highest-ever coastal shipping traffic of 59.19 million metric tonnes, with a growth of 0.76 million metric tonnes -- 1.30 per cent over the previous year.

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UPI Transactions Surge By 56% In India: Worldline Report :-

According to a research by payment service provider Worldline, UPI transactions in India increased by 56% year on year (YoY) in the second half (H2) of 2023, while card transactions increased by only 6%. The amount of UPI transactions increased to 65.77 billion from 42.09 billion in the second half of 2023, according to the research. In addition, transaction value increased by 44%, rising from Rs 69.36 trillion to Rs 99.68 trillion within the same period. The report also highlights the enhancement of payment acceptance infrastructure across the country, with the use of use Point of Sale (PoS) terminals rising by 26% to 8.56 million.



RBI Projects CPI Inflation At 4.5% For FY25 :-

India's central bank left its inflation projection for this fiscal year unchanged at 4.5%, implying that the inflation target is within reach, even as the country braces for a sweltering summer despite a surge in crude oil prices and ongoing supply chain concerns caused by the Red Sea issue. According to Shaktikanta Das, CPI inflation is expected to fall to 3.8% in Q2FY25 before rising again to roughly 4.5% by the end of the fiscal year. Das pointed out that inflation has come down significantly but remains above the 4% target. Food inflation continues to exhibit considerable volatility, which is impeding the ongoing disinflation process.



111-Year-Old John Alfred Tinniswood Becomes World's Oldest Man :-

Guinness World Records (GWR) has announced the world's oldest living man, 111-year-old John Alfred Tinniswood, from England. Born in Merseyside, Northern England, in 1912, Tinniswood has experienced two world wars. Although Tinniswood's accomplishment is certainly noteworthy, it is important to remember that he is not the oldest person in history. Jiroemon Kimura, a Japanese man who lived to be 116 years and 54 days old, was the oldest man in history. Maria Branyas Morera of Spain, who is currently 117 years old and the oldest living woman, is the oldest living person overall.

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India Ranks Second In Hepatitis B And C Cases Worldwide :-

According to the World Health Organization's (WHO) 2024 Global Hepatitis Report, India accounted for 11.6% of all hepatitis cases globally in 2022. This corresponds to an alarming number of approximately 35.3 million hepatitis infections in the country, including 29.8 million hepatitis B and 5.5 million hepatitis C cases. The country ranked second after China, accounting for 27.5 percent of the global total with 83.8 million cases in 2022. Hepatitis is the second leading infectious cause of death globally after tuberculosis.



Asian Development Bank Raises India's GDP Growth Forecast :-

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) upped India's GDP growth prediction for the current fiscal year to 7% from

6.7% before, citing strong public and private sector investment and rising consumer demand. According to the ADB's April edition of the Asian Development Outlook, India would remain "a major growth engine" in Asia and the Pacific. For the 2025-26 fiscal, ADB has projected India's growth at 7.2 per cent. The economy grew robustly in fiscal 2023 with strong momentum in manufacturing and services, the Bank stated.




India Overtakes China In Digital Services Exports: WTO Report :-

India is now the world's fourth-largest exporter of digitally delivered services, accounting for more than a fifth of global commerce in services. According to the World Trade Organization's (WTO) most recent Global Trade Outlook and Statistics report, India's exports of digitally delivered services were total \$257 billion in 2023, up 17 percent from the previous year. The country's performance was much better than Germany and China, which registered a growth of 4 percent each. Unlike trade in goods, which fell in 2023 globally and in all regions, exports of digitally delivered services continued to thrive.

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Moody's Analytics Forecasts India's Economy To Grow By 6.1% In 2024 :-

Moody's Analytics expects India's economy to grow by 6.1 percent in 2024, down from 7.7 percent in 2023. "Economies in South and Southeast Asia will see some of the strongest output gains this year, but their performance is flattered by a delayed post-pandemic rebound. We expect India's GDP to grow 6.1 per cent in 2024 after 7.7 per cent last year," Moody's Analytics said. In its report titled 'APAC Outlook: Listening Through the Noise', Moody's Analytics said the region overall is doing better than other parts of the world.



World Cybercrime Index : Russia And Ukraine Top List :-

According to a new World Cybercrime Index produced by academics, the vast majority of cybercriminals originate in a few countries. Cybercrime is forecast to cost the globe \$9.22 trillion in 2024, with a projected increase to \$13.82 trillion in 2028. This survey was conducted by 92 of the world's leading cybercrime experts. This seemed to suggest that cybercriminal threats seem to originate from a small number of countries — China, Russia, Ukraine, the United States, Romania, and Nigeria ranked in the top 10 for each of the selected five categories.



India's wholesale inflation rises to threemonth high of 0.53% in March :-

The headline wholesale price index (WPI)-based inflation rate increased to a three-month high of 0.53 percent in March, up from 0.2 percent in February. It therefore remained in positive area for the fifth consecutive month, after being in deflationary zone for the majority of fiscal year 2023-24 (FY24). Data released by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry showed that the uptick in factory gate inflation during March was driven by increase in prices of food articles, electricity, crude petroleum and natural gas, among others.

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Delhi's IGI Airport Ranks Among Top 10 Busiest Airports Globally :-

The Airports Council International (ACI) World, a global body that tests and analyzes airport standards, has classified Delhi's Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport as the world's tenth busiest airport in 2023. Prior to the coronavirus pandemic, IGI Airport was ranked 9th in 2022, 13th in 2021, and 17th busiest in 2019. Data shared by the ACI showed that the IGI airport in the capital handled 7.22 crore passengers annually. The Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport in the United States held the top rank with 10.46 crore passengers.



Alia Bhatt in TIME's 100 most influential people of 2024 list :-

Bollywood actress Alia Bhatt and British-Indian actor Dev Patel have been named to TIME magazine's list of the 100 Most Influential People in 2024, the publication said. Alia, who made her Hollywood debut last year in Tom Harper's Heart of Stone opposite Gal Gadot and Jamie Dornan, expressed her gratitude on Instagram. Singersongwriter Dua Lipa, actor Jeffrey Wright, James McBride, Da'Vine Joy Randolph, Fantasia Barrino and Colman Domingo, Hayao Miyazaki, Michael J. Fox, Taraji P Henson, Sofia Coppola and Elliot Page also feature on the list.



Indian economy projected to grow 6.5 per cent in 2024: UNCTAD :-

According to a UN estimate, India's economy is expected to grow by 6.5% in 2024, with multinationals expanding their manufacturing operations into the country to diversify their supply chains benefiting Indian exports. According to the UN Trade and Development (UNCTAD) report, India grew by 6.7% in 2023 and is anticipated to increase by 6.5% in 2024, maintaining its position as the world's fastest-growing major economy. The UNCTAD report said the Reserve Bank of India is expected to keep interest rates constant in the near term.

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India's population estimated at 1.4 bn, 24% in 0-14 age bracket: UNFPA :-

According to a recent UNFPA research, India's population is predicted to be 1.44 billion people, with 24 percent of them aged 0 to 14. According to the United Nations Population Fund's (UNFPA) State of World Population -2024 report -- "Interwoven Lives, Threads of Hope: Ending Inequalities in Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights" study, India's population is expected to double in 77 years. India leads globally with an estimated population of 1.44 billion, followed by China at 1.425 billion, according to the report.



India Ranks Fourth In Global Military Spending In 2023:-

India was the world's fourth-largest military spender in 2023, spending \$83.6 billion to modernize a variety of weapons and combat systems, according to a research. The Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) reported that the top three spenders were the United States (US), China, and Russia in that order. India's military spending increased by 4.2 percent compared to 2022. This growth reflects India's strategic focus on enhancing its defence capabilities and bolstering military infrastructure, particularly along the China border following the Ladakh standoff that began in May 2020.



Plain Gold Jewellery Exports Up Nearly 62% In Fy23-24 :-

Exports of simple gold jewellery increased by about 62% to \$6,792.24 million in the just completed fiscal year 2023-24, up from just under \$4,200 million in FY 2022–23. According to data from the Gem and Jewellery Export Promotion Council (GJEPC), total gold jewellery (plain and studded), which fell 10.5% between April 2023 and September 2023, rebounded substantially in the second half of the year, growing by nearly 47%. Gross export of total gold jewellery (both plain & studded) for FY2023-24 grew by nearly 17% to \$11,230 million over the

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comparative figure of \$9,619 million for the previous year.



Satellite Insights: Expansion Of Glacial Lakes In The Indian Himalayas :-

The Indian Space Research Organisation's (ISRO) longterm satellite photography covering the catchments of Indian Himalayan river basins from 1984 to 2023 revealed major changes in glacier lakes. According to the ISRO, 676 glacial lakes out of 2,431 larger than 10 hectares observed in 2016-17 have significantly increased since 1984. According to the ISRO, elevationbased analysis suggests that 314 lakes are located between 4,000 and 5,000 meters, with 296 lakes above 5,000 meters. The glacial lakes are categorised based on their formation process into four broad categories.



Passport Affordability Rankings: Indian Passport Second Cheapest, UAE Tops :-

A recent survey undertaken by the Australian organization Compare the Market AU showed surprising findings about global passport affordability and accessibility. According to the survey, the Indian passport is the second cheapest in the world, with the UAE passport being the most affordable. In terms of cost per year of validity, the Indian passport is the most cheap option, costing only \$1.81 per year. This places India ahead of countries like South Africa and Kenya, offering passport holders significant savings over time.



Reliance Jio becomes world's largest mobile operator in data traffic :-

Reliance Jio, India's leading telecom operator, has overtaken China Mobile as the world's largest consumer of mobile data traffic. Tefficient, a worldwide analytics business, reported that Jio's network handled 40.9 exabytes of data in the first quarter of 2024, compared to China Mobile's 38 exabytes. Jio has the world's second-largest 5G subscriber base, with 108 million users. However, Jio's rapid subscriber growth, driven by its JioBharat value plans and promotional unlimited 5G offers, has impacted its average revenue per user (ARPU).

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NIPFP Forecasts India's FY25 GDP Growth At 7.1% :-

The National Institute of Public Finance and Policy (NIPFP), an economic think tank, predicted India's GDP growth for the current fiscal year at 7.1% using highfrequency models. In a number of tweets, the NIPFP stated that the Centre is on a fiscal consolidation path due to increased tax collection and reduced revenue expenditure. While the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and Fitch Ratings have estimated India's growth at 7 per cent, the International Monetary Fund (IMF), S&P Global Ratings and Morgan Stanley projected a 6.8 per cent growth rate for FY25.

Government Forms 14th Task Force To Explore Use Of Biochar In Steel Production

:-

The government has established a task force to investigate the use of biochar in steel manufacturing as part of its efforts to reduce carbon emissions in the steel industry. According to government figures, the domestic steel sector is responsible for 12% of India's greenhouse gas emissions, with an emission intensity of 2.55 tonnes CO2 per tonne of crude steel, compared to the global average of 1.9 tonnes CO2. In March 2023, Union Steel Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia approved the formation of 13 task forces to identify action points for each aspect of green steel production and the adoption of sustainable manufacturing processes.

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Meta Expands Fact-Checking Program With PTI In India :-

Meta, the parent company of Facebook, WhatsApp, and Instagram, has announced that it will expand its thirdparty fact-checking initiative in India to include the Press Trust of India (PTI) as a dedicated fact-checking section within the newswire's editorial department. The agreement will allow PTI to discover, assess, and grade content as false across Meta platforms. Globally, the

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company has built one of the largest independent factchecking networks, with nearly 100 partners around the world to review and rate viral misinformation in more than 60 languages.



RuPay Launches 'Link It, Forget It' Campaign At IPL 2024 To Promote Credit Card On UPI

The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has launched a campaign called "Link it, Forget it" to create awareness about RuPay Credit cards, which can be effortlessly linked to a UPI ID for secure and convenient payments. The marketing campaign was started during the current season of the Indian Premier League (IPL). The campaign, created by DDB Mudra Group, promotes the use of RuPay credit cards with UPI for a seamless and touch-free payment experience. The campaign 'Link It, Forget It' with Shankar Mahadevan stresses on how unnecessary it is to carry your wallet when you have a RuPay Credit Card.



ISKCON And NSDC Collaborate For Tribal Skill Development :-

The National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) will give vocational training to tribal and underprivileged youngsters across several states in an effort to uplift marginalised populations. The strategic alliance will first focus on training individuals from tribal and marginalized communities in Uttar Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Gujarat, and Madhya Pradesh, with plans to expand to more regions in the future. Through jointly conducted short-term courses, participants will industry-recognized receive certifications via the Skill India Digital Hub platform, enhancing their employability prospects.



RBI Introduces FEMA Regulations For Direct Listing On International Exchanges :-

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued restrictions under Foreign Exchange Management (FEMA) that pushed Indian companies to list on overseas stock exchanges. Experts believe that new norms will help businesses use foreign exchange more effectively. Regulations have been made public via two notifications. First set of regulations deals with mode of payment and reporting of non-debt instruments. Further, the sale proceeds (net of taxes) of the equity shares may be remitted outside India

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or may be credited to the bank account of the permissible holder.



Reading initiative at Salem Central Prison completes 25 weeks :-

Valluvar Vasagar Vattam (reading circle), an effort for the rehabilitation of prisoners at Salem Central Prison in Tamil Nadu, has finished its 25th week. The jail administration has launched a number of initiatives aimed at rehabilitation of prisoners. The Valluvar Vasagam Vattam (reading circle) was formed six months ago, in September 2023, at Salem Central Prison. G. Vinoth, the Superintendent (in-charge) of Salem Central Prison, stated that the primary objective of this initiative is to rehabilitate prisoners and alter their negative perceptions of society.



Former Judge Najmi Waziri To Head Committee For Delhi Forest Protection :-

Justice Najmi Waziri, a former judge of the Delhi High Court, has been nominated as as the head of an internal departmental committee of city officials in charge of forest protection in the national capital. Justice Tushar Rao Gedela stated that, while Forest Department officials work to safeguard the city's woodlands, landowning departments are "not serious enough" in providing support to the committee. The court said it expected all the departments to cooperate with the committee and asked the Delhi government to provide secretarial facilities and assistance to Justice Waziri.



Centre Appoints Manoj Panda As New Finance Commission Member :-

According to an announcement from the finance ministry, Manoj Panda, a former director of the Institute of Economic Growth, has been named by the government as a full-time member of the 16th Finance Commission. Panda conducts research on a variety of topics, including growth and distribution-focused fiscal policy, alternative trade, and macroeconomic trends and predictions. Previously, Panda served as Director of the Centre for Economic and Social Studies (CESS), Hyderabad and as a Professor and Associate Professor at the Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research (IGIDR), Mumbai.

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NTPC Limited To Launch New Edition Of Girl Child Empowerment Mission (GEM) :-

NTPC, India's largest integrated power PSU, is preparing to launch the latest edition of the Girl Empowerment Corporate Mission (GEM), its flagship Social Responsibility initiative. The program is aligned with the Government of India's Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao policy, which aims to combat gender inequity by cultivating girls' imaginations and encouraging them to explore opportunities. GEM does this through a 1-month workshop for young girls during summer holidays, by offering them a platform for their all-round upliftment and development.

Bajaj, 61, joined the USISPF as an advisor to the Board of Directors in January and will now lead the US-India Tax Forum, according to an official announcement. A 1988-batch Haryana Cadre IAS officer, Bajaj served as Revenue Secretary. During his tenure with the Indian government, he played a pivotal role in shaping fiscal policies and promoting economic growth.

Microsoft And OpenAI Unveil \$100 Billion 'Stargate' AI Supercomputer :-


In a ground-breaking cooperation, tech titans Microsoft and OpenAI have revealed plans to build a breakthrough supercomputer called "Stargate," signifying a substantial advancement in artificial intelligence (AI) technology. This ambitious project, which is expected to cost a stunning \$100 billion, highlights the growing demand for powerful data centers capable of supporting cuttingedge AI applications, ushering in a new age of AI development. The venture, as disclosed by sources to The Information, is anticipated to be primarily financed by Microsoft, eclipsing existing data centre costs by over 100-fold.

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India's Oldest Solar Observatory celebrates 125 years :-

The Indian Institute of Astrophysics (IIA), an autonomous institute of the Department of Science and Technology (DST), commemorated the 125th anniversary of the iconic Kodaikanal Solar Observatory (KSO) on April 1, 2024, to remember its history, felicitate its scientists, and honour its legacy, which was a watershed moment in Indian astronomy. The KSO houses a digital repository of 1.2 lakh digitised solar images and thousands of other images of the Sun recorded every day since the start of the 20th century.



Romania Unveils World's Most Powerful Laser :-

A Romanian research institute has shown the world's most powerful laser, which is based on the groundbreaking ideas of Nobel Physics Prize winners Gerard Mourou and Donna Strickland. The laser, operated by the French company Thales, has revolutionary uses ranging from healthcare to space exploration. Mourou and Strickland created the Chirped-Pulse Amplification (CPA) technique, which is at the heart of this breakthrough laser. This technique enables the amplification of laser power while maintaining safe intensity levels.



Tata Advanced Systems Ltd (TASL) Launches India's First Privately-Built Sub-Metre Resolution Surveillance Satellite :-

The TSAT-1A, India's first sub-meter resolution earth observation satellite, has been successfully launched into orbit by Tata Group's Tata Advanced Systems Limited, marking a significant milestone. The is the first of its kind in India, invented by the private sector and constructed in collaboration with Satellogic. A SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket carrying the payload launched the rocket from Florida's Kennedy Space Center. TSAT-1A promises to revolutionize satellite imaging with its high-resolution capabilities and swift data delivery.

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Garuda Aerospace Receives Its First Order From ISRO:-

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) is in the process of acquiring Garuda Aerospace's cutting-edge Quadcopter drone. The collaboration between Garuda Aerospace and ISRO symbolizes the firm's entry into the space-tech area, paving the way for future space-related advancements, according to the company. Garuda Aerospace's quadcopter drones are equipped with machine learning and artificial intelligence. The use of these drones is expected to enhance efficiency across various ISRO operations.



ISRO set to launch an ESA satellite capable of generating solar eclipses at will :-

India is scheduled to launch the European Space Agency's (ESA) pioneering Proba-3 mission in September

2024. This ambitious endeavor is the world's first precision formation flying mission, with two satellites planned to operate in tandem as a 'large stiff structure' in the expanse of space. The two spacecraft will align to form a 144-meter-long solar coronagraph, allowing scientists to examine the Sun's secretive corona in unprecedented detail. This region of the Sun, known for its ghostly glow, has been challenging to observe due to the blinding brightness of the solar disk. However, Proba-3 aims to change that by mimicking an artificial eclipse in space, providing a continuous view of the corona closer to the solar rim than ever before.



US, Japan Announce Plans To Send Japanese Astronaut To Moon :-

NASA and Japan's space agency have unveiled a historic partnership that would transform Moon exploration, dubbed a 'great leap forward for all of humanity.' President Joe Biden and Japanese Prime Minister Kishida have announced that the two countries will collaborate to construct a pressurized rover and send two Japanese astronauts to the Moon. The Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency (JAXA) is one of five organizations taking part in the construction of a new space station that is slated to be in operation by 2028.

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Adani Green Energy Builds World's Largest Renewable Energy Park In Khavda, Gujarat :-

Gautam Adani's business has created the world's largest renewable energy park in Gujarat's Khavda district, in a remote area bordering Pakistan, with a gigantic 45 GW capacity to generate electricity primarily from solar energy. Adani Green Energy Ltd, India's largest renewable energy business, will invest approximately Rs 1.5 lakh crore to generate 30 megawatts of clean electricity in Khavda, Gujarat's Kutch, according to Managing Director Vneet Jaain. "We have just now commissioned 2,000 MW (2 GW) of capacity at Khavda and plan to add 4 GW in the current fiscal (financial year ending March 2025) and 5 GW every year thereafter," he said.



SPACE, a premier testing & evaluation hub for sonar systems for Indian Navy, inaugurated in Kerala :-

Chairman of DRDO and Secretary of the Department of Defence, Samir V Kamat, launched a cutting-edge Submersible Platform for Acoustic Characterization and Evaluation (SPACE) at the Underwater Acoustic Research Facility, Kulamavu in Idukki, Kerala. The SPACE, established by the DRDO's Naval Physical and Oceanographic Laboratory, is intended to serve as a premier testing and evaluation facility for sonar systems intended for use by the Indian Navy on diverse platforms such as ships, submarines, and helicopters. The SPACE marks a milestone in naval technology advancement.




Cancer-Causing Chemical in Indian Spice Brands :-

The Centre for Food Safety, Hong Kong's food and environmental regulatory body collected samples of four products under its routine food surveillance programme and found the presence of pesticide ethylene oxide. Following this, Singapore has recalled Everest fish curry masala imported from India. The agency said that although there is no immediate risk to consumption of food contaminated with low levels of ethylene oxide,

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long term exposure to the same may lead to health issues and raise the risk of breast cancer and lymphoma



Rashtriya Raksha University signs MoU with French Starburst Aerospace :-

Rashtriya Raksha University (RRU) in Gandhinagar and France's Starburst Aerospace have signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to develop aerospace, defense, and homeland security innovation. The MoU involves the establishment of a 100 million euro venture capital fund for aerospace, defense, and security technology, as well as export promotion assistance for Indian start-ups seeking to enter foreign markets, according to an RRU announcement. The partnership between Starburst and RRU is a reflection of the progress in the India-France Strategic Partnership in defence and space, it said.



India's Largest Climate Clock Unveiled At CSIR HQ For Earth Day Celebration :-

As part of the Earth Day celebrations, the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) built and activated India's largest climate clock on the CSIR Headquarters Building at Rafi Marg in New Delhi. The event represents CSIR's efforts to raise awareness about climate change and its negative consequences. Speaking on the occasion, Prof Chetan Singh Solanki of IIT Bombay and Founder of Energy Swaraj Foundation stated that every person of the country must be energy literate. He said every citizen must take steps to avoid or minimise energy usage as much as possible.



Indian Students Shine At NASA's Human Exploration Rover Challenge :-

India demonstrates its growing significance in the effort to explore the moon by winning two prestigious honors in NASA's 30th Human Exploration Rover Challenge (HERC). Teams from Kanakia International School in Mumbai (high school) and KIET Group of Institutions in Delhi-NCR (college/university) won first place in two categories. KIET Group of Institutions team earned recognition for its outstanding performance in the 'Crash and Burn' category, while Kanakia International School emerged victorious as the 'Rookie of the Year'.

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Indian Air Force ushers in Digital Transformation with DigiLocker Integration :- Indian Air Force (IAF) embarked on a transformative digital journey by integrating with the DigiLocker platform on April 26, 2024. In a ceremonial event held at Air Headquarters, Vayu Bhawan, the IAF and Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to leverage DigiLocker's secure and accessible document repository services. The decision to elevate him from the Emirates ICC International Panel of Umpires was taken by a selection panel comprising of ICC General Manager – Cricket, Wasim Khan (Chair), former player and commentator Sanjay Manjrekar, retired New Zealand umpire Tony Hill, and consultant officiating expert Mike Riley.



MS Dhoni Scripts History In T20 Cricket :-

Mahendra Singh Dhoni continues to write history, as the famous wicketkeeper batter set a new record during an Indian Premier League match between the Delhi Capitals and Chennai Super Kings. Dhoni, who stepped down as CSK captain this season, has done an excellent job behind the stumps. The renowned wicketkeeper reached the enormous milestone with a brilliant catch during the Delhi Capitals match. It was the fourth ball of the eleventh over for DC starter Prithvi Shaw. With the catch, Dhoni became the first wicketkeeper to execute 300 dismissals in the T20Is.

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Rohan Bopanna And Matt Ebden Triumph At Miami Open :-

Rohan Bopanna and his Australian partner Matthew Ebden won the Miami Open doubles title, claiming victory in the second of two famous Sunshine tournaments held in Florida. Bopanna and Ebden overcame second-seeded Ivan Dodig and Austin Krajicek in a tense one-hour and 42-minute fight in Miami. The Indo-Australian couple rallied from behind to win the deciding tie-breaker and their second title of the year. Rohan Bopanna and Matthew Ebden won the Australian Open crown earlier in the year, scripting history in Melbourne.



Novak Djokovic Becomes The Oldest World No. 1 In ATP Rankings History :-

Novak Djokovic, the 24-time Grand Slam champion, continued to set records on the ATP Tour as he began week 419 as World No.1, extending his incredible record. He is also likely to become the oldest World No.1 ever on April 7. On April 7, the Serbian will become the oldest No. 1 in ATP Rankings history, surpassing Roger Federer's record of 36 years and 321 days. Djokovic, one of the greatest players of all time, has proven near-unrivalled longevity at the pinnacle of his sport even as he enters his fourth decade.



Chess: India Has A New No. 1 As Arjun Erigaisi Climbs To No. 9 In The World :-

Arjun Erigaisi was the top-ranked Indian in the most recent FIDE rankings, released by the world chess governing body. Erigaisi has a standard rating of 2756 and is ranked ninth in the world. Viswanathan Anand, five-time world champion and the second-ranked Indian on the FIDE rankings, comes next. Erigaisi, 21, scored eight points in the fifth Shengzhen Chess Masters and Bundesliga, propelling him to ninth place on the list. This is his debut in the top 10 in the Open standard list. Anand is on 11th spot in the ratings with a rating of 2751.



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Max Verstappen Of Red Bull Dominated The Japanese Grand Prix :-

Red Bull's triple world champion Max Verstappen dominated the Japanese Grand Prix, guiding his team to a one-two finish with teammate Sergio Perez. Verstappen dominated the race after starting from pole position, earning his third win in the first four races of the 2024 season. Carlos Sainz of Ferrari finished third, ahead of his teammate Charles Leclerc, who started seventh on the grid. McLaren's Lando Norris finished fifth, while Aston Martin's Fernando Alonso was sixth. Verstappen's dominant victory has allowed him to take an early stranglehold on the world championship.



India Tops WADA's Doping Offenders List In 2022 :-

According to the World Anti-Doping Agency's (WADA) 2022 testing results, India now has the greatest percentage of doping offenders. According to the report, 127 of the 4,064 samples gathered from Indian athletes (including urine, blood, and athlete biological passports) tested positive for banned substances, accounting for 3.26 percent of the sample size. WADA report also found a 6.4 per cent increase in the total number of samples analysed and reported in its Anti-Doping Administration and Management System (ADAMS) in 2022, compared to the previous year.



Olympic Champion Valerie Adams Named Ambassador For TCS World 10K Bengaluru 2024 :-

Dame Valerie Adams, the renowned shot putter who has won four World Championships and two Olympic medals, has been selected the International Event Ambassador for the 16th edition of the Tata Consultancy Services World 10K Bengaluru, which will take place on April 28. The 39-year-old from New Zealand is often regarded as the most accomplished female shot putter in history. In her five Olympic appearances, she has won two gold medals (in 2008 and 2012), a silver (in 2016), and a bronze medal (2020). Among her other accolades, the New Zealander is only the third woman to win world championships at youth, junior, and senior levels.



Sri Lankan Star Kamindu Mendis And England's Maia Bouchier Crowned ICC Players Of The Month:-

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Kamindu Mendis, a batting all-rounder from Sri Lanka, won the ICC Men's Player of the Month title to cap off a fantastic month in March. Mendis began the month with a modest T20I series against Bangladesh. Mendis rebounded with a record Test series, scoring century in both innings of the first game in Sylhet. He almost reached three tons in a row, scoring 92* in the opening innings of the second Test in Chattogram. England's Maia Bouchier enjoyed a remarkable run in the T20Is against New Zealand. The 25-year-old scored 223 runs at an average of 55.75 in five T20I games, helping England complete a 4-1 series win.



Sumit Nagal Makes History At Monte Carlo Masters :-

Sumit Nagal has once again etched his place in Indian tennis history with an outstanding exhibition of ability and dedication. Nagal became the first Indian man to win a Masters 1000 tournament on clay, demonstrating his rising status in the tennis world. Nagal shown his resilience and court prowess when he faced Matteo Arnaldi of Italy at the Monte Carlo Masters. The unseeded 95th-ranked player found himself in a tough battle, dropping the first set 6-7. However, undeterred by the setback, Nagal mounted an impressive comeback, claiming the next two sets 6-2, 6-4.



Asian Wrestling Championship: Udit Bags Silver, Abhimanyu And Vicky Claim Bronze Each :-

Rising Indian wrestler Udit finished second in the men's freestyle 57kg final at the senior Asian Championship, losing 4-5 to Japan's Kento Yumiya. Abhimanyu and Vicky both won bronze medals for India in their respective categories. Abhimanyu defeated Uzbekistan's Begijon Kuldashev 6-5 in the men's 70kg freestyle, while Vicky overcame home favourite Andrey Romanovitch Aronov 10-1 in the men's 97kg to win India's third medal of the day. However, there was heartbreak for Rohit Kumar (65kg), who had defeated Bajrang Punia in the trials, as he lost to Masanosuke Ono of Japan 3-5 in his bronze medal match.



Sunrisers Hyderabad Shatter IPL Record With Mammoth 287-Run Total Against RCB :-

The thrilling Indian Premier League encounter between Royal Challengers Bengaluru and Sunrisers Hyderabad made history at M Chinnaswamy Stadium. The visiting

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team batted first, and because to Travis Head's century and Heinrich Klaasen's fifty, they posted the greatest total in Indian Premier League history: 287/3 in 20 overs. However, it was not the only record which got broken as RCB put up a solid fight in front of a mammoth task and o teams accumulated the highest aggregate score in a T20 match - 549 runs.



Pat Cummins And Sciver-Brunt Named Wisden's Top Cricketers :-

In the 2024 edition of Wisden Cricketers' Almanck, Australian captain Pat Cummins and England all-rounder Nat Sciver-Brunt have been crowned the world's leading cricketers. According to ESPN, the Australian pace spearhead and Test and ODI captain led his team to victory over India in their maiden ICC World Test Championship in June, followed by their sixth ICC Cricket World Cup trophy in Ahmedabad in November. Sciver Brunt has been recognised as the top women's cricketer because of her role in the women's Ashes.

Rohit Sharma Achieves Historic Milestone, RS Becomes First Indian To Hit 500 T20 Sixes:-

Rohit Sharma's ability to consistently knock sixes makes him one of the most efficient hitters in modern cricket. And the Indian captain now holds the record for being the first batsman from his country to hit 500 sixes in T20 cricket. Rohit reached the milestone during the IPL 2024 match against Chennai Super Kings at Wankhede Stadium by hitting Ravindra Jadeja for a slog sweep. The list is led by West Indies legend Chris Gayle, who had smashed 1056 sixes in 463 matches. Kieron Pollard is second with 860 maximums in 625 matches.





Rohit Sharma Becomes 2nd Player After MS Dhoni To Play 250 Matches In IPL :-

MI opener Rohit Sharma became only the second player in Indian Premier League history to play 250 games. Sharma replicated MS Dhoni's exceptional feat when he was chosen to play for MI in their encounter against PBKS on Thursday, April 18 at the Mullanpur Stadium. Rohit has been nearing his destructive best in the IPL 2024, having already scored a century. Sharma is closely followed by Dinesh Karthik in the list of most matches played in the IPL. In fact, Karthik and Rohit, known as close friends outside of the field, were tied at 249 matches before this game.

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D Gukesh wins the Candidates Chess tournament in Toronto:-

India's 17-year-old Grandmaster Gukesh Dommaraju
scripted history by winning the Candidates ChessTournament in Toronto to become the youngest-ever
challenger to the world title. He will take on the reigning
world champion, China's Ding Liren, for the crown laterSupport

points here after drawing his final-round game against
American Hikaru Nakamura. He became only the second
Indian after the great Viswanathan Anand to win the
Candidates. Five-time world champion Anand's triumph
came in 2014.



Karnataka's Nandini to sponsor Scotland and Ireland cricket teams for T20 World Cup :-

Prepare to see the Nandini logo on Scotland and Ireland cricketers' jerseys during the ICC Men's T20 World Cup, which begins in June. The Karnataka Milk Federation, a dairy cooperative in the state that sells various dairy products under the brand name Nandini, will sponsor the two teams in the competition. Sources estimate that each team will receive around ₹2.5 crore in sponsorship. The KMF had previously sponsored Bengaluru Bulls who play in the Pro Kabaddi League. Saurav Ghosal Bids Farewell To Professional Squash :-

Saurav Ghosal, a two-time Asian Games gold medalist, has opted to end his professional career. Saurav Ghosal's retirement symbolizes the end of an era in the sport, as he was the only Indian male player to ever reach the top ten in the world rankings. 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Yuvraj Singh Named ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024 Ambassador :-

The International Cricket Council (ICC) has named famous Indian all-rounder Yuvraj Singh as its brand ambassador for the Men's T20 World Cup 2024, which

will be co-hosted by the West Indies and the United States of America. The tournament is scheduled to start on June 1. In the inaugural edition of the T20 World Cup in 2007, Yuvraj set the tournament alight by smashing six maximums in an over. India managed to win the trophy under the leadership of the legendary MS Dhoni.

Tripura: Matabari Pera Prasad, Rignai Pachara textiles get GI Tag :-

Tripura Chief Minister Manik Saha has announced that two commodities from the state have received the famous Geographical Indication (GI) label. The two things to earn the tag are Matabari Pera, a dairy-based confectionery delicacy traditionally provided as prasad at the Tripurasundari temple in Gomati district, and Pachra, a handwoven textile utilized by the state's Indigenous groups. The Matabari Mahila Cluster Level Bahumukhi Samabaya Samity Limited had applied for the GI tag for Matabari Pera while the Dewanbari Mahila Cluster Bahumukhi Samabaya Samity Limited had made a similar application for Pachra or Rignai textile in March last year.



Bundelkhand Wheat Variety Gets GI Tag :-

The Bundelkhand region of Uttar Pradesh has obtained its first Geographical Indication (GI) tag for agricultural produce. According to the authorities, the indigenous farm produce wheat, also known as Kathiya Gehu (wheat), has been granted the prized Geographical Indication (GI) status. Bhupesh Pal, the Assistant General Manager, NABARD Jhansi, said an application for the GI certification was filed by a local FPO, Khatiya Wheat Bangra Producer Company Limited with the support of NABARD and technical guidance by director, Human Welfare Organisation, Varanasi Padma Shri Rajnikant Rai in January 2022.



Miraj's Sitars And Tanpuras Awarded Geographical Indication Tags :-

The sitars and tanpuras of Miraj, a small town in Maharashtra's Sangli district noted for its musical instrument manufacture, have been granted the coveted

Geographical Indication (GI) designation. The makers claim that these Miraj-made instruments are in high demand among some of the most well-known artists, including those in classical music and the film industry. The GI tag denotes the product comes from a particular geographical area, and often enhances its commercial value.



Mahindra Group To Invest Rs 1,200 Crore For Hybrid Project In Maharashtra :-

Mahindra Susten plans to invest ₹1,200 crore in a 150megawatt solar wind energy project in Maharashtra. According to a statement from Mahindra Group, the project will comprise the installation of 101 megawatts (MW) of wind and 52 megawatts of solar capacity. The project is planned to create 460 million kilowatt-hours (kWh) of clean energy, which will offset 420,000 tonnes of CO2 emissions. The company aims to commission the project within the next two years. It will have more than 80 per cent locally manufactured components.



J&K High Court Upholds Rule Of Law, Quashes Detention Under Public Safety Act :-

The Jammu and Kashmir High Court ruled against the imprisonment of a Kashmir citizen under the Public Safety Act (PSA), stating that supporting this "would be to concede to the scenario that India is a police state, which it is not". The court emphasized that in a democratic society like India, "which is governed by the rule of law", police and magistrates cannot arrest and interrogate a person unless a case has been registered against him. The petitioner, Jaffar Ahmad Parray, a resident of south Kashmir's Shopian, was booked under the PSA last year and had challenged his detention in court.



Banaras Tirangi Barfi And Dhalua Murti Metal Casting Craft Receive GI Tag :-

Nearly eight decades after India's independence, the "Tirangi Barfi" of Kashi, a sweet treat described as the "sweet weapon" of freedom fighters during the Quit India Movement, has been granted the renowned

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Geographical Indication (GI) status. The GI Registry certified not just the Banaras Tirangi Barfi, but also five other Uttar Pradesh items. These include Banaras Metal Casting Craft, Lakhimpur Kheri Tharu Embroidery, Bareilly Cane and Bamboo craft, Bareilly Zardozi Craft, and Pilkhuwa Hand Block Print Textile.



Three new archaeological sites discovered in Telangana :-

Archaeologists in Telangana have discovered three amazing sites, each with unique insights into the region's ancient history. Among these findings are over 200 megalithic monuments concealed amid deep woodlands, a remarkable Iron Age megalithic site with distinctive architectural forms, and two rock art sites showing ancient artistic expressions. A breakthrough discovery in the Mulugu district has uncovered an Iron Age megalithic complex at Ooragutta, near Bandala village. This site showcases previously unseen monument types, hinting at a distinct architectural tradition and cultural identity. The team also discovered two new rock art sites at Damaratogu in Gundala mandal of Bhadradri Kothagudem district.



In a first, Nagaland's 'elite' cops deployed in state :-

For the first time, a Nagaland police squad trained in counter-insurgency operations and coping with largescale unrest has been deployed to Kerala's left-wing extremism (LWE)-affected areas to provide security ERSIT during the elections. The contingent consists of 11 companies of the Nagaland armed police force, totaling 800 armed troops, and has been deployed to LWEaffected areas in Kasaragod, Kannur city, rural, and Kozhikode rural police districts. The team travelled from Madurai to the state after completing poll duty in Tamil Nadu.



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Take action against those obstructing bike taxi services: Karnataka HC to state :-

The Karnataka High Court has ordered the state government to protect bike taxi operators by taking tough measures against any individuals or companies caught illegally impeding bike taxi riders from using their services. The Bike Taxi Welfare Association, one of the petitioners, stated that the measure will help them fight harassment, physical violence, vehicle damage, and obstruction suffered by bike taxi riders from some auto unions and their members in Bangalore.



India's First Multi-Purpose Green Hydrogen Pilot Project Inaugurated In Himachal Pradesh :-

Satluj Jal Vidyut Nigam (SJVN) officials recently inaugurated India's first multi-purpose green hydrogen pilot project at the 1,500 MW Nathpa Jhakri Hydro Power Station (NJHPS) in Himachal Pradesh's Jhakri. According to a release, SJVN Chairman and Managing Director Geeta Kapur inaugurated a green hydrogen pilot project with a capacity of 25kW fuel cell and 20Nm3/hr electrolyzer. The project is the nation's first multipurpose (combined heat and power) green hydrogen generation plant with the capability to cater to the highvelocity oxygen fuel (HVOF) coating facility of NJHPS to meet its combustion fuel requirements, in addition to generating electricity through its 25kW capacity fuel cell.



Tamil Nadu Conducting Nilgiri Tahr Survey with IUCN Observer :-

With the goal of removing the Nilgiri Tahr (Nilgiritragus hylocrius) from the endangered list, the Tamil Nadu government launched a coordinated survey of the state wildlife on April 29. The three-day effort aims to assess the Tahrs' population, which once roamed the Anamalai and Nilgiris landscapes. The animal is listed as an endangered species by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) and protected under Schedule-I of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.

Meghalaya to hold Strawberry Festival from April 5:-

From April 5 to April 13, Meghalaya will celebrate the Strawberry Festival, which aims to increase the state's strawberry's popularity. It is being coordinated by the state departments of agriculture, tourism, and farmers' welfare. Programs will be held during "Strawberry Mahotsav" to encourage farmers to start growing strawberries. It is noteworthy that under numerous federal and state initiatives, the Directorate of Horticulture has extensively planted strawberry plants in Meghalaya. On the other hand, the strawberry harvest season has also started in the state.



RBI Celebrated 90 Years Of Service On April 1, 2024 :-

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), the country's primary financial institution, celebrates its 90th anniversary on April 1st, 2024. To commemorate this historic anniversary, Prime Minister Narendra Modi attended the event at Mumbai's National Centre for the Performing Arts. The RBI was created on April 1, 1934, in response to the Royal Commission on Indian Currency and Finance's recommendations for maintaining monetary stability in the country. Its operations commenced on April 1, 1935, with Sir Osborne Smith as the first Governor.



US plans trilateral summit with Japan, South Korea in July :-

According to Japanese media reports, the US administration intends to have a summit in July between President Joe Biden and his Japanese and South Korean counterparts on the margins of a NATO conference in Washington. According to the Kyodo news agency, Biden, Japan's Prime Minister Fumio Kishida, and South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol are likely to discuss issues such as reinforcing deterrence against China, North Korea's nuclear threat, and the country's developing military relations with Russia.

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Brand World Summit 2024 : 05 July :-

The Economic Times reported that the sixth edition of the Brand World Summit (BWS) will be held on July 5th at Mumbai's iconic Taj Lands End. This premier conference, hosted by ETBrandEquity.com, brings together leading experts in the brand world to chart the future of advertising and marketing. The Brand World Summit provides an important opportunity for present and future leaders to engage in informed debates about the changing branding landscape. The country's advertising spending is projected to reach Rs 1,55,386 crore in 2024, indicating promising growth prospects.



Ajit Doval Lead Indian Delegation At SCO Security Council Meeting :-

National Security Advisor Ajit Doval recently led the Indian delegation to the Secretaries of the Security Councils of Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) member countries in Kazakhstan, where he addressed the threat of terrorism and discussed various ways to improve the nations' security situation. According to an official statement, Doval strongly condemned the terrorist attack on Crocus City Hall in Moscow on March 22, which killed 144 people, and expressed his condolences and India's solidarity with the Russian government and citizens in addressing the threat of terrorism in all its forms and manifestations.



UAE's Masdar To Host World Future Energy Summit :-

Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company PJSC - Masdar, the UAE's sustainable energy powerhouse, is preparing to host the World Future Energy Summit (WFES). WFES, held from April 16 to 18 at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre (ADNEC), is the world's biggest business event for future energy, clean technology, and sustainability, including a jam-packed schedule of events, activations, talks, and forums. The Innovation Zone, hosted by Masdar, will feature a series of industry panels with innovators and experts, focusing on the latest climate solutions.



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Ministry of Defence holds first tri-service conference 'Parivartan Chintan' :-

Parivartan Chintan, a landmark Tri-Service Conference aimed at creating new and creative ideas, initiatives, and reforms to drive Jointness and Integration activities, was held in New Delhi on April 8, 2024. General Anil Chauhan, Chief of Defence Staff, chaired a day-long discussion. The 'Chintan' is the first-ever conference of the heads of all Tri-Service Institutions, the Department of Military Affairs, Headquarters Integrated Defence Staff, and the three Services, with officers from various service brackets recommending measures to achieve the desired "Joint and Integrated" end state with celerity.



In Warning to China, Biden Hosts Summit With Leaders of Japan and Philippines :-

US President Joe Biden, Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida and Philippines President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. on 11 April was in Washington for their first-ever trilateral defense summit. The meeting, held after a bilateral meeting between Biden and Marcos, comes as Chinese and Philippines coast guard vessels in the disputed South China Sea regularly become involved in skirmishes, with China increasingly asserting its territorial claims in the region. Ahead of the meeting, Philippines President Marcos said a main focus of talks would be ways of avoiding conflict in the South China Sea.



India On Ukraine Peace Summit In Switzerland That Russia Will Skip :-

The Swiss government has declared that it will hold a high-level peace summit in June to end the Russia-Ukraine conflict. It hopes that Russia will attend, even if not on the first day. India has welcomed the effort, saying, "We are open to all such initiatives for peace. You know our position in the Russia-Ukraine war." Swiss President Viola Amherd will host the meeting, which will be held on June 15-16 at the luxury Burgenstock resort near the central city of Luzern. "This is a first step in a process towards a lasting peace," she said.



ECI holds video-conference with over 250 observers for Phase II of poll :-

The Election Commission of India had a virtual conference with more than 250 observers appointed for

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the upcoming Phase 2 polls on April 26th. This meeting, presided over by Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar, underlined the significance of maintaining a seamless, free, and fair electoral process in 88 parliamentary constituencies spanning 12 states and union territories. One of the primary directives issued during the conference was to guarantee that all polling stations are equipped with essential amenities.




Nepal leads inaugural Rainbow Tourism Conference, pledges safe destination for all :-

Section 120B of the Indian Penal Code (IPC)



Why in the news?

- The Supreme Court has rejected review petitions challenging its ruling on the initiation of proceedings under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA).
- The judgment clarified that Section 120B of the Indian Penal Code cannot be invoked for PMLA proceedings unless the alleged conspiracy pertains to a scheduled offence.

What is Article 120 of Indian Penal Code (IPC)?

- Section 120 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) deals with the concept of "Conspiracy to commit an offense".
- It states that when two or more persons agree to do, or cause to be done, an illegal act, or an act which is not illegal by illegal means, such an agreement is designated a criminal conspiracy.
- Section 120A defines "criminal conspiracy" as when two or more persons agree to do, or cause to be done, an illegal act or an act which is not illegal by illegal means.
- Section 120B prescribes the punishment for criminal conspiracy, with death, imprisonment for life, or rigorous imprisonment for a term of two years or upwards, shall be punished in the same manner as if he had abetted such offense.

Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002

- The PMLA was enacted in 2002 with the aim of preventing money laundering and providing for confiscation of property derived from money laundering.
- It applies to all financial institutions, banks (including the RBI), mutual funds, insurance companies, and their financial intermediaries.
- The Act empowers government authorities to confiscate property and/or assets earned from illegal sources and through money laundering.
- It has been amended three times, in 2005, 2009, and 2012.
- Under the PMLA, the burden of proof lies with the accused, who must demonstrate that the suspect property/assets have not been obtained through proceeds of crime.

Penalties under PMLA:

- Freezing or Seizure of property and records, and/or attachment of property obtained through crime proceeds.
- Rigorous imprisonment for a minimum of 3 years and a maximum of 7 years. In cases where money laundering is linked with the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, the punishment can extend up to 10 years, along with a fine.
- Fine imposition.

Authorities for investigation under PMLA:

- Enforcement Directorate (ED): It is responsible for investigating offenses under the PMLA.
- Financial Intelligence Unit India (FIU-IND): It is the national agency tasked with receiving, processing, analyzing, and disseminating information related to suspect financial transactions.

Punishment for Criminal Conspiracy

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- Nature of Conspiracy: IPC 120B categorizes conspiracy based on the gravity of the offense and prescribes punishments accordingly.
- Serious Offenses: Conspiracy to commit serious crimes punishable by death, life imprisonment, or rigorous imprisonment for 2 years or more warrants severe punishment equivalent to the offense committed.
- Other Offenses: Conspiracy for illegal acts not falling under the serious category incurs imprisonment for up to six months, a fine, or both, as per Section 120B.

Why in the news?

Recently, the RBI celebrated its 90th year in Mumbai, marking a significant milestone.

Dr. Ambedkar's Role in the Establishment of RBI:

- Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's contributions were particularly notable during the Hilton Young Commission discussions in 1926, where he presented his recommendations based on his book "The Problem of the Rupee – Its Origin and Its Solution."
- These discussions laid the foundation for the establishment of the RBI on April 1, 1935.

About Reserve Bank of India (RBI)

- The RBI is the central bank and monetary authority of India.
- It was established on April 1, 1935, under the <u>Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934</u>.
- Its idea was incepted from the recommendations of the Hilton Young Commission.
- Sir Osborne Arkell Smith, an <u>Australian</u>, served as the inaugural Governor.
- He was succeeded by Sir C D Deshmukh, the first Indian to hold the position.
- It is a centralized institution for India to effectively regulate its monetary and credit policies.
- RBI had its initial headquarters in Kolkata, later moving permanently to Mumbai in 1937.
- Initially, the RBI operated as a **privately owned** entity until its full nationalization in 1949.

Functions and Initiatives:

Progress made so far

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• The RBI has shared a list of **442 digital lending apps** with the IT Ministry for **whitelisting with Google**.

Google has **removed over 2,200 digital lending apps** from its PlayStore, aligning with RBI and DFS directives to only allow apps from regulated entities or their partners.

RBI to launch Mobile App for Retail Direct scheme

Why in the news?

The RBI has decided to introduce a Mobile App of its RBI Retail Direct scheme aimed at facilitating seamless investment in government securities by retail investors.

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What is Retail Direct Scheme?

- Retail Direct Scheme was rolled out in November 2021, giving access to individual investors to maintain gilt accounts with RBI and invest in government securities.
- Using this app, investors can buy <u>central and</u> state government bonds as well as Treasury bills.
- It enables investors to buy securities in <u>primary</u> <u>auctions</u> as well as buy/sell securities through the Negotiated Dealing System-Order Matching system (NDS-OM) platform.
- A Gilt Account can be compared with a bank account, except that the account is debited or credited with treasury bills or government securities instead of money.

Treasury Bills:

- They are promissory notes issued by the RBI on behalf of the government as a short term liability and sold to banks and to the public.
- The maturity period ranges from **14 to 364 days**.
- They are the **negotiable instruments**, i.e. they are freely **transferable**.
- No interest is paid on such bills but they are issued at a discount on their face value.

How does it work?

- Under the scheme, small investors can buy or sell government securities (G-Secs), or bonds, directly without an intermediary like a mutual fund.
- However, the same tax rules apply to income from G-Secs.
- The **minimum amount** for a bid is **₹10,000** and in multiples of **₹10,000** thereafter.
- Payments may be made through Net banking or the UPI

Imposition of Anti-Dumping Duty on Sodium Cyanide



Why in the news?

The Directorate General of Trade Remedies (DGTR) has recently recommended the imposition of anti-dumping duty on sodium cyanide (NaCN) imported from China, the European Union, Japan, and Korea.

Sodium Cyanide and Its Applications

- Sodium cyanide is a deadly toxic, white, crystalline compound with the chemical formula NaCN.
- It is a **water-soluble solid**, mainly used in gold mining, electroplating, and in the synthesis of organic chemicals.
- It is hygroscopice. it quickly absorbs water from the air.

- In **gold mining**, sodium cyanide is used to dissolve and separate gold from its ores.
- It plays a pivotal role in various industrial processes, electroplating, metal heat treatment, and the production of insecticides, dyes, pigments, and pharmaceuticals.

What is Anti-Dumping Duty?

- An anti-dumping duty is a protectionist tariff that

 a domestic government imposes on foreign
 imports that it believes are priced below the price
 at which it is sold in the exporters' domestic
 market.
- This is imposed with the rationale that these products have the potential to undercut local businesses and the local economy.
- The World Trade Organization (WTO) operates a set of international trade rules for the regulation of anti-dumping measures.
- In general, the WTO agreement permits governments to act against dumping "if it causes or threatens material injury to an established industry in the territory of a contracting party.

Anti-Dumping Mechanism in India:

- The Anti-Dumping mechanism in India is administered by the Directorate General of Anti-Dumping and Allied Duties (DGAD) under the Ministry of Finance.
- The anti-dumping law in India is covered under the Customs Tariff Act, 1975, and the Customs Tariff Rules, 1995.
- The DGAD conducts anti-dumping investigations to determine if the domestic industry has been hurt by a surge in below-cost imports.

How is Anti-Dumping Duty calculated?

- The anti-dumping duty is calculated as the difference between the normal value and the export value of the product.
- The normal value is the market value of the product in the domestic market, while the export value is the price at which the product is exported to India.
- The anti-dumping duty is imposed to offset the price difference and prevent the domestic industry from being harmed by cheap imports.

What is Consumer Confidence Survey?



Why in the news?

- The latest *Consumer Confidence Survey* conducted by the Reserve Bank of India in March 2024 reveals a significant boost in consumer confidence, particularly regarding future expectations.
- It says consumer confidence has hit highest level in nearly 5 years.

What is Consumer Confidence Survey (CCS)?

• The **RBI** conducts a bi-monthly Consumer Confidence Survey to measure consumers' perceptions of the prevailing economic situation.

- It was *started in 2015* with surveys in 13 major cities.
- The survey is conducted *across various cities* and measures consumer confidence on parameters such as the economy, employment, price, income, and spending.
- The survey consists of questions regarding consumers' sentiments over various factors in the current situation and future.

Here are a few parameters that help aggregate overall confidence:

- 1. **Spending:** The consumer is asked about the willingness to spend on major consumer durables, purchasing vehicles, or real estate. This measures the overall spending scenario on necessities as well as luxuries for the next quarter.
- Employment: The consumer is asked about current and future ideas on employment situations, joblessness, job security, which reflects the sentiments of the current or expected employment in the country.
- 3. **Inflation:** The consumer is asked about interest rates and levels of prices of all goods, tracking the price expected by consumers and their spending on basic necessities.

Components of CCS:

- 1. **Current Situation Index (CSI):** It measures overall consumer sentiment regarding the present economic situation.
- 2. Future Expectations Index (FEI): It analyses consumer sentiment for the next 12 months.

CSI and FEI are calculated based on people's views about the economy, their income, spending, job opportunities, and *prices compared to the previous year* and *expectations for the year ahead*.

Key Highlights of the recent report

- Future Expectations Index (FEI) has climbed by 2.1 points to reach 125.2, marking its highest level since mid-2019, indicating heightened optimism among consumers for the year ahead.
- **Current Situation Index (CSI)** has surged by 3.4 points to reach 98.5, marking its highest level since mid-2019.

Growth in Ashwagandha Exports



Why in the news?

- Ashwagandha exports have surged by 8 times in the past six years, penetrating markets like the United States, Czech Republic, and Canada.
- The Ayurvedic industry in India has been growing at a *Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of* 17%, with the industry size increasing from \$3 billion in 2014 to \$24 billion today.
- Gujarat, with about 850 Ayurvedic manufacturing units, ranks fourth in the country after Uttar Pradesh, Kerala, and Maharashtra.
- India leads in Ashwagandha production and export, with states like *Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh* emerging as key producers.
- The herb is exported primarily as extracts and has gained significant traction in the United States, where it competes with *Chinese Ginseng*.

What is Ashwagandha?

- Also known as *Indian Ginseng or Withania* somnifera, Ashwagandha belongs to a group of herbs known as 'adaptogens' (best rejuvenating agent).
 - It is available in various forms such as **extracts**, **powder**, **and raw herbs**, catering to domestic and international markets.

Medicinal Properties and Usage:

- In treatment of *rheumatic pain, inflammation of joints, nervous disorders and epilepsy.*
- Used as a tonic for *hiccup*, *cold*, *cough*, *female disorders*, *as a sedative*, *in care of senile debility*, *ulcers*, etc.
- Leaves are applied for carbuncles, inflammation and swellings. Leaf juice is useful in conjunctivitis.
- **Bark decoction** is taken for asthma and applied locally to bed sores.
- Ashwagandha and its **extracts** are used in the preparation of herbal tea, powders, tablets, and syrups.

Cultivation of Ashwagandha

 Ashwagandha-growing states: Rajasthan, Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Gujarat, Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh.

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- Being a *hardy and drought-tolerant crop*, Ashwagandha requires a *relatively dry season* throughout its growing period.
- It is grown as late *rainy season (kharif) crop* between 600-1200 m altitudes.
- It grows well in sandy loam or light red soil having *pH 7.5 to 8.0* (alkaloid) with good drainage.
- **Black soil** or such heavy soil is suitable for cultivation.

Taiwan's Earthquake and the Pacific Ring of Fire



Why in the news?

- Taiwan was struck by its most powerful earthquake in at least 25 years.
- Its susceptibility to earthquakes is attributed to its location along the Pacific "Ring of Fire" where a majority of the world's seismic activity occurs.
- Taiwan is primarily influenced by the collision of the **Philippine Sea Plate** and the **Eurasian Plate**.

What is the Pacific 'Ring of Fire'?

- The Pacific 'Ring of Fire' or *Pacific Rim*, or the Circum-Pacific Belt, is an area along the Pacific Ocean that is characterized by active volcanoes and frequent earthquakes.
- Volcanic arcs and oceanic trenches partly encircling the Pacific Basin form the so-called Ring of Fire.
- It is home to about 75 per cent of the world's volcanoes more than 450 volcanoes.

• Also, about <u>90 per cent of the world's</u> earthquakes occur here.

Its spread


- Its length is over 40,000 kilometres and traces from New Zealand clockwise in an almost circular arc covering Tonga, Kermadec Islands, Indonesia.
 - It is moving up to the **Philippines**, Japan, and stretching eastward to the Aleutian Islands, then southward along the western coast of North America and South America.

Seismic activity of the region

- The area is along several tectonic plates including the Pacific plate, Philippine Plate, Juan de Fuca plate, Cocos plate, Nazca plate, and North American plate.
- The movement of these plates or **tectonic activity** makes the area witness abundant earthquakes and tsunamis every year.
- Along much of the Ring, tectonic plates move towards each other creating **subduction zones**.
- One plate gets pushed down or is subducted by the other plate.
- This is a very slow process a movement of just one or two inches per year.
- As this subduction happens, rocks melt, become magma and move to Earth's surface and cause volcanic activity.

India's Soil Erosion Trends: Insights from a New Study

Why in the news?

- Titled "Geospatial modelling and mapping of soil erosion in India," the report marks the first attempt to classify soil erosion on a pan-India basis.
- The study categorizes soil erosion into six classifications, ranging from "minor" to real "catastrophic," based on the amount of soil eroded per hectare over a year.

Soil Erosion in India

- Soil erosion is the process by which soil is removed or displaced from its original location, often due to the action of wind, water, or human activities.
- It is a natural geological process accelerated by various factors such as deforestation, overgrazing, improper agricultural practices, urbanization, and climate change.

Key trends in India

- Nearly 30% of the country's landmass is experiencing "minor" soil erosion.
- Critical 3% (approx. 1500 sq km) faces "catastrophic" topsoil loss.
- The Brahmaputra Valley in Assam emerged as the most significant hotspot for soil erosion, with close to 300 square kilometers or 31% of its surface soil lost to "catastrophic" erosion.
- The lower Himalayan region, extending from Kashmir to Uttarakhand and beyond, and Odisha also face severe erosion challenges, posing

threats to biodiversity and environmental stability.

Causes of Soil Erosion

- 1. Anthropogenic Causes: Soil erosion in India is primarily caused by human activities including deforestation, overgrazing, improper land use practices, and construction activities.
- 2. Natural Causes: The monsoon season, characterized by heavy rainfall, exacerbates soil erosion, especially in regions with steep slopes and poor vegetation cover.

Impact of Soil Erosion

- Topsoil, essential for agriculture due to its nutrient-rich composition, is crucial for sustaining crop growth.
- Erosion diminishes soil fertility, leading to reduced crop yields and agricultural productivity.

NGT Intervention to prevent Stubble Burning

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Why in the news?

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has directed the Punjab government to devise a comprehensive strategy for managing the estimated 19.52 million tonnes of paddy stubble in the state.

NGT intervention in Punjab

- The ban and action against people burning crop residue are <u>regulated under the Air (Prevention</u> <u>and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981.</u>
- Punjab is <u>required to provide details on the</u> <u>steps taken</u> to utilize paddy straw in the previous year, including the mode and manner of removal, transportation, and utilization in various units.
- Punjab estimated an increase in paddy straw generation to <u>52 million tonnes in 2024</u>, with a projected utilization of 18.66 million tonnes.
- Notably, the off-site utilization is expected to see a significant 60% increase, with 5.96 million tonnes being utilized in industrial and energy plants.

Alternatives used for Stubble Burning


- In-Situ Treatment: This involves managing crop residue directly in the field. Examples include using zero-tiller machines and bio-decomposers to break down stubble.
- **Ex-Situ Treatment**: This method involves treating crop residue outside the field. An example is using rice straw as cattle fodder.
- **Turbo Happy Seeder (THS) Technique**: This can uproot stubble and sow seeds while clearing the field. The stubble can then be used as mulch.

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Jiadhal River and Change of its Course



Why in the news?

 Climate Change is disrupting Jiadhal River's (Dhemaji district, Assam) tranquil flow, leading to unprecedented shifts in its course and causing upheaval for residents.

About Jiadhal River:

- It flows through the districts of Darrang, Udalguri, and Baksa in the northeastern state of Assam.
 - It is also known *Kumotiya River* after flowing from Gogamukh.
- **Origin:** From the Hills of Bhutan, flows through the Assam Himalayas before meandering through the plains of Assam. It is formed by the confluence of several smaller streams.
- Major tributaries: Kolong River and the Daokao River.
- It eventually joins the Brahmaputra River near the town of Nalbari.
- It is known as the 'Sorrow of Dhemaji' for the heavy damage caused by annual floods and erosion.

Factors leading to changes in the Jiadhal River's Course

- **Erosion:** Flowing water gradually wears away the riverbanks and bed, causing the river to meander and change course.
- Sediment deposition: Accumulation of sediment can create new channels or alter the flow pattern of the river.

- Human activities: Dams, channelization, urbanization, deforestation, and mining can disrupt natural river processes, leading to changes in flow and morphology.
- **Climate change:** Changes in precipitation, temperature, and glacier melt affect river flow patterns and behavior.
- **Tectonic activity:** Uplift, subsidence, and faulting influence river topography and drainage patterns, leading to adjustments in course and behavior.

Norms tweaked for Green Credit Programme



Why in the news?

The Union Environment Ministry has rolled out norms for the Green Credit Programme (GCP).

Guidelines and Modifications:

- The Environment Ministry's recent guidelines empower 'States' to determine afforestation density based on local conditions, acknowledging the variability in forest ecosystems.
- Indigenous species are prioritized, and naturally occurring seedlings are retained to foster ecosystem resilience.

What is Green Credit Programme (GCP)?

- The GCP as *notified on October 13, 2023* by the government of India, is an innovative marketbased mechanism.
- This program is part of the broader 'LiFE' campaign (Lifestyle for Environment), and it encourages and rewards voluntary environmentally positive actions.
- It involves various stakeholders like- individuals, farmers, communities, private sector industries, and companies.
- The *Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE)*, based in Dehradun, serves as the GCP Administrator, responsible for programme implementation, management, monitoring, and operation.
- Initially, the GCP focuses on water conservation and afforestation.

What are Green Credits?

- The green credit rules notified under the Environment (Protection) Act 1986 defines 'green credit' as a single unit of an incentive provided for a specific activity that delivers a positive impact on the environment.
- Each tree planted and evaluated by the ICFRE after two years could yield one 'green credit,' which can be utilized in two ways:
- 1. Compliance with forest laws necessitating recompense for forest land diversion.

2. Reporting under environmental, social, and governance norms or meeting corporate social responsibility requirements.

Activities under GCP

The GCP includes numerous activities, such as:

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Notable Feature: Green Credit Registry

- The ICFRE, alongside experts, is developing the *Green Credit Registry* and trading platforms to facilitate the registration, buying, and selling of green credits.
- To obtain green credits, individuals and entities must register their activities through the central government's dedicated app/website (www.moefcc-gcp.in).
- The administrator verifies activities through a designated agency, with self-verification for small projects. Once verified, the administrator issues a tradeable green credit certificate.

Future prospects

The programme is currently in a **pilot phase**, with ongoing deliberations on:

- Quantifying the contributions of shrubs and grasses to green credits;
- 2. Equivalence between green and carbon credits;

3. Allocation of credits for compensatory afforestation.

What is Zero FIR?



Why in the news?

• The Hyderabad Police have initiated a zero FIR case against former minister for alleged derogatory remarks against Telangana CM.

First Information Report (FIR)

- An FIR is a written document prepared by the police upon receiving information about a cognisable offence.
- It is when an officer can arrest a suspect without a court's warrant if/she has "reason to believe" that the person committed the offence and arrest is necessary based on certain factors.
- It serves as the first step towards initiating the investigation process and subsequent police actions.
- Section 154(1) of the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) empowers the police to register an FIR for cognizable offences.
- Section 166A of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) provides punishment for public servants failing to record information related to a cognizable offence, with imprisonment of up to two years and a fine.

What is Zero FIR?

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- Provision and Purpose: Zero FIR allows any police station to register an FIR for a cognisable offence without assigning a regular FIR number initially.
- **No diary**: Whereas FIRs have serial numbers assigned to them, zero FIRs are assigned the number '0'. Hence the name.

Features of a Zero FIR:

- 1. **Swift Action**: The relevant police station subsequently registers a fresh FIR and commences the investigation.
- 2. Focus on Victims: It is designed to expedite complaint lodging, particularly for serious crimes involving women and children, without the need to approach multiple police stations.
- 3. **Preserving Evidence**: Early registration helps prevent the loss or tampering of crucial evidence and witnesses.
- Transferred Jurisdiction: The Zero FIR is later transferred to the relevant police station where the offence occurred or where the investigation should be conducted.

How does it work?

- After a police station registers a zero FIR, it has to transfer the complaint to a police station that has the jurisdiction to investigate the alleged offence.
- Once a zero FIR is transferred, the police station with the appropriate jurisdiction assigns it a serial number, thereby converting it into a regular FIR.

Legal Provisions for Zero FIR

The provision of Zero FIR finds support in various judgments and recommendations:

- 1. **Satvinder Kaur vs. State (1999)**: The Delhi High Court held that a woman has the right to lodge her complaint from any place other than where the incident occurred.
- 2. Justice Verma Committee (2012): The introduction of Zero FIR was based on the recommendation of the Justice Verma Committee, which was formed in response to the 2012 Nirbhaya gangrape case.

3. Lalita Kumari vs. Govt. of UP (2014): The Supreme Court ruled that registration of an FIR is mandatory when information discloses the commission of a cognizable offence.

Why in the news?

- The Supreme Court ruling refusing to accept R SIT Patanjali's MD's unconditional apologies underscores the gravity of intentionally misleading advertisements and their repercussions.
- Despite apologies, Patanjali's breach of its commitment not to disseminate false claims about curing various illnesses led to this decision.



Understanding Misleading Advertisements:

 The Consumer Protection Act, 2019 prohibits unfair trade practices, including misleading advertisements, and provides mechanisms for consumers to seek redressal for grievances related to misleading advertising.

Following are the types of Misleading Ads:

- 1. **False Claims:** Advertisements with untrue statements about a product's features or benefits.
- 2. **Exaggerated Claims:** Ads that overstate a product's benefits beyond reason.
- 3. **Omission of Material Information:** Ads that hide important details consumers need to know.
- 4. **Comparative Advertising:** Ads unfairly attacking competitors' products.
- 5. **Endorsements and Testimonials:** Ads using fake endorsements or testimonials.
- 6. **Health and Safety Claims:** Ads with unproven health or safety benefits.

Bait-and-Switch Tactics: Ads luring with false promises and switching to different offers.

The Concept of Obiter Dicta Lexicon:

- In the context of the criticism directed towards the Hon'ble Supreme Court Bench's statement in the Patanjali case, the concept of "obiter dicta lexicon" may find relevance.
- "Obiter dicta" is a Latin term that translates to "things said by the way" and refers to statements made by a judge in passing, which are not essential to the decision of the case at hand.
- It refers to the use of language or expressions that are not directly relevant to the legal reasoning or decision-making process in a court judgment or opinion.

SC Bench Statement on Patanjali's Apology:

- The statement "we will rip you apart" is being criticized for being overly aggressive and potentially inappropriate for a judicial setting.
- Therefore, in this case, the use of language that *deviated from the core legal issues* at hand and instead conveyed a sense of aggression or hostility could be viewed as part of the "obiter dicta lexicon."

Regulatory Authorities dealing with the Issue:

- 1. Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI): Ensures fairness and compliance with the ASCI Code in Indian commercials.
- 2. Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA): Regulates consumer rights violations,

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unfair trade practices, and misleading marketing detrimental to public interests. It has issued the Guidelines for the Prevention and Endorsement of Misleading Advertisements, 2022.

Key Legislation dealing with Misleading Ads:

- Bureau of Indian Standards (Certification) Regulations, 1988
- 2. Food Safety and Standards Act of 2006
- The Drugs and Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act of 1955 (DOMA)
- 4. The Drug and Cosmetics Act of 1940
- The Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act of 2003

About the Drugs and Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act of 1955 (DOMA):

- The Magic Remedies Act encompasses the definition of "drug".
- It extends to include articles like talismans, mantras, and charms purportedly possessing RSITY miraculous healing powers.

Here are the key provisions of the Act:

 Prohibition of Certain Advertisements: The Act prohibits advertisements that claim to prevent or cure certain diseases or ailments listed in Schedule J of the Act through drugs or remedies. These diseases include conditions like cancer, tuberculosis, diabetes, and epilepsy.

- 2. **Prohibition of Misleading Advertisements**: The Act prohibits advertisements that are false or misleading in any material particular regarding the nature, substance, quality, or potency of any drug or remedy.
- 3. **Cognizance of Offences**: No court shall take cognizance of any offence under the Act except on a complaint made by the government or by a person authorized by the government.
- 4. **Exemptions**: The Act provides exemptions for advertisements of drugs or remedies containing certain substances or preparations listed in Schedule J if the advertisement conforms to the conditions specified in the Schedule.

Violations made by Patanjali Ayurveda

- 1. Drugs and Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act of 1954 (DOMA): By disseminating deceptive advertisements, Patanjali breached Section 4 of the DOMA, which prohibits the publication of false drug ads.
- Consumer Protection Act of 2019 (CPA): Patanjali made false claims in their advertisements about curing different illnesses, contravening Section 2(28) of the CPA, which defines "misleading advertisement".
- Violation of MoU between Ministry of AYUSH and ASCI: Patanjali's actions breached the memorandum signed between the Ministry of AYUSH and the Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI), indicating non-compliance with agreed-upon standards for advertising practices.

History

100 Years of Vaikom Satyagraha



Why in the news?

This year April 1st marks 100 years of the Vaikom Satyagraha, in Kottayam, Kerala.

About Vaikom Satyagraha

- Vaikom was the epicentre of the Vaikom Satyagraha, which began in 1924.
- This movement aimed to challenge the ban imposed on marginalized communities from entering the vicinity of the Vaikom Mahadevar Temple in the princely state of Travancore.

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- It sparked similar temple entry movements across India, advocating for the rights of untouchables and backward castes.
- It introduced **nonviolent public protest** as a method of resistance in Kerala.

A Precursor to the Vaikom Satyagraha

- 1. Social and Political Developments
- Backdrop of Social Injustice: Travancore, characterized by feudal and caste-based governance, imposed stringent restrictions on lower castes, denying them entry to temples and public spaces.
- Emergence of Social Consciousness: By the late 19th century, progressive reforms and missionary activities led to increased awareness and education among lower castes, particularly the Ezhavas.
- Rise of Educated Elite: Educated individuals from diverse backgrounds, including lower castes, began to challenge social norms and demand equality in opportunities and rights.
- 2. Beginning of Agitation
- Advocacy for Change: Ezhava leader T K Madhavan spearheaded efforts to challenge temple entry restrictions, advocating for direct action to confront discriminatory practices.
- Influence of Gandhi's Ideals: Inspired by Gandhi's principles of non-cooperation, Madhavan sought support from the Indian National Congress (INC) to mobilize a mass movement against untouchability.

Actual Course of Events

- 1. Agitation
- Leaders such as T.K. Madhavan, K.P. Kesava Menon, and George Joseph spearheaded the agitation.

- Despite facing resistance and arrests by the police, the Satyagrahis persisted in their protest for over a year, resulting in numerous arrests and jails.
- Notable figures like Mahatma Gandhi, Chattampi Swamikal, and Sree Narayana Guru extended their support to the movement, which gained nationwide recognition.
- The **involvement of women** and support from various regions, including Punjab, highlighted the widespread impact of the Satyagraha.
- 2. Suspension:
- Initially suspended in April 1924 at Gandhi's suggestion, the movement resumed when attempts to resolve the issue with caste Hindu leaders failed.
- The absence of leaders like T.K. Madhavan and K.P. Kesava Menon, who were arrested, posed challenges to the movement.
- V. Ramaswamy Naicker (*Periyar*) lent support from Tamil Nadu before also being arrested.
- The resolution for the right to temple entry faced resistance in the Assembly, thwarted by traditionalist support and government pressure.
- 3. Aftermath
- On October 1, 1924, a procession of Savarnas (forward castes) submitted a petition to the Regent Maharani Sethu Lakshmi Bai of Travancore, signed by around 25,000 individuals, urging for the temple's open entry.
- Gandhi's meeting with the Regent Maharani and the procession led by Mannath
 Padmanabhan Nair underscored the growing support for the cause.
- Eventually, on November 23, 1925, all temple gates were opened to Hindus except the eastern gate, marking a significant victory.

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The Vaikom Satyagraha laid the groundwork for the temple entry proclamation of Kerala in 1936 and inspired similar movements' nationwide, promoting social justice and equality.


DNA Findings of Rakhigarhi

This research was conducted by the Deccan College Deemed University, Pune, in collaboration with the Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology, Hyderabad, and The Harvard Medical College.

Their key findings include-

- Debunking of the Aryan Invasion Theory.
- The genetic roots of the Harappans date back to 10,000 BCE.
- DNA of the Harappans has *continued to exist* among the majority of the South Asian population.
- The study indicates genetic continuity without large-scale immigration.

- People from bordering areas and distant regions were absorbed into Indian society.
- Ancestry was closely linked to Iranian ancestry and not at all to Steppe ancestry.
- Farming skills have been developed indigenously contrary to prevalent theories that these came with migrants from the Steppes and Anatolian farmers.



About Rakhigarhi

- The ancient site of Rakhi-Khas and Rakhi-Shahpur are collectively known as Rakhigarhi, located on the right bank of the now dried up Palaeo-channel of Drishadvati.
- It is located in the Ghaggar-Hakra River plain in the Hissar district of Haryana.
- Total seven mounds are located here.
- The site has yielded various stages of Harappan culture and is by far one of the largest Harappan sites in India.
- The site shows the *sequential development* of the Indus culture in the now dried up Saraswati basin.

Major findings at Rakhi Garhi

 Findings confirm both early and mature Harappan phases and include *4,600-year-old human skeletons*, fortification and bricks.

- Digging so far reveals a well-planned city with *92 m wide roads*, a bit wider than in Kalibangan.
- The **pottery is similar to Kalibangan** and Banawali.
- Pits surrounded by walls have been found, which are thought to be for sacrificial or some religious ceremonies.
- There are *brick-lined drains* to handle sewage from the houses.
- Terracotta statues, weights, bronze artefacts, comb, copper fish hooks, needles and terracotta seals have also been found.
- A *bronze vessel* has been found which is decorated with *gold and silver*.
- A granary belonging to the mature Harappan phase has been found here.

Anniversary of the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre



Why in the news?

On April 13, 1919, Brigadier-General Reginald Dyer ordered British troops to open fire on a peaceful

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gathering in Jallianwala Bagh, Amritsar, leaving a deep scar on India's collective memory.

Jallianwala Bagh Massacre

- 1. Background: Protesting the contentious Rowlatt Act
- The act officially known as the Anarchical and Revolutionary Crimes Act, 1919 was passed in 1919 by the Imperial Legislative Council.
- It had authorized the British government to arrest anybody suspected of terrorist activities.
- It also authorized the government to detain such people arrested for up to 2 years without trial.
- It empowered the police to search a place without a warrant. It also placed severe restrictions on the freedom of the press.
- The primary intention of colonial govt. was to repress the growing nationalist movement in the country.
- The British were also afraid of a Ghadarite Revolution in Punjab and the rest of the country.
- 1. The day
- The massacre took place on 13 April 1919 when troops of the British Indian Army (*Gurkha and Sikh infantry regiments*) under the command of *Col. Reginald Dyer* fired rifles into a crowd of Indians.
- The civilians had assembled for a peaceful protest to condemn the arrest and deportation of two national leaders, *Satya Pal and Saifuddin Kitchlew*.
- Dyer without warning ordered his troops to fire at the unarmed crowd which included children as well.
- The indiscriminate firing went on for about 10 minutes which resulted in the deaths of at least

1000 people and injured more than 1500 people.

- 1. Aftermath
- In protest against the massacre, Rabindranath Tagore gave up his knighthood.
- Gandhiji relinquished his title 'Kaiser-ehind' bestowed on him by the British for his services during the Boer War in South Africa.
- Michael O'Dwyer, the then Lieutenant-Governor of Punjab, who had approved the actions of Dyer, was *assassinated by Udham Singh* in London in 1940 as revenge against the massacre.
- The heroic treatment of Dyer's heinous act again set a benchmark of colonial arrogance.

Hunter Commission for Inquiry

- In October 1919 the Secretary of State for India, Edwin Montagu, ordered the formation of a committee of inquiry into the events in Punjab.
- Referred to as the *Disorders Inquiry Committee*, it was later more widely known as the Hunter Commission (Not to be confused with Hunter Education Commission).
- The commission inquiry was concluded without any significant conclusion.
- Still, there are long-standing demands in India that Britain should apologize for the massacre.



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Mahad Satyagraha: A Landmark Event in the Dalit Movement



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Why in the news?

The Mahad Satyagraha is hailed as the **foundational event of the Dalit movement**, marking the community's collective rejection of the caste system and assertion of human rights.

About Mahad Satyagraha

- The Mahad Satyagraha, also known as Chavdar Tale (Lake) Satyagraha, was led by B. R. Ambedkar on 20 March 1927 in Mahad, Raigad District of Maharashtra.
- Its aim was to assert the right of untouchables to use water_from a public tank.
- 1. Background:
- Untouchables (Dalits) were segregated in Indian society and banned from using public water bodies and roads used by other Hindu castes.
- In August 1923, the Bombay Legislative
 Council passed a resolution allowing depressed

classes to use government-maintained places, but it faced opposition from savarna Hindus.

- In January 1924, Mahad passed a resolution in its municipal council to enforce the act but failed to implement it due to protests.
- 2. Satyagraha:
- In 1927, Ambedkar launched a satyagraha to assert untouchables' rights to use water in public places.
- Mahad was chosen for the event due to its support from 'caste Hindus'.
- Surendranath Tipnis, president of the Mahad municipality, invited Ambedkar to hold a meeting there.
- Ambedkar **drank water from the tank**, followed by thousands of untouchables.
- He encouraged Dalit women to abandon customs of untouchability and wear saris like high-caste women, which they embraced.
- A riot erupted over rumors of Ambedkar planning to enter a Hindu temple, and the tank was purified with cow-urine and cowdung.
- Ambedkar planned a second conference in Mahad in December 1927 but faced legal obstacles due to a case filed by caste Hindus.
- On 25 December 1937, the Bombay High
 Court ruled that untouchables have the right
 to use water from the tank.
- 3. Legacy:
- On 19 March 1940, Ambedkar arranged a rally in Mahad to commemorate the Satyagraha as "Empowerment Day."

Why in the news?

RIA

India has handed over the first batch of BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles to the Philippines marking a significant step in bilateral defense cooperation.

India- Philippines Brahmos Deal

- In January 2022, the Philippines inked a \$375-million deal with India for three batteries of the shore-based, anti-ship variant of the BrahMos missile,
- This made it the first export customer for this joint venture between India and Russia.
- Several countries, including Indonesia and Thailand, have expressed interest in procuring BrahMos systems, and discussions are underway.

About BrahMos Missiles

Development:

- BrahMos is a joint venture between the DRDO and Russia's NPO Mashinostroyeniya.
- The name BrahMos comes from the two rivers, the Brahmaputra_of India and the Moskva_of Russia.
- The **first successful test in 2001** was conducted from a specially designed land-based launcher.

Capabilities:

- BrahMos is a medium-range ramjet supersonic cruise missile.
- Launched from: Submarine, ships, aircraft, or land.
- It is the fastest supersonic cruise missile in the world.
- It has two stages:
- 1. First stage comprising of a **solid fuel rocket booster** and
- 2. Second stage comprising a liquid-fueled ramjet.

Warhead:

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- Ship-launched and land-based missiles can carry a 200 kg warhead,
- Aircraft-launched variant (BrahMos A) can carry a 300 kg warhead.

Variants and Range

- The missile travels at speeds of Mach 2.8 to 3.0, which is being upgraded to Mach 5.0.
- A hypersonic version of the missile, BrahMos-II, is also presently under development with a speed of Mach 7-8 to boost aerial fast strike capability.
- Initially restricted by the Missile Technology Control Regime to a range of 290km, the BrahMos missile's range was extended to 450km following India's entry into the regime in June 2016.
- Ongoing efforts aim further to extend the missile's range beyond 600km, enhancing its operational reach and effectiveness in various scenarios.

Strategic Implications of the move

• This development comes amidst escalating tensions in the South China Sea between the

Philippines and China emphasizing the significance of enhancing defensive preparedness.

 The acquisition of BrahMos missiles under Horizon 2 of the Revised Armed Forces of the Philippines Modernization Programme will bolster the defensive capabilities of the Philippines armed forces.

In news: Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT)



- The Allahabad High Court *clarified the appellate jurisdiction* concerning orders issued by the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) in contempt proceedings.
- The court ruled that appeals against CAT contempt orders must be filed exclusively before the Supreme Court under Section 19 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971.

What is Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT)?

 The CAT is a specialized *quasi-judicial body* in India established under Article 323-A of the Constitution of India.

Why in the news?

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- Its primary function is to adjudicate disputes and complaints related to recruitment and service conditions of *government employees*.
- CAT was set up to provide a speedy and inexpensive remedy to government employees in matters concerning their service conditions and employment disputes.

Establishment of CAT:

- The Administrative Tribunals Act in 1985 enacted by the Parliament authorizes the central government to establish Central Administrative Tribunal and the State Administrative Tribunals.
- There are **17 Benches** and 21 Circuit Benches in the Central Administrative Tribunal all over India.

Jurisdiction of CAT:

- The Administrative Tribunal is distinguishable from the ordinary courts with regard to its part of it
- It exercises jurisdiction only about the service matters of the parties covered by the Act.
- CAT exercises jurisdiction over **all service matters** concerning the following:
- 1. A member of any All-India Service
- 2. A person appointed to any civil service of the Union or any civil post under the Union
- 3. A civilian appointed to any defence services or a post connected with defence

Services NOT Covered:

The following members are NOT covered under the jurisdiction of CAT:

- 1. Defence forces, Officers,
- 2. Staff of the Supreme Court and
- 3. Secretarial staff of the Parliament.

Procedure:

 The CAT is guided by the principles of natural justice in deciding cases and is NOT bound by the procedure, prescribed by the Civil Procedure Code.

- It is empowered to frame its own rules of procedure and practice.
- Under Section 17 of the Administrative Tribunal Act, 1985, the Tribunal has been conferred with the power to exercise the same jurisdiction and authority in respect of contempt of itself as a High Court.

Composition:

- The CAT comprises of a chairman, vicechairman and other members who are <u>appointed by the President of India</u>.
- The membership of CAT is filled by members from judicial and administrative fields.
- The term of the service is 5 years or until the age of 65 years for chairman and vice- chairmen; 62 years for members, whichever is earlier.
- The chairman, vice-chairman or any other member may address his *resignation to the President* in between his term of office.

Candidates have a Right to Privacy from Voters: SC

We are not inclined to accept blanket proposition that a candidate is required to lay his life out threadbare... His 'right to privacy' would still survive as regards matters which are of no concern to voter... **Non-disclosure of each and every asset... would not amount to a defect** much less...of substantial character **– SC bench**

Why in the news?

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- The Supreme Court affirmed a candidate's right to privacy from voters, stating that candidates need not divulge every aspect of their personal lives and possessions to the electorate.
- It held that Voters Right to Know about the electors is NOT ABSOLUTE.

Right to Privacy in India:

- The Right to Privacy under Article 21 of the Indian Constitution is interpreted as an intrinsic part of the fundamental right to life and personal liberty.
- Article 21 states that "<u>No person shall be</u> deprived of his life or personal liberty except according to procedure established by law."
- In the landmark judgment of Justice K.S. Puttaswamy (Retd.) v. Union of India (2017), the Supreme Court explicitly recognized the Right to Privacy as a fundamental right under Article 21.
- The court held that privacy is an essential aspect of personal liberty and dignity, encompassing informational privacy, decisional autonomy, bodily integrity, and spatial privacy.
- This right protects individuals against unwarranted intrusions into their private lives by the state or any other entity.
- It includes the right to keep personal information confidential, to make decisions about one's life and body without interference, and to maintain physical and spatial autonomy.

A candidate doesn't need to declare every item of movable property, such as clothing, shoes, crockery, stationery, and furniture, unless these items are of such value as to constitute a sizeable asset in itself or reflect upon the candidate's candidature in terms of their lifestyle – Supreme Court.

What are Corrupt Practices under the RPA?


- Section 123 of the Representation of People Act, 1951 defines "corrupt practices" to include bribery, undue influence, false information, and promotion of enmity among citizens based on religion, race, caste, etc.
- Section 123(2) deals with "undue influence," involving interference with electoral rights through threats or promises.
- Undue influence can manifest in various forms, including threats of physical harm, coercion, intimidation, promises of reward or benefit, or exploitation of vulnerabilities.

Supreme Court's Verdict

- 1. Emphasis on Candidate's Right to Privacy:
- Upholding the appeal, the Supreme Court emphasized the candidate's right to privacy, stating that not every non-disclosure automatically constitutes a defect.
 - The court highlighted that a candidate is not required to disclose every item of movable property unless it reflects upon their candidature or lifestyle.
 - 2. Case-specific Evaluation:
 - The court emphasized that each case must be judged on its own merits, without applying a blanket rule.
 - The Court emphasized that non-disclosure of certain personal possessions does not amount to a "defect of a substantial nature" under Section 36(4) of the 1951 Act.
 - 3. Example of "High-value" Assets:
 - Suppression of high-priced assets, indicating a lavish lifestyle, would constitute undue influence.
 - However, ownership of simple, low-value items may not be considered a defect.

Why in the news?

• Since 2020, the highly pathogenic H5N1 bird flu has been spreading globally, posing a significant threat to both birds and mammals.

H5N1 Bird Flu: Details

- H5N1 originated from a virus **outbreak on a goose farm in China in 1996** and has since evolved into a highly pathogenic strain.
- The virus quickly spread from Europe to Africa, Asia, North America, and South America, and most recently, it **reached mainland Antarctica**.
- H5N1 is a **subtype of the influenza A virus** that causes severe respiratory disease in birds, known as avian influenza or "bird flu".

- Influenza A viruses are classified by subtypes based on the properties of their surface proteins, with H5N1 being one subtype.
 How widespread is it?
 - The virus has affected birds in over 80 countries, resulting in mass culling of poultry and wild birds.
 - Furthermore, it has now begun infecting mammals, including seals, sea lions, and marine mammals.
 - While humans rarely contract bird flu, those at risk are typically individuals who have extensive contact with infected birds at poultry farms.
 - Bird flu **first broke out in Maharashtra** in 2006.
 - The H5N1 virus led to the culling of millions of poultry so as to contain the virus. But it has resurfaced from time to time.

Impact on Animals

- Bird Species Affected: Numerous bird species, including Great Skuas and Barnacle Geese, have experienced significant mortality rates due to H5N1.
- Endangered Species Threatened: Endangered birds like the California condors have been severely affected, with a notable percentage of the population succumbing to the virus.
- Mammalian Casualties: H5N1 has crossed species barriers, infecting mammals such as foxes, pumas, skunks, and marine mammals like sea lions and dolphins.
- Devastating Consequences: Mass mortalities of marine mammals, particularly elephant seals, have been reported, raising concerns about the long-term ecological impact.

Factors behind Spread

- Climate Change: Some scientists attribute the large-scale spread of bird flu to climate change, which alters bird behavior and facilitates the transmission of the virus.
- Warmer Seas: Warmer sea temperatures have weakened marine mammal populations, making them more susceptible to disease outbreaks.

What is NICES Program?

- The NICES Programme is operated by the ISRO and *the* Department of Space.
- It was launched in **2012**.
- It operates within the framework of the National Action Plan on Climate Change.
- NICES aims to enhance the participation of Indian researchers in addressing climate change-related challenges through multidisciplinary scientific investigations.
- Focus Areas: Potential areas for project submission include Space-based Essential Climate Variables (ECVs) and Climate Indicators, Climate Change Challenges, Weather Extremes, and Climate Services.

Activities held under NICES Program

- NICES invites project proposals from Indian scientists, academicians, and researchers affiliated with various governmental organizations, recognized institutions, universities, and departments.
- Project proposals should address climate change-related challenges.
- These projects are expected be **completed** within 3 years from the date of sanction.

Objective and Functionality

- The primary objective of the NICES Programme is to generate and disseminate longterm Essential Climate Variables (ECVs) derived from Indian and other Earth Observation (EO) satellites.
- These variables, spanning terrestrial, oceanic, and atmospheric domains, are crucial for characterizing Earth's climate and monitoring changes over time.

Achievements and Impact:



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- Since its inception in 2012, NICES has developed over 70 geophysical products meeting stringent quality standards.
- These products have been instrumental in documenting climate change and its impacts, contributing to scientific understanding and evidence-based decision-making.

125 years of Kodaikanal Solar Observatory



Why in the news?

This year marks 125th Year of the Kodaikanal Solar Observatory (KoSO).

About Kodaikanal Solar Observatory (KoSO)

- The idea for an Indian solar observatory emerged in the late 19th century, with then government sanctioning the establishment of the Solar Physics Observatory in Kodaikanal in August 1893.
- Kodaikanal in the **Palani hills of Tamil Nadu** was chosen as the site for the observatory due to its favorable atmospheric conditions, following surveys conducted by **Charles Michie Smith**.
- The foundation stone for KoSO was laid by Lord Wenlock, the then Governor of Madras, in 1895.
- Systematic observations at KoSO began on March 14, 1901.
- KoSO initially housed instruments for solar observations, including telescopes for examining sunspots, prominences, and solar radiations.
- Presently, KoSO houses advanced instruments like the H-alpha telescope and the White light Active Region Monitor (WARM) for highresolution solar imaging.

R S | | Historical Perspective

- Ancient Legacy: Throughout history, seafarers, mathematicians, astronomers, and physicists have meticulously studied the Sun and its celestial phenomena.
- British Era Initiatives: In 1792, the British East India Company established the pioneering Madras Observatory, marking a significant milestone in astronomical research in the region.
- Madras Observatory's Legacy: The Madras Observatory documented crucial astronomical observations during 1812-1825, laying the groundwork for solar research in India.
- Shift to Systematic Observations: Dedicated solar observations commenced in 1878, fostering a deeper understanding of solar phenomena.
- Advancements in Methodology: The adoption of systematic observational techniques paved the way for more comprehensive and detailed studies of the Sun's behavior.

Need for such Observatory

• Great Drought of 1875-1877: This event triggered by scanty rainfall, propelled the need

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for comprehensive solar studies to comprehend its implications on weather patterns.

- India's Geographical Significance: India's drought was part of a larger global phenomenon, affecting several countries and leading to widespread famine.
- Scientific Inquiry: Scientists recognized the potential role of solar variability in influencing climatic patterns, prompting inquiries into the Sun's behavior and its correlation with environmental phenomena.

Scientific Endeavors of KoSO

- The observatory made significant contributions to solar physics, including the discovery of the radial motion of sunspots, known as the **Evershed Effect**.
- Over time, KoSO expanded its research areas beyond solar physics to include cosmic rays, radio astronomy, ionospheric physics, and stellar physics.
- In April 1971, KoSO was brought under the Indian Institute of Astrophysics (IIA), Bengaluru, as part of the separation of astrophysics from the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

Repository of the KoSO

- Between 1904 and 2017, all solar observations were traced onto photographic films and plates
- A new telescope mounted with CCD cameras has taken over and, since 2017, continued to observe the Sun.
- Digitization of the records was initiated in 1984 by Prof J C Bhattacharyya, and others continued the effort.
- KoSO is now home to a digital repository of a whopping 1.48 lakh solar images adding up to 10 terabyte of data.
- These include 33,500 white-light images (showing sunspots), 45,000 images of the Ca II K spectral line (which reveals plages), and 70,000 H-alpha photographic plates that show prominences.

Nuclear Fusion: KSTAR reaches a temperature of 100 million Celsius




Why in the news?

- South Korean scientists at the Korea Institute of Fusion Energy (KFE) achieved a significant milestone by producing temperatures of 100 million Celsius for 48 seconds in the Korea Superconducting Tokamak Advanced Research (KSTAR) fusion reactor.
- KSTAR maintained the high confinement mode (H-mode) for over 100 seconds, demonstrating stability in plasma conditions crucial for sustained fusion reactions.
- This is a world record.

What is Nuclear Fusion?

How nuclear fusion works



- Nuclear fusion involves fusion of hydrogen and other light elements to release massive energy, akin to the process that powers the Sun and stars.
- It is a process where two light atomic nuclei combine to form a heavier nucleus, releasing a large amount of energy in the process.
- This occurs under **extremely high temperatures**, typically in the range of tens of millions of degrees Celsius, and pressure, similar to those found in the core of stars.
- In a tokamak reactor, hydrogen variants are heated to extreme temperatures to create a

plasma, mimicking conditions found in the Sun's core.

 1 kg of fusion fuel contains about 10 million times as much energy as a kg of coal, oil or gas.

Significance of KSTAR's achievements

- Achieving sustained fusion reactions in laboratory conditions unlocks the potential for unlimited, zero-carbon electricity generation.
- By extending the duration of high-temperature fusion, scientists aim to sustain plasma temperatures of 100 million degrees for 300 seconds by 2026, pushing the boundaries of fusion research.
- Progress in fusion research at KSTAR contributes to international efforts, supporting projects like the International Thermonuclear Experimental Reactor (ITER) in France.

Benefits offered by Nuclear Fusion Energy

- Clean Energy: Fusion reactions produce minimal radioactive waste compared to nuclear fission, which generates long-lived radioactive waste. Fusion also emits no greenhouse gases, making it an environmentally friendly energy source.
- Safety and Controlled Nature: Fusion reactions are inherently safer than nuclear fission reactions. Fusion reactors have a lower risk of accidents and do not produce runaway chain reactions like fission reactors.
- Energy Security: Fusion provides a reliable and secure source of energy, reducing dependence on fossil fuels and volatile energy markets. It offers a sustainable solution to meet global energy demand.
- High Energy Density: Fusion reactions release a vast amount of energy compared to other energy sources. This high energy density makes fusion power compact and efficient, enabling it to meet large-scale energy needs.
- Scalability: Fusion reactors can be designed to scale up or down to meet varying energy demands. They can serve as base-load power plants or complement renewable energy sources, providing flexibility in the energy mix.
- Minimal Environmental Impact: Fusion power plants have a small footprint and do not require large mining operations or fuel transportation,

reducing their environmental impact. They also produce no air pollution or carbon emissions during operation.



Why in the news?

A rare Total Solar Eclipse was visible across North America on April 8.

What are Eclipses?

RSITY

- Eclipses are astronomical events that occur when the sun, moon, and Earth align in specific ways.
- There are two primary types of eclipses: solar and lunar.
- 1. A <u>solar eclipse</u> happens when the moon comes between the sun and Earth during a new moon, blocking out the sun's light.
- Conversely, a <u>lunar eclipse</u> occurs when the Earth is positioned between the sun and the moon during a full moon, casting a shadow on the moon.

What is a Total Solar Eclipse?

- During a total solar eclipse, the moon passes between the sun and Earth, entirely covering the face of the sun along a small path of our planet's surface.
- This is called the "path of totality."
- The daytime sky turns dark, similar to dusk or dawn, and nocturnal animals have been known to wake up, confused into believing night has arrived.

Stages of a Total Solar Eclipse

A total solar eclipse unfolds in several distinct stages.

1. It starts with a **partial eclipse phase** as the moon begins to pass between Earth and the sun, partially blocking it and leaving the sun looking like it has a crescent shape.

- 2. In the subsequent **Baily's Beads phase**, points of light from the sun shine around the moon's edges because of the irregular lunar topography, producing small beads of light.
- 3. In the **diamond ring phase**, a single bright spot appears along the lunar edge even as the sun's atmosphere leaves a ring of light around the moon. This phenomenon precedes totality.
- 4. After **totality**, the other phases repeat as the moon keeps moving along its path until the eclipse ends.

Other types of solar eclipses:

- 1. Partial Solar Eclipse
- This happens when the sun, moon and Earth are not exactly lined up.
- The sun appears to have a dark shadow on only a small part of its surface.
- 2. Annular Solar Eclipse
- An annular eclipse happens when the moon is farthest from Earth. Because the moon is farther away from Earth, it seems smaller. It does not block the entire view of the sun. The moon in front of the sun looks like a dark disk on top of a larger sun-coloured disk. This creates what looks like a ring around the moon.
- During a solar eclipse, the moon casts two shadows on Earth. The first shadow is called the Umbra. This shadow gets smaller as it reaches Earth. It is the dark centre of the moon's shadow.
- The second shadow is called the Penumbra. The penumbra gets larger as it reaches Earth. People standing in the penumbra will see a partial eclipse. People standing in the umbra will see a total eclipse.

Why don't solar eclipses happen at every New Moon?

- The reason is that the Moon's orbit tilts 5° to Earth's orbit around the Sun.
- Astronomers call the two intersections of these paths nodes.
- Eclipses only occur when the Sun lies at one node and the Moon is at its New (for solar eclipses) or Full (for lunar eclipses) phase.
- During most (lunar) months, the Sun lies either above or below one of the nodes, and no eclipse happens.

POEM-3: ISRO's 'Zero Orbital Debris' Milestone

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Why in the news?

 The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has said its PSLV-C58/XPoSat mission has practically left zero debris in earth's orbit.

About PSLV Orbital Experimental Module-3 (POEM-3)

- Launched on January 1, 2024, POEM-3 utilized the spent PS4 stage of the PSLV-C58 vehicle, which initially launched XPoSat.
- It is a three-axis-altitude controlled platform with power generation and telecommand & telemetry capabilities, for supporting Payloads.
- The XPoSat mission aimed to leave no debris in space, demonstrating ISRO's commitment to responsible space practices.
- Upon deployment into its orbit at 650 km, POEM-3 was maneuvered to a 350 km circular orbit to minimize orbit decay time after the experiment's completion.
- After completing 400 orbits, POEM-3 re-entered Earth's atmosphere after 73 days in space.

Significance of this achievement

- With the rise in the number of satellites in orbit around the earth, space debris has become a pressing issue.
- Space debris in the low earth orbit (LEO) mainly comprises pieces of spacecraft, rockets, and defunct satellites, and the fragments of objects that have deteriorated explosively as a result of anti-satellite missile tests.
- This debris often flies around at high speeds of up to 27,000 kilometres per hour.
- Due to their sheer volume and momentum, they pose a risk to several space assets.

Threats posed by Space Debris

• Space debris also leads to two major risks:

- 1. It creates **unusable regions** of the orbit due to excessive debris, and
- 2. Leads to the '**Kessler syndrome'** creation of more debris due to cascading collisions resulting from one collision.



SPACE Testing & Evaluation hub for Sonar Systems



Why in the news?

A state-of-the-art SPACE testing and evaluation hub for sonar systems, designed for the Indian Navy, was inaugurated by DRDO.

About Submersible Platform for Acoustic Characterisation and Evaluation (SPACE)

- The SPACE is located at the **Underwater Acoustic Research Facility in Kulamavu**, Idukki, Kerala.
- It is developed by the *Naval Physical & Oceanographic Laboratory* of DRDO.
- It is set to become a premier testing and evaluation hub for sonar systems deployed on various Indian Navy platforms, including ships, submarines, and helicopters.

Key Features of SPACE:

- SPACE comprises two distinct components:
- 1. Floating Platform on the water surface and
- Submersible platform capable of descending to *depths of up to 100 meters* using winch systems.
- After completing operations, the submersible platform can be winched up and docked with the floating platform, ensuring efficient utilization of resources.

Functions and Capabilities:

- The primary function of SPACE is the *evaluation* of complete sonar systems, facilitating rapid deployment and retrieval of scientific packages such as sensors and transducers.
- It will serve for surveying, sampling, and data collection of *air*, *surface*, *mid-water*, *and reservoir floor* parameters utilizing modern scientific instrumentation.
- It will address the *data processing and sample analysis* requirements, ushering in a new era of Anti-Submarine Warfare research capabilities.

What is SONAR?

- SONAR stands for "Sound Navigation and Ranging."
- It's a technique used for detecting and locating objects underwater by transmitting sound waves and analyzing the echoes they produce.

Here's how it works:

- Sound Transmission: A SONAR system sends out pulses of sound waves, typically at frequencies beyond the range of human hearing. These sound waves travel through the water and propagate in all directions.
- Object Detection: When the sound waves encounter an object underwater, such as a submarine, seafloor, or marine life, they reflect off the object and return to the SONAR system as echoes.
- Echo Reception: The SONAR system receives the echoes of the transmitted sound waves and measures the time it takes for them to return. By knowing the speed of sound in water and the time it takes for the echoes to return, the system can calculate the distance to the object.
- 4. Data Analysis: The received echoes are processed and analyzed to create a visual representation of the underwater environment. This information helps operators identify and locate objects of interest, navigate safely, and map the seafloor.

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Vasuki Indicus: 50ft Snake Fossil Found in Gujarat



Why in the news?


A fossil unearthed in Gujarat's Kutch in 2005, initially presumed to belong to a giant crocodile, has been revealed as one of the largest snake 'Vasuki Indicus' ever to exist on Earth.

About Vasuki Indicus

 'Vasuki Indicus' is the name given by IIT Roorkee Scientists to the fossil specie.

(DEEMED TO BE UNIVERSITY)

 The name "Vasuki" derives from the mythological snake depicted often encircling the neck of the Hindu deity Shiva.



Physical characteristics of Vasuki

- It is estimated to measure between 11m (36ft) and 15m (49.22ft) in length,
- It belonged to the extinct Madtsoiidae snake family.
 - Its size could potentially surpass the extinct Titanoboa in size, with its closest relatives identified as Titanoboa and Python.
- The serpent's large size indicates it was a slowmoving, ambush predator, akin to an anaconda, as suggested by researchers.
 - Like contemporary pythons and anacondas, Vasuki Indicus presumably employed Constriction (suffocation) as its primary method of prey capture.

Age and Geological Context:

- Recovered from the Panandhro Lignite Mine in Kutch, the fossil dates back to the Middle Eocene period, approximately 47 million years ago.
- Analysis of the well-preserved vertebrae indicates the snake's existence during a warm geological interval with average temperatures estimated at 28°C.
- 'Vasuki' is believed to represent an extinct relic lineage originating in India, with subsequent India-Asia collision facilitating its dispersal from the subcontinent into North Africa through southern Eurasia.
 - Vasuki thrived during a time when the continents of Africa, India, and South America were amalgamated into a single landmass.

Significance for India

- This discovery underscores India's rich biodiversity.
- It holds immense potential in unraveling insights into the evolutionary process, continental shifts, and India's pivotal role in the origin of various species, particularly reptiles.

- It seeks to induct Akashteer Command and Control Systems
- By integrating radar and communication systems at all levels into a unified network, 'Akashteer' aims to deliver an unprecedented level of situational awareness and control.
- This will enable swift engagement of hostile targets, significantly reduce the risk of fratricide, and ensure the safety of friendly aircraft in contested airspace.

How it will help India's air defence system?

The 'Akashteer Command and Control Systems' will significantly enhance India's air defense capabilities in several ways:

1. Efficiency and Integration: Digitizing Air Defence Control and Reporting processes with 'Akashteer' will improve efficiency and integration. This enables the Indian Army to respond swiftly to hostile threats while reducing the risk of friendly fire incidents.

- 2. Situational Awareness: 'Akashteer' integrates radar and communication systems into a unified network, providing the Indian Army with better situational awareness. 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What is Exoatmospheric Interception?



Why in the news?

Israel successfully intercepted an Iranian missile outside Earth's atmosphere using an Exoatmospheric kill vehicle.

What are Exoatmospheric Missiles?

- Exoatmospheric missiles, or anti-ballistic missiles (ABMs), operate beyond Earth's atmosphere to intercept incoming ballistic missiles.
- They employ *advanced sensors and guidance systems* to detect, track, and destroy targets in space.
- *Kinetic kill vehicles*, like the Exoatmospheric Kill Vehicle (EKV), rely on high-speed collisions to neutralize threats.
- It travels at *hypersonic speed*.

Working Mechanism of Exoatmospheric Missiles:

- The EKV uses a **solid rocket booster** to propel itself into space.
- Advanced sensors and onboard computers identify and track incoming threats.
- **Precise maneuvering** allows the missile to navigate towards the target.

Impact from a **high-speed collision** eliminates the threat without traditional warheads, enhancing speed and accuracy.



Israel's multi-layered air defence system, including Iron Dome, The Arrow, and David's Sling, was activated in anticipation of the attack.

- IRON DOME: The short-range Iron Dome air defence system was built to intercept the kind of rockets fired by the Hamas in Gaza. Developed by state-owned Rafael Advanced Defense Systems with US backing, it became operational in 2011. Each truck-towed unit fires radar-guided missiles to blow up short-range threats like rockets, mortars and drones in midair.
- ARROW: The long-range Arrow-2 and Arrow-3 system, developed by Israel with an Iranian missile threat in mind, is designed to intercept ballistic missiles outside the earth's atmosphere, using a detachable warhead that collides with the target. It operates at an altitude that allows for the safe dispersal of any non-conventional warheads.
- 3. **DAVID'S SLING:** This mid-range system is designed to shoot down ballistic missiles fired from 100 km to 200 km away. Developed and manufactured jointly by Israel's state-owned Rafael Advanced Defense Systems and the U.S. Raytheon Co, David's Sling is also designed to intercept aircraft, drones and cruise missiles.
